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Big Ten simply got played by Trump

Whether the Big Ten made the right call by deciding to play football this fall, this much is certain: It got played by President Donald Trump.

From the moment Big Ten Commissioner Kevin Warren and Trump spoke by phone Sept. 1, any outcome that ended with the league reversing its decision to postpone football was going to result in Trump declaring that he made it happen to boost his favorability in Pennsylvania, Ohio, Michigan, Wisconsin and Minnesota in the midst of a campaign where he is behind in the polls.

"That call was probably the most pivotal call in Big Ten football this year," a senior White House official told reporters on a conference call Wednesday. (Yes, this official, as well as two others on the call, requested anonymity even though this isn't a topic that would necessitate anonymity, but here we are.)

The problem is, Trump taking credit for the Big Ten returning doesn't exactly comport with the facts.

Though Warren and Trump absolutely spoke, and Trump certainly expressed his desire for the Big Ten to play football this fall during that conversation, there's no evidence that the White House took any other tangible action to make the season happen.

Understanding the potential pitfalls

in getting too deeply involved with a White House that was eager to provide COVID-19 testing resources for football teams while other more essential industries go without, the Big Ten never went any further than Warren's call on trying to get hooked up by the government.

In fact, one person with knowledge of the discussions, who spoke to USA TO-DAY Sports on the condition of anonymity because of the sensitive nature of the situation, said the league never requested or accepted resources from the White House. Instead, league officials directed credit toward its medical advisory board for putting together a plan that the Big Ten presidents were comfortable with and were able to secure enough daily antigen tests by other means.

But do you think some silly things like facts are going to stop election-year politics from happening at the Big Ten's expense? Of course not. The White House on Wednesday touted Trump's interest in whether college football would happen going all the way back to early August when it became clear some leagues might sit out. He latched onto the #LetUsPlay hashtag and spoke on the phone with Clemson quarterback Trevor Lawrence and LSU coach Ed Orgeron, among others.

Once Trump reached out for the call with Warren, the Big Ten should have known what was up. Immediately after the phone call, Warren should have released a statement thanking the White House for the interest but explaining very clearly that it wouldn't be consistent with the mission of the league to allow the president to use his influence or resources to prioritize football over other pressing campus issues.

Now, whether they like it or not, Trump is going to take a political victory lap at their expense. It's going to be part of his stump speech. It's almost certainly going to come up this month at the presidential debates. When Big Ten football happens every Saturday, you can be sure the Twitter account of the commander-in-chief is going to be a font of self-congratulations.

Still, even the unnamed senior White House officials struggled Wednesday when pressed on what actions Trump actually took to make Big Ten football happen beyond a phone call with Warren. They didn't answer whether resources had been deployed to the Big Ten (because they hadn't) and instead cited "over 300 calls between the White House, players, parents, coaches, athletic directors and Big Ten officials lending resources, time, information and doing everything we possibly can to give the Big Ten a path forward."

The problem is, it's not like Trump wanting Big Ten football to happen was particularly unique. Lots of people wanted it to happen, from fans to players to parents to administrators. The question was whether it could be done in a way to mitigate the risks enough in the minds of the school presidents who actually made the decision and how they were going to get there.

It would be easy to give Trump credit for that if there were tangible steps taken by the administration to do that. Instead, they would have us believe that this all happened because of a call.

"I would say it was one pretty important phone call," an administration official said.

The Big Ten, which did not know the White House was organizing a call with reporters Wednesday to claim credit, isn't going to spend much energy on this. Why pick a fight at this point?

But as they came around to the view that they could play football starting in October, Big Ten presidents walked right into the trap of looking like props for the president. Even if they never wanted this to be political, they were either too naïve or incompetent to sniff out how it would play the moment Trump got involved.

Make no mistake, the Big Ten never took any resources from the White House. But that won't stop Trump from claiming a win.

Though season shortened, 'It feels like 162'

Through it all – disease and disaster, injuries and insolence – MLB is on the doorstep of completing its 60-game season. Just 13 days remain in this sprint through a pandemic, and while not everyone will hit the desired 60game mark, it's nearly safe to say they pulled it off.

Just know that it was a bit more taxing than it may appear.

The mere act of getting this campaign off the ground – from the long wait, to a second training camp, to the wholesale disruption to routine – has made this appetizer of a season feel like more than a full meal.

"It feels like 162 right now," says Braves manager Brian Snitker, whose club has been among baseball's most fortunate - no coronavirus-related postponements, just three traditional rainouts. "Actually, it doesn't feel like a shortened season, for the mental grind everyone has had to go through and change. Being on lockdown for those 30 days on the road – it's hard to get out, there's nothing going on, the time at the ballpark is (limited). It's been a grind. It doesn't feel like we just started in July." Certainly, the physical and mental capital poured into the season began much earlier than the July 3 report date for "summer camp." A month of spring training gave way to the mid-March industry shutdown, followed by varying modes of quarantine and trying to train

within those parameters. Then came summer camp, which brought dozens of positive COVID-19 test results upon intake, and then, finally, a season.

At this point, all teams have played between 43 and 49 games, but the numbers belie the tumult. While the Marlins and Cardinals had the largest in-season coronavirus outbreaks and thus the most related postponements – eight and 15 games, respectively – the virus' tentacles run deep.

Twenty-one of the 30 teams have had at least one game postponed due to COVID-19 concerns, and all 30 have had postponements, be it related to the pandemic, the weather or to protest the shooting of Jacob Blake by Kenosha (Wisconsin) police.

So an abbreviated season automatically gets longer.

Standing still for a week – or worse yet, quarantining in a hotel far from home - is an undeniable reminder of this season's rules of engagement. Yet even on game days, the signs are constant. In better times, many players, managers and coaches are practically clubhouse rats, eating most of their meals there and preparing to play in their designated sanctum. Now, there are no noon arrivals for 7 p.m. games. No lingering after. 'You have to remember protocols and look to see if you're spitting in a tube that day," says Brewers starter Brett Anderson, referring to the oral COVID-19 tests, "and just not being able to get away from some of the baseball stuff on

the road. You just want to go out walking or shopping, and it's kinda taxing."

The positive part of that is we're more prepared, physically, for what's hopefully a long stretch run in the playoffs."

Therein lies the upside of the shortbut-long season – the tangible reward does, in fact, arrive sooner.

The Twins have had no COVID-19 related postponements. Yet it saw how fragile the operation is firsthand when they were the last team to play the Cardinals before St. Louis was shut down by the first of what became a rash of positive COVID-19 tests.

So on July 30, before continuing a series with the Indians, staff and players alike streamed in and out of Target Field for rapid, point-of-care testing. All were negative, and the Twins played that night, and they've stayed physically healthy ever since.
