



Why each horse can – or can't – win Preakness Stakes

For the first time in 75 years, only one horse from the Kentucky Derby will race in the Preakness Stakes.

Kentucky Derby winner Mage will look to keep his Triple Crown hopes alive as the 8-5 morning-line favorite in Saturday's \$1.65 million, Grade 1 Preakness at Pimlico Race Course in Baltimore.

The last time only one Kentucky Derby contender went on to the Preakness was 1948, when Citation beat three new shooters in the middle jewel on his way to winning the Triple Crown.

While there are only eight horses in this year's Preakness, Mage does face several worthy foes in First Mission, National Treasure and Blazing Sevens.

Here's a look at why each horse can and can't win the Preakness – many serious, a few tongue in cheek and one destined to be right.

1. National Treasure (4-1 odds)

Why he can win: He has added blinkers and should go straight to the lead from that inside post position. If no one else pushes him early, he's a threat to wire the field. Trainer Bob Baffert has a

record seven Preakness victories.

Why he can't: He's never been worse than fourth in five career races, but he also hasn't won since that maiden score in September. Can he take a step forward, or is this who he is?

2. Chase the Chaos (50-1)

Why he can win: What are the odds the other seven horses get stuck in the gate?

Why he can't: One career race on dirt – the Grade 2 San Felipe – and he finished seventh out of nine. His Beyer Speed Figures have dropped each of his last two races.

3. Mage (8-5)

Why he can win: His runner-up finish to Forte in the Florida Derby showed promise, and he took another step forward by winning the Kentucky Derby. "So far, so good" has been the mantra of the Delgados since that victory, and all signs point to another impressive performance in Baltimore.

Why he can't: We've seen it over and over: Horses run huge races in the Kentucky Derby and then bounce two weeks later at Pimlico. He's prone to bad breaks from the gate. Will it catch up to him here?

4. Coffeewithchris (20-1)

Why he can win: The Maryland bred is the only horse in the field with a victory at Pimlico, though it came via a disqualification in May 2022. He'll be at or near the lead early.

Why he can't: Fifth-place finishers in the Federico Tesio don't win the Preakness. National Treasure will wear him down early up front.

5. Red Route One (10-1)

Why he can win: Ran in six consecutive graded stakes before the Bath House Row victory, so he's plenty seasoned. If the front-runners tire, he's the most likely to be passing them late.

Why he can't: About those six consecutive graded stakes: He went 0-for-6 with a couple of runner-up showings. There are obvious pace-setters in the field, but it's not expected to be blazing enough to benefit him at the end.

6. Perform (15-1)

Why he can win: Federico Tesio winner was supplemented into the Preakness for \$150,000, so the connections must see something they like. Finished just 5½ lengths behind Mage in a maiden special weight in January at Gulf-

stream Park and could be improving.

Why he can't: Much like Red Route One, he's a closer who may not get the hot early pace he needs.

7. Blazing Sevens (6-1)

Why he can win: Trainer Chad Brown has won the Preakness twice with horses who skipped the Kentucky Derby – Cloud Computing (2017) and Early Voting (2022) – and could do it again with Blazing Sevens. Back-to-back bullet workouts at Belmont Park entering this.

Why he can't: One of the nation's top 2-year-olds, he's 0-for-2 this year and couldn't keep up with Tapit Trice or Verifying when finishing third in the Blue Grass. His best days may be behind him.

8. First Mission (5-2)

Why he can win: Has the perfect running style to get the jump on National Treasure coming for home. Trainer Brad Cox was beaming about this horse's potential after winning the Grade 3 Lexington.

Why he can't: With just three career races under his belt, it feels like he might need one more big one before knocking off the more experienced contenders in this field.

That's how many of the 156 competitors in the field this week also competed in the 2013 PGA Championship, the last time the major was played at Oak Hill. Jason Day, Dustin Johnson, Zach Johnson and Rory McIlroy all finished T-8 in 2013.

Keep an eye on ...

