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

Brian Harman returns as Open champ

TROON, Scotland - His wife's "Brian the Butcher" party, drinking fine wine and "unusually exceptional" bourbon out of the Claret Jug at Augusta National with Kevin Kisner and bringing the famed silver trophy on the field during halftime of a University of Georgia game are behind Brian Harman, and on Monday he had to return custody of the Claret Jug to R&A CEO Martin Slumbers.

"It's been a great year," he said during his pre-championship press conference on Monday, joking that he practiced getting out of his car one time for the ceremonial trophy return captured for posterity on video. "Yeah, a little sad to give it back, but I'll remember everywhere it's been forever. ... In my opinion, it's the coolest trophy in all of sports. So I think it's deserving of all of the pageantry that is involved with it.'

Harman won the title on the back of a blistering first 36 holes at Royal Liver-

pool in England, building a five-stroke edge and coasting to victory. He did so despite playing in a hostile environment that was rooting quite vociferously either for the home favorite, England's Tom-

my Fleetwood, or the ever-popular Rory McIlroy.

"You know, I'd be lying if I didn't hear some things that weren't super nice today toward me," Harman said at the time, adding, "If they wanted me to not play well they should have been really nice to me."

Harman played it smart on Monday, saying there are no hard feelings and he praised the British Open fans.

"It doesn't bother me. I'm ready to take whatever in stride. I'm here to play the best golf that I possibly can. That's my main focus," he said. "I've always loved the fans over here. I've spoken a bunch of times about how I find them the most knowledgeable fans of any that we play in front of. I kind of chalk last year up as more of an anomaly than anything else."

Winning the Claret Jug remains the crowning achievement of the threetime PGA Tour-winning 37-year-old left-hander's career. The magnitude of what his victory meant sunk in one winter day at his farm in Georgia while he was riding on his four-wheeler.

"I just kind of like had a moment where it's just me. It's cold, and it was just like I was so happy that I was there,' he said. "It's like, this is just really nice. It's nice to be the Open champion and still be doing the same thing that I would have been doing otherwise.'

Harman is winless since becoming the Champion Golfer of the Year. He has made 16 cuts in 18 starts this year, with a season-best T-2 at The Players Championship. But he missed the cut at the Masters after opening with 81 and has just one top-10 since April, a T-9 at the Travelers Championship last month.

"My stats this year have been really

good. My ball striking has been as good as it's ever been," he said when asked to rate his current form. "The only thing I haven't done well this year is I haven't putted especially well. So I'm just kind of waiting for it all to line up correctly."

Harman, who enters the week at No. 13 in the Official World Golf Ranking, will attempt to become the first to successfully defend his Open title since Padraig Harrington turned the trick in 2007-08. The pressure to defend is there but Harman said there are benefits to knowing he's been there, done that and it could come in handy next time he gets in the trophy hunt for another major title.

"I think it would probably add a little bit of pressure, but I don't think you ever really know what you're capable of until something like that happens," Harman said. "At least now I know that if things go my way, I'm well prepared. I'm a tough guy to beat, and if I just prepare the proper way, then take care of what I can do, then I'll give myself the best opportunity to have another chance."

Harry Hall gets first PGA win in playoff

Talk about a clutch moment worth the wait.

Harry Hall picked up his first PGA Tour victory Sunday night when he chipped in for birdie on the third playoff hole to win the 2024 ISCO Championship in Nicholasville, Kentucky. Hall's chip-in came on the par-3 ninth hole after he, Matt NeSmith and Pierceson Coody made par on the par-4 18th hole

Even better for Hall, he's set to be-

Initially, it was a five-man playoff with Rico Hoey and Zac Blair involved, but the duo bogeyed the first playoff hole, knocking them out.

The fivesome all finished at 22 under par for the week, but it's Hall walking away with the trophy.

Hall will not get into this week's British Open Championship field since there weren't any spots available, but he did win \$720,000, earned 300 FedExCup points and moved to 100th in the Official World Golf Ranking with the achievement.

Tiger Woods preps for Open with solo 18 holes

TROON, Scotland - Tiger Woods returned to Royal Troon for the first time since 2004 on Sunday. He was hurt in 2016, and while as a past champion he likely would still be eligible, it seems unlikely that in another 8 to 12 years when the championship returns to the southeast coast of the home of golf Woods will still be competing. With that in mind, both fans and employees darted out of The Shop, saving the purchase of overpriced caps and hoodies for later to witness Woods play the 16th hole at the site of the 152nd British Open Championship.

Woods played all 18 holes and treated a few hundred fans who traipsed after him to some impressive shots, including at the Postage Stamp, where he stuck his tee shot twice. Woods, a three-time winner of the Claret Jug, finished T-24 here in 1997 and T-9 in 2004. He hasn't been called Champion Golfer of the Year since 2006.

Woods was chomping on gum as he played solo, and it clearly was intentional as Jason Day and Tony Finau played in a group in front of him. Tiger took his time and did his homework. There was lots of short-game shots, an iron game that looked sharp, and he tended to hit just one tee shot if he liked it. He did choose to smack three drives on 16, including switching to what looked to be a 3-wood for the last of the trio. Funny to see Tiger kick his

ball out of the rough to play his second shot there. (One of us!)

