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
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

Overreaction: Texas, Bama unmasked?

 Alabama's playoff chances cooked It's true that the Crimson Tide's SEC championship hopes are likely gone with a second league loss. There might, however, still be a path to the expanded 12team College Football Playoff.

The top overreactions from Week 8:

Alabama's last three games are quite winnable. One is a tuneup against Championship Subdivision member Mercer, and the final two league contests are against Oklahoma and Auburn, teams in a greater state of disarray.

It's the two games over the next three weekends that will tell the tale for Alabama: a home date with Missouri on Saturday and a Nov. 9 trip to LSU. Should the Tide win both, they'll have a fairly clear route to 10-2 with the win against Georgia also in the bank, a resume that would almost certainly be deemed playoff worthy. A split of those two and a 9-3 finish would leave matters in a much more ambiguous realm.

Whether Alabama could win the title should it be included in the at-large pool is a discussion for another day, but for now we must wait and see. We understand that patience is not an abundant quality for many fan bases, but don't write the Tide off just yet.

• Texas is back - to mediocrity

It didn't take long for the college football universe to move from anointing the Longhorns as title favorites to wondering aloud if they're not ready for this new conference after all. As with many such discussions, the truth probably lies somewhere between those extremes.

As has been pointed out, the foundation upon which the Longhorns' No. 1 ranking had been constructed wasn't as sturdy as we might have believed given the ongoing struggles of Oklahoma and Michigan.

It is equally true that Texas is hardly the first team to be humbled by an encounter with a motivated Georgia squad. Remember how postmortems for Clemson were being written after Week 1?

In short, we'll wait and see how Texas

responds to its first taste of adversity, starting with a visit to frisky Vanderbilt.

• Indiana is going to win the Big Ten Most people probably didn't believe Curt Cignetti when he made that bold pronouncement upon accepting the head coaching gig in Bloomington. But lo and behold the Hoosiers have steamrolled everything in their path en route to a 7-0 start that now has everyone's at-

There's just one teensy-weensy problem though. The penultimate week of the season involves a trip to Ohio State. We are in no way saying a win in Columbus isn't possible.

But if the Hoosiers do come up short there, they would lose a head-to-head tiebreaker with the Buckeyes for a spot in the conference title game, assuming both teams win the rest of their games. There is no Penn State or Oregon on Indiana's schedule, which is a plus in that all of their other contests are winnable but a minus in that there is no opportunity to offset a potential loss to the Buckeyes.

Now with all that said, the Hoosiers do very much have a strong at-large case for the playoff should they make it to the finish line at 11-1. That might seem overly ambitious for a program that has enjoyed limited gridiron success in its history, but we shouldn't be surprised now if it comes to pass.

• Michigan could miss a bowl

On the opposite end of the Big Ten's expectations meter we find the Wolverines, the defending national champions in name only now flailing to find any kind of offensive identity.

Aside from a home date with Northwestern, Michigan's November slate is a veritable murderers' row in the new-look conference.

The Wolverines will be heavy underdogs against Oregon, Indiana and Ohio State, even with the Ducks and Buckeyes coming to Ann Arbor. This makes this week's rivalry game against Michigan State a virtual must-win if the Wolverines hope to reach the six-victory threshold for bowl eligibility.

The Spartans aren't likely to be terribly sympathetic having their own challenging second-half schedule. But Michigan State has made progress under

• The Cougar Conundrum

What if I told you there's a team currently without FBS conference affiliation with an excellent chance to go 11-1 - and it's not Notre Dame? Sure, the Fighting Irish could get there as well. But there's another non-affiliated team that could provide the CFP with an interesting test

Washington State, of the once-andfuture Pac-12, has made it to 6-1 with its lone blemish coming against Boise State. That would be the same Broncos squad that came within a field goal of the current No. 1 team. In addition to a hardfought Apple Cup win against former league foe Washington, the Cougars also have another Power Five victory against Texas Tech.

But now comes the bad news for the Cougars. That Texas Tech result lost some value when the Red Raiders were thumped at home by Baylor for their first Big 12 loss.

None of Washington State's remaining opponents figure to add much to its schedule strength calculation.

As things stand, Washington State would need a whole lot of breaks to go its way to earn consideration. But complete chaos always seems to be right around the corner in this sport, so fans on the Palouse should stay tuned.

Oregon moves up to top spot

The Ducks are the new No. 1 after Georgia rises three spots to No. 2 after the Bulldogs' 30-15 win Saturday in Austin. That loss sends Texas down six

That drop reflects the Longhorns' uninspiring strength of schedule. While wins against Michigan and Oklahoma came when both teams were ranked, the Wolverines and Sooners have since dropped out of the College Football Playoff picture.