Scott Scheffler. The world No. 2 finished T-5 in his hometown event last weekend at the AT&T Byron Nelson, earning his 12th consecutive result of T-12 or better on Tour. Scheffler, who won The Players Championship by five strokes in March, has two top-10 finishes in three starts at the PGA Championship (T-4 in 2020, T-8 in 2021; missed cut in 2022).

Tee times

ESPN coverage on Thursday will feature fan favorites Max Homa, Tony Finau and Adam Scott (1:36 p.m. EDT). Another popular trio will consist of two-time PGA champion Phil Mickelson, world No. 4 Patrick Cantlay and a resurgent Rickie Fowler (1:58).

FedExCup

Scottie Scheffler (T-5 last weekend) made a dent into Jon Rahm's lead in the season-long points race. Jason Day vaulted to fifth after his win at the AT&T Byron Nelson, his first victory in more than five years. The FedExCup consists of 47 events and culminates Aug. 24-27 at the Tour Championship in Atlanta.

Spieth sings a happy tune about his wrist

PITTSFORD, N.Y. – "How are you feeling, Jordan?" a spectator shouted with genuine concern to Jordan Spieth from behind the rope lining the right side of the 13th fairway at Oak Hill on Tuesday as he sauntered to his ball.

"I feel good," Spieth said, imitating the deep baritone of James Brown.

But does Spieth, who withdrew from last week's AT&T Byron Nelson, his hometown event, citing a left wrist injury, really feel so good, as the soul singer Brown would say?

That we don't know because when a reporter asked to speak to him about his injury, he declined and said, "But thanks for your concern."

Spieth, ranked No. 10 in the world, is bidding to complete the career Grand Slam this weekend by winning the PGA Championship. It marks his seventh attempt since winning the 2017 British Open for his third major title.

After overcoming a slump during which he went nearly four years without a win until claiming the Valero Texas Open in 2021, Spieth has made impressive progress to return to a dependable representative for Team USA in international competition and a threat for more major glory. The 29-year-old Texan has five top-10 finishes this season, including a tie for fourth at the Masters, and was a lip-out away in a playoff with Matt Fitzpatrick from defending his title at the RBC Heritage in April and recording his 14th PGA Tour title.

On May 8, Spieth posted on social media that he was pulling out of the AT&T Byron Nelson noting "severe pain in my left wrist" and that it required "rest and limited movement."

On Tuesday afternoon, he wore white tape around his left wrist and black kinesiology tape on the back of his left arm that stretched to his elbow. He played nine holes alongside caddie Michael Greller, who flew in on Monday, and coach Cameron McCormick. Spieth neither winced, shook his arm as if suffering pain, nor shied away from hitting any shot. When he drove into the left rough, he hit an iron from Oak Hill's thick stuff.

He hit numerous pitch shots, bunker

shots and putts to a tee or makeshift plastic hole placed on various spots on the green where the actual hole locations could be this week. He ripped one drive at 14 and invested most of his time pitching to the elevated green. At the par-3 15, he planted an 8-iron 15 feet from the hole and his birdie putt circled the cup.

Spieth played nine holes, but to be sure of his status we will have to wait until he tees off Thursday with Viktor Hovland and Shane Lowry in his attempt to join just five golfers who have completed the career Grand Slam.

How will Spieth's injured wrist affect him? ESPN analyst and two-time major champion Andy North said playing in wet, long rough could be a problem for Spieth.

"If you put it in the rough enough times and have to chop it out, it's going

to definitely affect that," North said during a media conference call ahead of the 105th PGA Championship. "Is it a concern? Obviously. For him to skip (AT&T Byron Nelson), it's a very important tournament to him. But if it's a matter of hey, I just need three or four days off, give this thing a little rest, then he'll be fine. I hope that's the case and he's going to be able to come in there and be able to play well."

ESPN analyst and World Golf Hall of Fame member Curtis Strange added that skipping an event that is so meaningful to Spieth, who is an AT&T ambassador and got his start at the Dallas Tour stop as a 16-year-old amateur, "speaks a lot to that there's something wrong. He's doing what he has to do," Strange said. "I've never had a wrist injury. I can't imagine trying to play golf with a wrist injury."