Woods followed one of his traditional practice regimens, having caddie Lance Bennett stick tees at potential hole placements and practice from 25-30 feet and rarely putting to the actual hole though he didn't hesitate to drain a walk-off birdie at 18 and then toss a pair of golf balls to kids lining the 18th green.

Woods is scheduled to speak on Tuesday. After finishing last among those to make the cut at the Masters, and missing the cut at both the PGA Championship and U.S. Open, this week presents his last chance to chase a 16th major championship and what he's already said will all but surely be his final start this season.

Ryan Blaney wins at Pocono for his second victory in 2024

Ryan Blaney already had happy memories of Pocono Raceway. On Sunday, the Team Penske driver added another big moment.

Blaney held off seven-time Pocono winner Denny Hamlin in The Great American Getaway 400 to win for the second time this season and the 12th time in his NASCAR Cup Series career.

Blaney's first career Cup win came at Pocono in 2017 when he was 23 years old. Now, at age 30, Blaney is a veteran NASCAR racer and the reigning series champion.

"So cool to win here again," Blaney said in his post-race interview with NBC. "I won here seven years ago for my first Cup win, so it's awesome to be back. The crowd, you guys were amazing.

Thank you for being here all weekend." "You love tracks that have special meaning to you, places where you get your first win and things like that," Blaney continued, "so this place means so much to me."

Blaney took control of the 160-lap race on a restart with 40 laps remaining and kept the lead despite multiple restarts. The No. 12 Team Penske crew gave Blaney great track position to start Stage 3, choosing to call him to pit road a few laps before the end of the second segment and forgo stage points. That strategy move allowed Blaney to begin the third stage on the front row alongside Chris Buescher and to take control of the race.

"It was nice to stick to the plan today, and our plan was to have track position at the end," Blaney said. "I knew our car was fast enough."

For the first four months of the season, Blaney could not find victory lane -"I feel like we honestly had a couple races slip away from us which I thought we had a good shot at winning," he said Sunday - but his luck began to turn last month at Iowa Speedway, with a dominating victory on June 16. And the defending champ said, "Things are just kind of falling into place for us.

"I definitely feel like we're in a better spot at this time this year than we were last year," he said, "I feel like our speed is better. Our execution is great. We are doing everything as the 12 group the best that we can.

The 12 team's best resulted in a championship last season, and with just five races to go before the 2024 playoffs begin, Blaney is in prime position to defend his title.

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Kyle Larson wins at Indianapolis

Two months later, Larson kissed the bricks at Indy after winning NASCAR's Brickyard 400 on Sunday in double overtime under caution.

Larson bested Ryan Blaney on the second overtime restart and held off Tyler Reddick after taking the white flag before Cup Series officials threw a yellow flag for a Ryan Preece crash. Larson didn't have to battle Reddick to the checkered flag and could instead coast across the yard of bricks for his first win at the iconic speedway.

This is just such a prestigious place and such hallowed ground," Larson said in a post-race interview with NBC Sports. "Pretty neat just to get an opportunity to race on the oval again. What a job by our team, who never gave up at

Two months ago, the 2021 NASCAR Cup Series champion strapped into an Indy car for the Indianapolis 500, seeking to become the first driver to win the motor sports double of the Indy 500 and NASCAR's Coca-Cola 600 on the same day. But a pit-road speeding penalty spoiled his Indy 500 bid as he finished 18th, and Mother Nature thwarted his plans at the Coca-Cola 600 when rain fell at both Indianapolis and Charlotte, North Carolina.

Everything went right for Larson in the final stage of Sunday's Brickyard 400, however, as his No. 5 Hendrick Motorsports team played the right fuel

strategy and gave him a car that could rocket through the field - even as some contenders crashed out of the race and others ran out of gas.

"What a job by our team; they never gave up at all," Larson said. "Today definitely felt meant to be for us. I just can't believe it. It's surreal to win here."

But even as Larson and Hendrick Motorsports digs in to celebrate this momentous win - his series' leading fourth of the season and the 27th of his Cup Series career - he's already thinking about next year and another attempt at the double.

"How about we come back next May and try and kiss these bricks in an Indy car," Larson shouted to the fans before detailing his plans, when asked if he was definitely running the double again. "I'd love to, I'd love to. We're working on it. So, I hope we can announce something soon and see you all next May."

Herta, Kirkwood go 1-2 for Andretti in Toronto

Six consecutive times - dating to the start of the 2022 NTT IndyCar Series campaign - Colton Herta and the No. 26 Andretti Global program started on the pole and failed to win.

Those half-dozen races have ended a variety of ways, from a DNF (did not finish) at Long Beach to a runner-up finish at Toronto, with combinations of bad luck, strategy miscues and pit lane mistakes in between.

Sunday, the 24-year-old driver ensured there wouldn't be a seventh.

After leading nearly all 85 laps during IndyCar's annual stop on the streets of Toronto, Herta and company executed two almost flawless pit stops, hit on the proper strategy and held off a teammate and a six-time series champ during a late-race caution and an even later red flag to capture his first win in 41 starts.

