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Kyle Larson wins at Indianapolis

Kyle Larson had dreams about celebrating at Indianapolis Motor Speedway in May.

Two months later, Larson kissed the bricks at Indy after winning NASCAR's Brickyard 400 on Sunday in double overtime under caution.

Larson bested Ryan Blaney on the second overtime restart and held off Tyler Reddick after taking the white flag before Cup Series officials threw a yellow flag for a Ryan Preece crash. Larson didn't have to battle Reddick to the checkered flag and could instead coast across the yard of bricks for his first win at the iconic speedway.

'This is just such a prestigious place and such hallowed ground," Larson said in a post-race interview with NBC Sports. "Pretty neat just to get an opportunity to race on the oval again. What a job by our team, who never gave up at all."

Two months ago, the 2021 NASCAR Cup Series champion strapped into an Indy car for the Indianapolis 500, seeking to become the first driver to win the motor sports double of the Indy 500 and NASCAR's Coca-Cola 600 on the same day. But a pit-road speeding penalty spoiled his Indy 500 bid as he finished 18th, and Mother Nature thwarted his plans at the Coca-Cola 600 when rain fell at both Indianapolis and Charlotte, North Carolina.

Everything went right for Larson in the final stage of Sunday's Brickyard 400, however, as his No. 5 Hendrick Motorsports team played the right fuel

strategy and gave him a car that could rocket through the field - even as some contenders crashed out of the race and others ran out of gas.

"What a job by our team; they never gave up at all," Larson said. "Today definitely felt meant to be for us. I just can't believe it. It's surreal to win here."

But even as Larson and Hendrick Motorsports digs in to celebrate this momentous win - his series' leading fourth of the season and the 27th of his Cup Series career - he's already thinking about next year and another attempt at the double.

"How about we come back next May and try and kiss these bricks in an Indy car," Larson shouted to the fans before detailing his plans, when asked if he was definitely running the double again. "I'd love to, I'd love to. We're working on it. So, I hope we can announce something soon and see you all next May.'

Herta, Kirkwood go 1-2 for Andretti in Toronto

Six consecutive times - dating to the start of the 2022 NTT IndyCar Series campaign - Colton Herta and the No. 26 Andretti Global program started on the pole and failed to win.

Those half-dozen races have ended a variety of ways, from a DNF (did not finish) at Long Beach to a runner-up finish at Toronto, with combinations of bad luck, strategy miscues and pit lane mistakes in between.

Sunday, the 24-year-old driver ensured there wouldn't be a seventh.

After leading nearly all 85 laps during IndyCar's annual stop on the streets of Toronto, Herta and company executed two almost flawless pit stops, hit on the proper strategy and held off a teammate and a six-time series champ during a late-race caution and an even later red flag to capture his first win in 41 starts.

"We've been knocking on the door for a win for so long. 41 starts without a win is a long time. Michael (Andretti) is an owner that demands perfection and results, and we're people who work for the team that demand it, too, and I'm so happy," Herta said. "I wish we didn't have this long of a break. I want to go get right back in for another one."

With fewer than 15 laps to go, Pato O'Ward, sitting sixth, lost the rear of his No. 5 Chevy coming through the turn 1 right-hander and slid into the outside wall. A few spots back, Andretti Global's Marcus Ericsson couldn't avoid O'Ward's car in the braking zone and skidded into the side of O'Ward.

From there, O'Ward's car would essentially turn into a ramp, as Pietro Fit-

tipaldi and Santino Ferrucci ran over the nose of the No. 5 and went airborne.

The red flag lasted just under 20 minutes, with 13 cars left on the lead lap and 16 running when the cars fired back up and peeled off pit lane, followed shortly by a race restart with nine laps to go.

The 16 cars still running took the green flag with nine laps to go, and before they could turn a single lap, Will Power lunged on his Team Penske teammate Scott McLaughlin, both of them solidly in the hunt for the championship entering Sunday, to try and snag fourth place away for the closing stretch.

As chaos happened behind them, teammates Herta and second-place Kyle Kirkwood didn't put a wheel wrong all day, with Kirkwood admitting postrace that he was extra cautious on the early- and late-race restarts to give his Andretti Global teammate out front an extra cushion to ensure they both could make it through the packed-up moments unscathed and live to fight it out on the track.

Nick Dunlap, just 20, wins second title on PGA Tour

Nick Dunlap has won again on the PGA Tour, but this time he gets to cash the winner's check.

