



Texas sweeps Nebraska to repeat as champions

TAMPA, Fla. – Texas volleyball served up a second consecutive national championship to its fans.

Literally.

Powered by a pinpoint service game, Texas stunned top-ranked Nebraska in Amalie Arena while rolling to a second consecutive national title. The 25-22, 25-24, 25-11 sweep capped off an improbable repeat run for the Longhorns, who never topped the national poll this season and entered the NCAA Tournament as a No. 2 seed.

But Texas (28-4) played its best volleyball in December while knocking off top seeds Stanford, Wisconsin and, finally, Nebraska. That's become a habit for the Longhorns, who haven't dropped a set in either of its two wins in the past two national title games.

Texas was at its best at the service line. The Longhorns fired 12 aces, including five from middle blocker Asjia O'Neal, who capped arguably the best career of any Longhorn volleyball player with four kills and three blocks.

Junior outside hitter Madisen Skinner, a leading candidate for the national player of the year award, again aced the Texas offense with 16 kills, while setter

Ella Swindle had 21 assists while becoming just the third true freshman to lead her team to a Division I championship. Libero Emma Halter joined Skinner, O'Neal and Swindle on the all-tournament team after collecting nine digs.

Emotions ran hot all match in the meeting between two teams that have now each won five national titles, especially in a taut first set. After a questionable four-touch call on Texas negated a kill from Jenna Wenaas at the end of a marathon rally, Elliott didn't hide his frustration with the officials and drew a yellow card for a caution. Moments later, Elliott got even more steamed over an apparent substitution violation by Nebraska that didn't get called, which led to a red card and a point for Nebraska.

But with the set tied at 22-22 and the partisan Cornhusker crowd in full throat, Texas showed its championship poise by scoring three straight points, including an ace by Keonilei Akana that closed out the set.

The next two sets lacked such drama as the Longhorns cruised to the win over a shellshocked Nebraska (33-2) with the match breaking the NCAA attendance record for an indoor volleyball contest as 19,727 fans took in Sunday's final.

Madisen Skinner named top player in Final Four

TAMPA, Fla. – With a jaw-dropping blend of athleticism and efficiency, Texas outside hitter Madisen Skinner was a near-unanimous selection as the NCAA women's volleyball Final Four most outstanding player.

Not that she particularly cared for an individual award.

"It's for everybody," Skinner said, referring to the honor she received after helping Texas sweep Nebraska in the championship match Sunday. "I mean, it's cool and it's awesome, and I've worked really hard to get to this

"I love celebrating individual awards, but I want a national championship for my team. I want every single one of these girls to have a ring because they deserve it. And they put in so much work to get to this point. And for me, individual stuff means nothing if your team's not coming first and coming out on top. So I'm just super proud of this group and so excited that we all get to enjoy this and get a tro-

Skinner proved unstoppable in both of Texas' matches in Tampa. In Thursday's 3-1 win over Wisconsin in the semifinals, the junior fired 18 kills and

set a Final Four record for aces in a match with six. She followed that up with 16 kills on 33 swings and another two aces against overwhelmed Nebras-

The American Volleyball Caches Association already handed out its player of the year award to Wisconsin's Sarah Franklin, but the chatter among the media members after Sunday's finals hinted at Skinner winning any other such awards.

Skinner ended this season averaging 4.8 kills a set and led Texas in aces while earning the Big 12's player of the year award as well as a first-team All-American nod from the AVCA. She batted down any praise aimed at her on Sunday while complimenting teammates such as middle blockers Asjia O'Neal and Bella Bergmark and setter Ella

"Asjia does a great job of pulling the block on the slide - you have to respect the slide," Skinner said. "I'll say it again - and the same thing with Bella and our right side as well. They're just giving me a lot of space, and Ella has great vision."

Oh, and Skinner also gave a nod to mother Rebecca Skinner and father Brian Skinner, who played a dozen years in

"Yeah, thank you to my parents for great genetics and giving the hops and whatnot," she said, flashing a grin.

Tiger Woods' son Charlie is lighting up golf world at 14 years old

A little birdie told us that Charlie Woods is as exciting as his father was as a rising star.

This past weekend, the 14-year-old and his father, superstar golfer Tiger Woods, participated in the PNC Championship at the Ritz-Carlton Golf Club in Orlando, Florida, where Team Woods finished tied for fifth behind Team Langer, which won the tournament by two strokes.

On the ninth hole in the final round on Sunday, Charlie went viral for chipping in a birdie from the green. After the ball plunked into the hole, he pumped his fist, emulating his father's signature celebration. Tiger was thrilled and grinned with wide eyes as he joined the crowd in applauding the young golfer.

This isn't the first time Charlie has captured national attention.

Per Golf Digest, the teenager played soccer growing up and got serious about golf during the COVID-19 pandemic in



Last month, Charlie won the Florida High School Athletic Association Class A state championship with The Benjamin School Buccaneers. freshman, nick-The named "C-Dub," scored

78 and 76 as the program took home its fourth state championship trophy.

A high school state title gives Charlie one accolade that his father, a 15-time major champion, did not achieve in his illustrious career.

"Having a win over him and having something he doesn't, it feels pretty good," Charlie said at the PNC Championship, per The Palm Beach Post.

In September, Tiger caddied for Charlie en route to the Notah Begay III Junior Golf National Championship.

During the regional qualifying tournament, Charlie scored a career-best 66.

In true Woods fashion, he sunk an 8foot putt on the last hole to secure the boys 14-15 division and broke out his father's signature fist pump.

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Charlie finished tied for 17th in the Bernhard Langer, son Jason make championship tournament.

Tiger played with Charlie in the 2021 PNC Championship when his son was 12. It was Tiger's first tournament since a near-death experience when his SUV crashed and rolled off a hill in Los Angeles earlier that year. He was hospitalized for a month with several broken bones in his leg. Tiger mostly rode a cart for the competition but shared a special moment when he walked with his son up to the 18th hole green.

Team Woods had 11 birdies in a row in their last 12 holes that year, including at 17 where Charlie had a sailing drive. They ultimately lost to John Daly and his son by two strokes. The secondplace finish was their best at the competition since they started playing together in 2020.

Charlie Axel Woods was born on Feb. 8, 2009, to Tiger and his then-wife Elin Nordegren.

He is the couple's second and youngest child. He has an older sister, Sam, who caddied for Tiger earlier in the PNC Championship.

history with 2023 PNC win

For more than 20 years, Raymond Floyd was the only five-time winner of the annual PNC Championship. That all changed on Sunday.

Bernhard Langer and his son Jason ran away with the 2023 family hit-andgiggle after a white-hot day on the putting green. They made birdie on their first seven holes and shot an impressive 13-under 59 during Sunday's final round to take the trophy at 25 under.

Floyd and Langer are now the only five-time winners of the event. Larry Nelson has three wins and Davis Love III has two. Langer won with his son, Stefan, in 2005 and 2006 and won with Jason in 2014, 2019 and now 2023. He also previously played with his daughter, Christina, in 2013 and 2016.

David Duval and his son, Brady, finished second at 23 under, while defending champions Vijay and Qass Singh finished third at 22 under.