"We've been knocking on the door for a win for so long. 41 starts without a win is a long time. Michael (Andretti) is an owner that demands perfection and results, and we're people who work for the team that demand it, too, and I'm so happy," Herta said. "I wish we didn't have this long of a break. I want to go get right back in for another one."

With fewer than 15 laps to go, Pato O'Ward, sitting sixth, lost the rear of his No. 5 Chevy coming through the turn 1 right-hander and slid into the outside wall. A few spots back, Andretti Global's Marcus Ericsson couldn't avoid O'Ward's car in the braking zone and skidded into the side of O'Ward.

From there, O'Ward's car would essentially turn into a ramp, as Pietro Fit-

tipaldi and Santino Ferrucci ran over the nose of the No. 5 and went airborne.

The red flag lasted just under 20 minutes, with 13 cars left on the lead lap and 16 running when the cars fired back up and peeled off pit lane, followed shortly by a race restart with nine laps to go.

The 16 cars still running took the green flag with nine laps to go, and before they could turn a single lap, Will Power lunged on his Team Penske teammate Scott McLaughlin, both of them solidly in the hunt for the championship entering Sunday, to try and snag fourth place away for the closing stretch.

As chaos happened behind them, teammates Herta and second-place Kyle Kirkwood didn't put a wheel wrong all day, with Kirkwood admitting postrace that he was extra cautious on the early- and late-race restarts to give his Andretti Global teammate out front an extra cushion to ensure they both could make it through the packed-up moments unscathed and live to fight it out on the track.

Nick Dunlap, just 20, wins second title on PGA Tour

Nick Dunlap has won again on the PGA Tour, but this time he gets to cash the winner's check.

Dunlap scored 19 points in Sunday's final round of the Barracuda Championship, the fifth and final opposite-field event on the PGA Tour's 2024 schedule and also the lone event that uses the Modified Stableford scoring system.

Dunlap's day matched the highest



single-day scoring mark of the week at the Old Greenwood course at Tahoe Mountain Club. His Sunday scorecard featured seven birdies (worth two points) and an eagle (worth five) and

would have added up to a 62 it it were a stroke-play event. His eagle came courtesy of a 55-foot bomb on the par-515th.

Dunlap vaulted up the leaderboard to finish with 49 points. He then had to play the waiting game to see if thirdround leader Mac Meissner or anyone else could catch up. But no one could and Dunlap, who doesn't turn 21 until Dec. 23, collected a second piece of hardware this year.

Dunlap won the American Express in January to become the first amateur since Phil Mickelson in 1991 to win on the PGA Tour Dunlap's amateur status, though, kept him from collecting the top prize of \$1.512 million. He turned pro shortly after that and now has a second tour win on his resume.

He's the first golfer in PGA Tour history win as both an amateur and a pro in the same season.

His win this time around is good for

Maybe more important, Dunlap, who was No. 95 on the FedExCup points list heading into the Barracuda, has shot up to 63rd. If it holds, it would put him into the FedExCup Playoffs in his rookie season. The top 70 make the field at the FedEx St. Jude Championship.

Chanettee Wannasaen prevails at Dana Open for 2nd LPGA win

Chanettee Wannasaen's second LPGA victory felt miles different from her first, when she became the third Monday qualifier in tour history to win at last year's Portland Classic.

This time the 20-year-old came into the final round of the Dana Open with some history as she held the 54-hole lead for the first time in her pro career.

The Thai player was up by as many as five strokes midway through the round Sunday but watched that advantage dwindle to one as last year's Louise

Suggs Rookie of the Year, Haeran Ryu, shot up the board.

Xiyu "Janet" Lin was the only top-20 player in the world in Sylvania, Ohio, for the 40th anniversary of the Dana Open. Lin, who is still looking for her first LPGA title, tied for fifth.

"Right now. I feel like I can't explain anything," Wannasaen told Golf Channel's Amy Rogers when it was over. "I just feel so proud of myself."

Wannasaen held on to win by one stroke with birdies on the last two holes, draining an 18-footer to clinch the title at 20 under. She becomes the third Thai player to win this season, joining Patty

utes before teeing off.

Tavatankit and Atthaya Thitikul. At 20 years, 3 months, 5 days, Wannasaen is the youngest player to win this season.

"Last day I cannot like calm down because my heart is like boom, boom.

boom, boom," she said. "Every hole." When the final group made its way to the 18th tee, a total of four groups were on the final hole at Highland Meadows. Wannasaen and Rvu took a rest on a nearby bench as players ahead attacked the closing par 5. They waited 24 min-

Wannasaen's last tee shot found the bunker, and though she led by one stroke, she still pulled out a fairway metal from 217 yards and opted for the aggressive play. She got away with the questionable approach, avoiding any real danger with her second shot and getting up and down from short left of the green to squeak out the win.

In the aftermath, Wannasaen was already looking ahead.

"Right now, I'm feel like I'm going looking for third trophy," she said. "Yeah, I think it's coming."

It's worth noting that the tour returns to Portland, Oregon, in two weeks.

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