Dunlap scored 19 points in Sunday's final round of the Barracuda Championship, the fifth and final opposite-field event on the PGA Tour's 2024 schedule and also the lone event that uses the Modified Stableford scoring system.

Dunlap vaulted up the leaderboard to finish with 49 points. He then had to play the waiting game to see if thirdround leader Mac Meissner or anyone else could catch up. But no one could and Dunlap, who doesn't turn 21 until Dec. 23, collected a second piece of hardware this year.

Dunlap won the American Express in January to become the first amateur since Phil Mickelson in 1991 to win on the PGA Tour Dunlap's amateur status, though, kept him from collecting the top prize of \$1.512 million. He turned pro shortly after that and now has a second tour win on his resume.

He's the first golfer in PGA Tour history win as both an amateur and a pro in the same season.

His win this time around is good for \$720,000.

Maybe more important, Dunlap, who was No. 95 on the FedExCup points list heading into the Barracuda, has shot up to 63rd. If it holds, it would put him into the FedExCup Playoffs in his rookie season. The top 70 make the field at the FedEx St. Jude Championship.

Chanettee Wannasaen prevails at Dana Open for 2nd LPGA win

Chanettee Wannasaen's second LPGA victory felt miles different from her first, when she became the third Monday qualifier in tour history to win at last year's Portland Classic.

This time the 20-year-old came into the final round of the Dana Open with some history as she held the 54-hole lead for the first time in her pro career.

The Thai player was up by as many as five strokes midway through the round Sunday but watched that advantage dwindle to one as last year's Louise

Suggs Rookie of the Year, Haeran Ryu, shot up the board.

Xiyu "Janet" Lin was the only top-20 player in the world in Sylvania, Ohio, for the 40th anniversary of the Dana Open. Lin, who is still looking for her first LPGA title, tied for fifth.

"Right now, I feel like I can't explain anything," Wannasaen told Golf Channel's Amy Rogers when it was over. "I just feel so proud of myself."

Wannasaen held on to win by one stroke with birdies on the last two holes, draining an 18-footer to clinch the title at 20 under. She becomes the third Thai player to win this season, joining Patty

When the final group made its way to the 18th tee, a total of four groups were on the final hole at Highland Meadows. Wannasaen and Rvu took a rest on a nearby bench as players ahead attacked the closing par 5. They waited 24 minutes before teeing off.

Wannasaen's last tee shot found the bunker, and though she led by one stroke, she still pulled out a fairway metal from 217 yards and opted for the aggressive play. She got away with the questionable approach, avoiding any real danger with her second shot and getting up and down from short left of the green to squeak out the win.

In the aftermath, Wannasaen was already looking ahead.

"Right now, I'm feel like I'm going looking for third trophy," she said. "Yeah, I think it's coming."

It's worth noting that the tour returns to Portland, Oregon, in two weeks.

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Biles will compete in all four team events

PARIS - Simone Biles doesn't want a break, not when there's a Olympic gold medal to win.

Biles will do all four events in the women's gymnastics team finals Tuesday at the Paris Olympics, passing on the chance to get a little bit of rest in a competition that is both lengthy and stressful. This despite tweaking her left calf during qualifying Sunday.

Biles will anchor the U.S. women's gymnastics team on vault, balance beam and floor exercise and go secondto-last on uneven bars. Jordan Chiles, who got aced out of the all-around final because of the silly two-per-country rule, also will do four events. She'll lead off on vault, bars and balance beam and will go second on floor exercise.

Suni Lee, the reigning Olympic champion, will anchor the Americans on bars, her signature event, and also do balance beam and floor exercise. Jade Carey will do vault. Hezly Rivera, the

only newcomer on the team, will sit out event finals.

Biles was visibly limping between events Sunday after a flare-up of a calf injury. But she posted a photo that appeared to be from practice Monday, and her mother Nellie said on NBC's "Today" show that she was doing fine.

Chellsie Memmel, the technical lead

for the U.S. women's team, said last week it would be up to Biles to decide how many events in team finals she wanted to do. USA Gymnastics is trying to be conscious of both her schedule she has qualified for four individual finals, including the all-around – and not wanting her to feel as if she has to carry the team.

Biles said last year that someone with USA Gymnastics told her in Tokyo she was the team's "gold medal token," which contributed to her anxiety. Biles wound up withdrawing after one event in the team final with a case of "the twisties," which caused her to lose her sense of where she was in the air.

"I don't say that to her. Or, 'You are keeping us all together and we rely on you and you alone,' " Memmel said, emphatically. "If (not doing all four) is what she needs to continue to be at her best for the team and for herself, that's what we're going to do, because there are still four other members on our team."