While the Bulldogs looked the part of the nation's best team beating Texas on the road, the Ducks hold the edge thanks to an unbeaten record and this month's win against Ohio State.

The Buckeyes stay at No. 3, followed by No. 4 Penn State, No. 5 Miami and No. 6 Iowa State

Tennessee moves up three to No. 10 after beating Alabama 24-17. That's two losses this month for the Crimson Tide sandwiching a narrow win against South Carolina.

That drops the Tide five spots to No. 16 and into fifth among SEC teams, trailing the Bulldogs, Longhorns, No. 9 LSU, the Volunteers and No. 15 Texas A&M. Alabama next takes on No. 23 Missouri.

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Soto's agent says death changed '24 course

LOS ANGELES – High-powered agent Scott Boras stands near his frontrow seat at Dodger Stadium, looks at his client – soon-to-be one of the wealthiest athletes in the world – and can't stop but think about how history could have been dramatically altered.

Boras wouldn't be watching Freddie Freeman's grand slam in Game 1, or Yoshinobu Yamamoto's gem in Game 2, giving the Los Angeles Dodgers a 2-0 lead over the New York Yankees in this World Series.

Boras believes he'd still be watching All-Star right fielder Juan Soto in the World Series, but he'd be wearing a San Diego Padres uniform.

"If (owner) Peter Seidler were still alive," Boras told USA TODAY Sports, "none of this would be happening. Juan would have been with the Padres. He never would have been traded to the Yankees. He'd be a Padre today."

And a Padre for the rest of his career. "Peter and I were knee-deep in Juan Soto (contract) discussions," Boras reveals. "Well advanced. His illness really stopped the process because we knew the organization would be different. He wanted to push it through even though he was ill."

The contract was never consummated. He died of cancer on Nov. 14, 2023.

"I have a text message from him four days before he died," Boras said. "'Be back online real quick.'"

Three weeks later, Soto was traded to the Yankees.

Never, Boras said, would Seidler have

permitted Soto to be traded.

"Peter was not trading Juan Soto," Boras said. "No way. He kept saying, 'I traded for a franchise. I'm not giving him up.' He couldn't believe they (the Washington Nationals) traded Juan Soto. He loved Juan."

If the Padres kept Soto, the Yankees aren't the benefactors of his spectacular season.

And if the Padres had kept Soto, well, he perhaps he doesn't become one of the greatest young stars to hit the free agent market in baseball history – posting an 8.1 WAR this season and at least a 6.0 WAR in three of the last four seasons.

"In my mind, there is elite WAR, and then the rest of the players," Boras said.

"An elite player has an evaluation that is so extreme because he brings in market, he brings in fans and he brings in broadcasting (revenue), which adds to the valuation of the player in addition to what he does on the field."

Soto, 26, could soon become the highest-paid player in history, earning a contract in excess of \$500 million, which would eclipse the present-day value of Shohei Ohtani's deal the Dodgers. Although Ohtani signed a 10-year, \$700 million contract, \$680 million is deferred without interest for 10 years, giving it a value of \$460 million, according to MLB's calculations.

"The story of how (Soto) got to free agency is remarkable," Boras said. "A young Dominican kid who had to go through all of the (crap) to get to free agency. It's just a testament to his intellect, turning down \$100 million, \$200 million, \$300 million, \$400 million offers."

Soto was ultimately offered a 12-year, \$440 million contract by the Nationals in 2022, after rejecting three earlier offers. Soto flatly rejected the offer. The Nationals, fearing that Soto was committed to testing the free agent market in 2½ years, traded him in July 2022. He helped lead the Padres to the National League championship series, losing in six games to the Philadelphia Phillies.

It only whet Seidler's appetite to build a powerhouse that could challenge the Dodgers in the NL West. The Padres went on a spending spree, signing shortstop Xander Bogaerts, giving Manny Machado a \$350 million extension – and offering Aaron Judge more than \$400 million. The Padres grossly underachieved, didn't reach the postseason at 82-80 and let manager Bob Melvin depart for San Francisco.

The Padres, who in 2023 lost more than \$200 million, immediately began to slash the payroll by \$90 million. To make sure they stayed below the luxury tax, they began shopping Soto before trading him in a seven-player package.

Soto, who became part of the most dynamic 1-2 punches in history with Judge, led the Yankees to their first American League pennant since 2009 after missing the postseason last year and is doing everything in October to make sure they win a 28th title.

