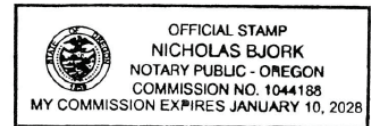

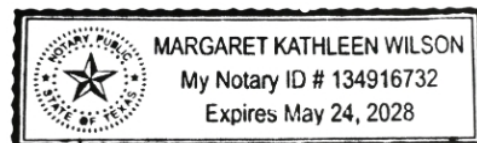

Study: US alcohol-related deaths nearly doubled in 20 years

Alcohol-related deaths have surged in the United States, nearly doubling over 20 years, and a growing number of victims are women, a new study warns.

“Our study found significant gender differences in alcohol-related [death rates],” said senior author Yiota Kitsantas, head of population health and social medicine at the Florida Atlantic University (FAU) College of Medicine. “While men had higher overall death rates, women experienced a larger relative increase, which may reflect changing social norms and the alcohol industry’s increased targeting of women through marketing campaigns.”

For the study, she and her colleagues looked at U.S. government data from 1999 to 2020.

Over that period, the rate of alcohol-related

deaths nearly doubled – from 10.7 per 100,000 to 21.6 per 100,000.

In raw numbers, alcohol-related deaths spiked from 19,356 to 48,870. While numbers were up in every age group, there was a nearly fourfold spike among 25- to 34-year-olds.

Researchers said their findings, published recently in the American Journal of Medicine, point to significant health challenges that may require targeted interventions. Obesity, diabetes and liver damage complicate these challenges, boosting alcohol-related death rates, they added.

Study co-author Dr. Charles Hennekens said healthcare providers should recognize that heavy drinking is a leading risk factor for early death, heart attack and stroke.

A professor at FAU College of Medicine, he added that screening for alcohol use in primary care settings is a must.

“Both globally and in the U.S., high levels of alcohol consumption are closely

linked to premature deaths and disability,” he said in a meeting news release. “One immediate effect of alcohol is liver damage, and in the U.S., the rising rates of obesity and diabetes also contribute to early liver damage.”

Over the study period, men and women between the ages of 55 and 64 had the steepest increase in death rates.

Men had the highest rates of alcohol-related deaths in both 1999 and 2020. But women’s death rates had a stunning rise in proportion, from 4.8 per 100,000 in 1999 to 12 in 2020.

Asians and Pacific Islanders saw their deaths more than double over the period (up 2.4 times), as did people in the Midwest (2.5), followed by the Northeast, West and South.

Researchers noted that alcohol use and health effects vary significantly around the world.

They reported that Latvia had the highest annual per capita consumption in 2019 at 13.2 liters, followed by France at 12.2 and the United States at 10.

Latvia also ranked No. 3 for total deaths. Despite its high alcohol use, France had low heart-related death rates but high rates of liver disease.

US-Israeli hostage confirmed dead, IDF announces

The Israeli military confirmed Monday that an Israeli American soldier, previously believed to have been captured alive by Hamas during its Oct. 7, 2023 attack against Israel, is now presumed dead.

Capt. Omer Neutra, 21, a New York native who enlisted in the Israeli military, was captured when Hamas militants attacked southern Israel. It was previously thought he was being held hostage since then, but officials have announced it is thought he was killed on the day of the Hamas attack and his body was then taken into the Gaza Strip.

Believing their son to be alive, the soldier’s parents, Ronen and Orna Neutra, led a public campaign for over a year, speaking at rallies in both Israel and the U.S., addressing the Republican National Convention, and maintaining contact with the Biden administration in a bid to

secure his release. Hamas is still holding approximately 100 hostages inside Gaza, with at least a third

believed to be dead. The Biden administration is renewing its push for a ceasefire and the release of the remaining captives after nearly a year of stalled negotiations between Israel and Hamas.

The situation remains dire, but diplomats see a glimmer of hope following a recent ceasefire between Israel and Hezbollah, the Lebanon-based militant group allied with Hamas.

Since the ceasefire between Israel and Hezbollah went into effect, Israel has carried out several retaliatory strikes in Lebanon, claiming that Hezbollah violated the agreement.

Israeli Foreign Minister Gideon Saar rejected accusations that Israel violated the ceasefire, asserting that Israel had only

responded to violations by Hezbollah.

The Oct. 7 attack marked the beginning of the current conflict when Hamas-led militants stormed southern Israel, killing approximately 1,200 civilians and taking around 250 hostages.

Israel’s retaliatory offensive has resulted in over 44,429 Palestinian deaths, with more than half the casualties being women and children, according to Gaza’s Health Ministry. Israel claims to have killed over 17,000 militants, though it has not provided evidence for these numbers. The war has displaced 90 percent of Gaza’s population, often multiple times.

The Neutras’ public campaign, which initially sought to free their son, has become part of the larger context of efforts to secure the release of hostages held by Hamas.

A video released by Hamas last weekend showed another American Israeli, Edan Alexander, alive.

Kirk Herbstreit: Players involved in postgame fights should be suspended

The scuffle between Ohio State and Michigan after the Buckeyes’ 13-10 loss to the Wolverines was one of just several fights across college football during rivalry week Saturday.

If it were up to one of the most prominent voices in the sport, those physical altercations would come with some serious consequences.

In a post Sunday night on X, the social media platform formerly known as Twitter, ESPN analyst and former Ohio State quarterback Kirk Herbstreit said that players involved in these fights should be suspended for their team’s next game, even if it forced them to sit out a conference championship or College Football Playoff game.

“I think any conference commissioner who had a team or teams involved in the postgame fights owes it to his conference and THE SPORT of CFB to study the film very closely and sit anyone who was involved in being an aggressor to help escalate the situation,” Herbstreit wrote. “Sit those involved for their next game. Whether it’s a bowl game or playoff game. These dudes need consequences-for their own good!”

