

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

# Richardson shines, Eagles WR scratches

The country's best track and field athletes convened at Hayward Field in Eugene, Oregon, for the USATF Championships. All the athletes were competing for a chance to advance to the world championships in Budapest, Hungary, on Aug. 19-27.

Eleven athletes earned a bye into the world championships because they are reigning champions, but the competition to earn a trip to Hungary was fierce throughout the four-day showcase Thursday to Sunday. There was a surprising champion in the men's 100 meters, Sydney McLaughlin-Levrone dazzled in a new event and Sha'Carri Richardson is running in top form.

USA TODAY Sports recaps the winners and losers:

### **WINNERS**

**Sha'Carri Richardson:** Sha'Carri Richardson went undefeated through the rounds in the women's 100, including running a personal-best 10.71 seconds to start the competition. In the 100 final, Richardson took off her wig as she was introduced. Then she proceeded to show why she's the fastest woman in the country this year.

After a subpar start, Richardson ran by all the runners and ran through the line at 10.82 to win.

Richardson will be vying for her firstever world title. She's currently ranked No. 2 in the world this year behind Jamaica's Shericka Jackson (10.65).

"As long as she continues on the path

that she's been on in 2023, I think she is one of the favorites for worlds," NBC Sports track and field analyst Ato Boldon said of Richardson to USA TODAY Sports.

Richardson also placed second in the 200.

Cravont Charleston: Cravont Charleston pulled off a huge upset to win his first-ever US title in the men's 100. The 25-year-old sprinter crossed the line with a time of 9.94 to narrowly defeat Christian Coleman, who posted a 9.95.

Charleston, Coleman and Noah Lyles will join Fred Kerley, who had a bye into the world championships, to form a formidable American 100-meter group headed Budapest.

**Sydney McLaughlin-Levrone:** New event, no problem for Sydney McLaugh-

lin-Levrone. The 400-meter hurdle Olympic champion, world champion and world record-holder ditched the hurdles and decided to run the 400 this year. Thus far it's been a seamless transition.

McLaughlin-Levrone dominated the 400 final. She led the entire race and crossed the line with a personal-best and world-leading time of 48.74, also a meet record.

Noah Lyles: American 200 recordholder Noah Lyles was rewarded a bye in his primary event because he's the reigning 200 world champion. In Budapest, Lyles has an opportunity to pull off the prestigious sprint double.

Lyles qualified in the men's 100 after finishing third with a time of 10.00.

"The male track and field star in this country is Noah Lyles," Boldon said. "He's a world champion and he's broken the American record (in the 200) on home soil. Noah has earned his place."

Vashti Cunningham: Vashti Cunningham won her sixth consecutive outdoor title in the women's high jump. She leaped 6 feet,  $3\frac{1}{4}$  inches to win the event.

Ryan Crouser: The men's shot put was a competition for second place because Ryan Crouser was competing with himself for gold. Crouser tossed 75 feet even to win the event. He won by nearly 2 ½ feet.

**Gabby Thomas:** Gabby Thomas made amends for placing eighth in the 200 at the 2022 national championships.

Running on the same track, Thomas blazed around the turn and accelerated down the home stretch to win the women's 200 by a wide margin. Thomas' winning time of 21.60 broke the meet record, and it's the top time in the world this year. It's also a personal-best for the Harvard product.

"It felt really good to reclaim my title. ... I was really ready this year. I was hungry and wanted it," Thomas, who won the 200 at the 2021 Olympic trials, said, per the CNBC broadcast.

Kenneth Rooks: Kenneth Rooks fell to the track during the final of the men's 3,000-meter steeplechase and dropped all the way to last place. But Rooks showed remarkable poise and perseverance as he got back into contention and eventually surged down the stretch to take first place in the distance race with a personal-best time of 8:16.78.

### LOSERS

Women's 800 meters: Athing Mu opted to run the 1,500 meters because she earned a bye into the world championships in the 800. Mu placed second in the 1,500 over the weekend to qualify in the event, but the Olympic champion plans to focus on the 800 in Budapest. That's bad news for all the other competitors

**Devon Allen:** The hurdler and Philadelphia Eagles wide receiver scratched from the semifinals in the 110-meter hurdles due to a calf injury. Devon Allen will now turn his focus to Eagles training camp in a few weeks.

Casual track and field fans: If fans didn't have CNBC or USATF.TV, they were unable to watch the USA Track and Field Championships. Day 1 of the four-day event was exclusively on USATF.TV.

# Byron nails rain gamble for fourth 2023 Cup win

Neither an early spin nor damage to his No. 24 Chevrolet could prevent William Byron from winning Sunday night's rain-shortened Quaker State 400 Available at Walmart at Atlanta Motor Speedway.

With a storm approaching the 1.54-mile track Sunday, Byron surged past AJ Allmendinger into the lead on lap 167 and remained out front until an accident in Turn 3 involving Ricky Stenhouse Jr., Ryan Preece and Bubba Wallace caused the seventh caution of the evening on lap 178.