Soto, who celebrated his 26th birthday Friday, has homered four times this postseason and in three of the Yankees' past four games, including his three-run homer in the 10th inning of the ALCS-clinching win in Cleveland. He's hitting .350 (14-for-40) with a 1.160 OPS.

"You can be the best player, you can do whatever you want," Soto said. "But at the end of the day, people remember you if you win a World Series and what you did for that team."

The Yankees haven't hidden their desire to have him return. The crosstown Mets, with the richest owner in baseball in Steve Cohen, could be beckoning. The Phillies are expected to strongly pursue him to team up with Boras client Bryce

Harper. The Toronto Blue Jays and San Francisco Giants, who were left at the altar in the Ohtani bidding war last winter, will turn their attention to Soto.

Soto's value has soared to such levels that Boras, who usually has his company produce a glossy binder that he presents to clubs to illuminate a star's value, may not even bother with Soto.

"He has more elite years to offer," Boras said, "and a ceiling that is even higher than what he's already done."

Who knows the ultimate price tag, but if Soto receives a 15-year contract, littered with opt-out clauses, no one would be surprised. Teams believe he could be worth the record investment.

Certainly, there's no need for algorithms to valuate his popularity among Yankee fans. Those sentiments were expressed – loud and clear – with fans chanting "Re-Sign Soto! Re-Sign Soto!" during their pennant-clinching victory in Cleveland, with Soto running over to the stands and raising his arms.

"He's been a great Yankee because he's a generational player," the Yankees' Giancarlo Stanton said. "He's great, period. The Yankees are the mecca of baseball and he's right where he needs to be. There's no stage too big for him. We need him to stay. He's going to stay."

The Yankees can sweet-talk him all they want, the fans can chant his name from their morning coffee to evening cocktail, but money talks the loudest.

"He's had a hell of a run," Yankees general manager Brian Cashman said. "He's enjoyed it. He's performed. He's felt like he's always been here, the way he's acclimated himself. He's earned the right to be a free agent. So all those type of discussions will happen" after the World Series.

Soto has reiterated that he'd love to stay with the Yankees, but, of course, there will be no hometown discount. Money talks and if it's close the deciding factor will be whether the team plans to be a perennial World Series contender.

"Definitely every player wants to be happy with where they're at," Soto said. "At the end of the day, whenever you win, you're really going to be happy.

"So, wherever you are that you have a chance to win a championship, you're going to be excited to play for them. I think that's the biggest thing. That's the biggest mindset right now. See where's the best chance for that, and go from there."

For now, there is a World Series to

Season on ropes as Dolphins' defense lets down Tua

MIAMI GARDENS, Fla. – This should be a story about a slide, but it's a story about a collapse.

This should be a story about how everyone at Hard Rock Stadium on Sunday cheered, loudly, when Miami Dolphins quarterback Tua Tagovailoa scrambled and slid, popping up and pointing first down.

But in the end, nobody cheered.

In the end, the Dolphins collapsed and lost to the Arizona Cardinals 28-27.

The good news is Tua is back and the offense looked sort of like what it's supposed to. Returning from a concussion that cost him four games, Tua emerged unscathed. He slid, remember?

The bad news is Miami's injury-depleted defense found a way to allow Kyler Murray to lead a comeback, after the Dolphins had led 20-10 in the third quarter. A short field goal won it for the Cardinals after they had too easily traveled 73 yards on a final drive.

And for all the good things Tua and Tyreek Hill and Jaylen Waddle and Raheem Mostert and De'Von Achane and the offensive line did, we must point out the turnaround began with a safety.

Center Aaron Brewer said he could have taken something off the snap. Tagovailoa said he should have caught the snap. It went off his hands and Tua was batting it out of the back of the end zone and suddenly it was 20-12.

"I thought we had absolutely every chance to win it," Dolphins coach Mike McDaniel said, adding later, "We get what we deserve."

The Dolphins were playing without Jaelan Phillips and Bradley Chubb and Zach Sieler and Kader Kohou. Jevon Holland, already with a hand injury, left this game with a knee injury.

Miami's defense, pretty solid all season, wilted in the end.

"You're in full speed, thinking things, and things just kind of happen, and you realize the guy's not out there no more," defensive end Calais Campbell said of Holland.

The Dolphins are in massive trouble, at 2-5, and headed to Buffalo.

Would general manager Chris Grier turn into a trade-deadline seller?

Tua's return was supposed to fix everything. On this day, it could not prevent the defense from bending, and then breaking.

Tua did appear to fix the troubles on offense. Tyreek Hill and Jaylen Waddle came alive. And Miami, to McDaniel's credit, did not abandon the run game.

But in that locker room, what one could sense was frustration, annoyance