But Biles is looking for redemption in Paris, so much so she powered through

qualifying after tweaking her calf in warmups on floor exercise. Biles briefly left the floor and then had her ankle heavily taped, but she delivered a monster score on floor, did her signature Yurchenko double pike and then finished with a solid uneven bars routine.

The Americans finished with 172.296 points, more than five points ahead of Italy. Though scores start over in team finals, the Americans will begin on vault Tuesday, which should give them a big cushion.

Biles will be doing either the most difficult vault in the world if she does her Yurchenko double pike or the second-hardest vault being done now if she does the Cheng. Carey and Chiles were third and fourth on vault in qualifying, behind reigning Olympic and world champion Rebeca Andrade.

Should the Americans win the team gold, it would be their fourth at the Olympics and third since 2012. It also would give Biles eight Olympic medals, breaking her tie with Shannon Miller for most by a U.S. gymnast.

Brazil's Andrade among gymnasts to watch this week

PARIS - The U.S. women's gymnastics team used to joke about a non-Simone Biles division, an acknowledgment that she is so much better than everyone else that no one could beat her.

The same still applies – and then some

Biles had the top score in Olympics qualifying, her 59.566 almost two points ahead of Brazil's Rebeca Andrade, who was runner-up to Biles at the 2023 world championships. This despite a flare-up of a calf injury that had Biles limping visibly between events. So as long as Biles is healthy and in a good place mentally, a second Olympic allaround title is hers Thursday night.

It would make her only the third woman, and first since 1968, to win gymnastics' most prestigious prize twice. Biles also would be the oldest woman to win Olympic gold since 30year-old Maria Gorokhovskaya in 1952.

"The fact her gymnastics just keeping better the older she gets, it's a testament to her drive of wanting to be the best," said Alicia Sacramone Quinn, a silver medalist at the 2008 Olympics who is now the strategic lead for the women's program.

"I'm so impressed by her," added Sacramone Quinn, whose 10 medals at the world championships and Olympics made her the most-decorated U.S. gymnast until Biles came along. "Every time she goes, I just joke, 'Stop being so good at gymnastics! Let everybody else catch up.' She's like, 'Yeah. OK.' "

Rebeca Andrade, Brazil

Rebeca Andrade finished second to Biles after qualifying, albeit almost two points behind.

Andrade has been the best gymnast not named Simone Biles since the Tokyo Olympics. She won the all-around title at the 2022 world championships, when Biles was taking a break from gymnastics. She was the silver medalist in 2023 after Biles returned and beat Biles for the world vault title.

She was second to Suni Lee at the Tokyo Olympics and also won the vault title. She has nine medals overall at the world championships, winning five last year. That included a historic silver medal in the team competition, the best finish ever by Brazil's men or women at either a worlds or Olympics.

Andrade was the first Brazilian woman to win an Olympic medal in gymnastics and Olympic gold. Making her recent success all the more remarkable is that it's come after three ACL tears.

Suni Lee, United States

Suni Lee finished third after qualifying. Lee is the reigning Olympic champion, her gold in Tokyo extending a stretch of dominance by the U.S. women that began in 2004. Lee has a full set of medals from Tokyo, winning a silver in the team competition and a bronze on uneven bars.

Lee went to Auburn after Tokyo and

But Lee returned to competition in February and has been making steady progress since, finishing second to Biles at the Olympic trials in July.

Kaylia Nemour, Algeria

Kaylia Nemour finished fifth after qualifying. Though Nemour is best known for her ridiculous difficulty on uneven bars, where she's the reigning world silver medalist, she's also very good in the all-around. She is the reigning African champion and was eighth at 2023 worlds.

Manila Esposito, Italy

Manila Esposito finished sixth after qualifying. Esposito is the reigning European champion, edging teammate Alice D'Amato at the meet earlier this spring. She also won golds on balance beam and floor exercise. Esposito was ninth at the 2023 world championships.

Alice D'Amato, Italy

Alice D'Amato finished seventh after qualifying. She was runner-up to teammate Manila Esposito at Euros this spring and fifth at the world championships in 2023.

Qiu Qiyuan, China

Qiu Qiyuan was eighth after qualifying. Qiu was fourth in the all-around at the 2023 world championships, her first at the senior level. She also won gold on uneven bars. Qiu was a three-time gold medalist at the 2023 Asian Games, winning in the team competition, allaround and uneven bars.