With Byron out front, the NASCAR Cup Series cars circled the track until the rain arrived and began falling more heavily. NASCAR brought the cars to pit road and red-flagged the race at 9:47 p.m. after 185 laps were complete.

With severe weather moving into the area, the sanctioning body called the race and made Byron the first four-time winner in the series this season. The victory was Byron's second at Atlanta and the eighth of his career.

Daniel Suárez was second when NASCAR called the race, with Allmendinger running third. Michael McDowell and Kyle Busch completed the top five.

Crew chief Rudy Fugle called Byron to pit road on lap 125 under caution for a pileup in Turn 2 that damaged the cars of Erik Jones, Ross Chastain, Corey La-Joie, Tyler Reddick, Martin Truex Jr. and Ty Gibbs.

That enabled Byron to restart fourth on lap 165 after roughly half the field (cars that had not pitted since lap 95) came to pit road on lap 161. Two laps later, Byron had the lead. Byron hardly looked like a winner after spinning through the grass on lap 80 and losing a lap getting to pit road. But the 25-year-old from Charlotte, North Carolina, regained the lost circuit as the beneficiary under caution for Kyle Larson's spin on lap 92.

"It's cool, man," Byron said. "We went through so much throughout the night – through the infield, destroyed the bottom of the car dragging it around the apron trying to stay on the lead lap. At that point, you just don't have the grip, so I was real edgy back in traffic, but Rudy made a good call to pit there and then stay out."

The race was a boon not only for Byron, who leads the playoff standings, but for winless drivers around the playoff bubble. Suárez, Allmendinger and McDowell improved their chances with top-5 finishes. Those three drivers all gained ground on Chase Elliott, who is trying to qualify for the playoffs despite missing seven of the 19 races.

Elliott wasn't a factor, failing to earn any stage points and finishing 13th.

Despite his early struggles, Byron was pleased that handling played such an important part in the racing on the recently repaved racing surface.

"It was awesome – that's all you can ask for on a superspeedway," he said. "We want handling to matter. We want to be able to drive the things. I felt like the first stage was really fun. I was able to make some moves on the bottom.

"And you're lifting every corner, so it's different than a 550 (horsepower) old-style race. It's more packed up, but still handling matters, and guys can make aggressive moves. ... I'm thankful for the whole team and just staying in it, 'cause we were a lap down, and it could have been over."

### **USMNT** survives chaotic test

The U.S. men's soccer team reached the Gold Cup semifinals in wild fashion, defeating Canada on penalties in a game that started slow but descended into classic Concacaf chaos by the end.

The match would finish 2-2 after 120 minutes after the USMNT and Canada trade goals late in regulation and extra time Sunday in Cincinnati.

Matt Turner was the hero in the penalty shootout, saving Canada's first two penalties as the USMNT prevailed 3-2 on spot kicks to advance to Wednesday's semifinal (7:30 EDT, FS1) against Panama in San Diego.

The first half saw Canada successfully frustrate the favored Americans, who had the majority share of possession but managed one shot on target.

That was one more shot than Canada, however, as John Herdman's side had its best scoring chance come from a VAR (video assistant referee) review late in the half. Miles Robinson appeared to handle the ball in the box, but the referee did not award the penalty after spotting a shove from Canada's Moïse Bombito on Gianluca Busio prior to the handball.

The second half started out in much the same fashion before the USMNT started to turn the screws as the half wore on. Busio tested Dayne St. Clair from inside the box in the 68th minute but the Canada goalkeeper dove low to his right to stop the best U.S. chance of the night to that point.

The U.S. needed a spark, and the crowd at TQL Stadium made it clear who they wanted to provide it, chanting "We Want Vazquez" repeatedly for hometown striker Brandon Vazquez.

B.J. Callaghan obliged the home fans in the 73rd minute, and 15 minutes later he looked like a genius as it appeared the FC Cincinnati striker had

won the match with a header off a tremendous cross from DeJuan Jones.

But minutes later Robinson somewhat improbably was under review for a potential handball in the box for the second time. This time he wasn't so lucky.

Steven Vitória stepped up from the spot, and with Canada's first shot on target of the night, he buried his penalty down the middle for a 93rd-minute equalizer.

Vitória tied the score with Canada's first shot on goal, and Jacob Shaffelburg looked like he won it with their second. The Nashville SC winger scored on a fantastic individual effort in extra time, starting the play by forcing a turnover and then forcing a seeing-eye shot through Matt Miazga and into the net.

But there would be another twist in an increasingly wild game, as the USMNT found an equalizer five minutes later when Busio's shot was saved by St. Clair, but the rebound caromed off Scott Kennedy and in for an own goal.

That would send the game into spot kicks, where Turner started off with two saves before the U.S. clinched a spot in the final four when Charles-Andreas Brym's penalty crashed off the crossbar in the fifth round of spot kicks.

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