The intense passions of rivalry matchups led to a number of violent confrontations between teams after their games last week.

Ohio State and Michigan players

got into a fracas after the Wolverines attempted to plant their maize-and-blue flag on the Block O at midfield of Ohio Stadium following their stunning triumph as a three-touchdown underdog. The fight took several minutes to clear up and saw police deploy pepper spray on players and nearby media members, something that the Ohio State Police Department is now investigating.

It wasn’t the only high-profile standoff between FBS teams.

North Carolina and North Carolina State, Florida and Florida State, and Arizona and Arizona State all got into heated altercations of some sort after their rivalry games. Each of the fights was instigated by the winning team, all of which were playing on the road, attempting to plant a flag (or, in Arizona State’s case, a trident) on their opponent’s midfield logo.

Repercussions from the Ohio State-Michigan brawl have already been felt, with both universities getting fined \$100,000 by the Big Ten. In a statement, the league said the Buckeyes and Wolverines violated the “fundamental elements of sportsmanship such as respect and civility” and that “the nature of the incident also jeopardized the safety of participants and bystanders.”

The Big Ten didn’t go as far as Herbstreit may have liked, with the conference opting not to discipline any individual players involved in the incident.

Rose Bowl announces plans to modernize 102-year-old stadium

The Rose Bowl Stadium is known for its traditions and moments, but even the historic venue has to be renovated to help reaffirm its place as a top-end destination in Southern California.

While the 102-year-old national historic landmark in Pasadena remains a captivating location for some, it does have to fend off the arrival of SoFi Stadium and the Intuit Dome, which are drawing some of the bigger events to Inglewood.

The Rose Bowl was completed in 1922 and has served as the host of Super Bowls and college football championship games, among others. The venue will also host its third Olympic Games in 2028.

The Rose Bowl Operating Company and the Rose Bowl Legacy Foundation announced the Lasting Legacy Campaign on Monday morning. It is a revitalization plan for the stadium over the next several years.

The campaign is led by privately raised funds and features eight different projects, according to the Rose Bowl Stadium’s press release.

The projects will include a new field-level club in the south end zone and east-side standing sections. This falls under the first phase of the plan and is expected to be completed in 2026. The second phase will include the installation of one of the nation’s largest video boards beginning in 2028 after the Olympic Games.

CEO of the Rose Bowl Operating Company Jens Weiden said in the statement that “six of the eight projects are already fully funded or completed.”

Some of the stadium’s projects were already completed before UCLA’s first football season in the Big Ten Conference. The Rose Bowl had its marquee sign refurbished, saw infrastructure improvements to its water and gas systems and added east-side safe-standing sections for Bruins students.

The marquee sign is over 70 years old and often used as part of the background of visitors’ photography to show others they were at the notable venue. The stadium also overhauled its new sound system for the first time since the 1990s and was noticeably used during the UCLA GameDay experience.

The Bruins have used the stadium for their home games since 1982.

“The Rose Bowl Stadium has been

our home for over forty years and America’s Stadium for more than one hundred,” said UCLA athletic director Martin Jarmond. “We look forward to seeing the unmatched tradition of the iconic Rose Bowl Stadium paired with modern-day amenities that will enhance the fan experience for years to come.”

Based on rendered images released by the Rose Bowl, UCLA football players are seen running out of a new tunnel within the new south end zone club, which has fans located on each side.

In the coming weeks, the Rose Bowl will be part of the expanded College Football Playoff on New Year’s Day. An agreement was reached in 2022 which was considered the final hurdle before the CFP could expand to a 12-team playoff. The Rose Bowl will host a semifinal game in the sport’s first year with the expanded playoff.

For UCLA home games, the stadium covered a chunk of the seating on the north and south ends with tarps. Four of them held a letter spelling out U-C-L-A. The others displayed the logos of various sponsors. The maximum capacity for the Rose Bowl with tarps was 69,747.

The stadium has held well over 100,000 fans and most recently hosted the 2024 Rose Bowl Game with 96,371 in attendance to watch the CFP semifinal between Alabama and Michigan. It has not been stated what the new attendance figure could be after all renovations are complete.

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Notice of Security Incident

Please know that protecting personal information is something that Chemonics takes very seriously. We conducted a diligent investigation to confirm the nature and scope of the Incident, and we have taken steps to bolster overall security including strengthening multi-factor authentication processes, enhancing email security, deploying additional endpoint monitoring and detection tools, and blocking suspicious Internet traffic. We are providing notice and offering credit monitoring services to individuals based on the personal information that was potentially impacted.

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Scheffler earns ninth win of year in 2024

NASSAU, Bahamas – Eight wasn’t enough for Scottie Scheffler.

With birdies on three of the first four holes on Sunday, he assumed the lead and cruised to a six-stroke victory over Tom Kim at the 2024 Hero World Challenge for his ninth win of the year.

Was it ever. Scheffler closed with a birdie at the final hole to shoot 9-under 63 at Albany Club, a 72-hole total of 25-under 263 and successfully defend his title at the 20-man unofficial event hosted by Tiger Woods.

“You were in my tummy last time,” Meredith Scheffler told the couple’s first born, son Bennett, who arrived in May and was carried around the course by her mother in a baby carrier.

Scheffler, the world No. 1 and FedExCup champion, won seven times on the PGA Tour, including the Masters, Players Championship and Tour Championship. He also won a gold medal at the Paris Olympics, which he counts as win No. 8.

“Gotta enjoy each one, they’re all so unique,” Scheffler’s caddie Ted Scott said. “It’s just good to see him back on the horse.” And he smiled a wry smile before dashing to the airport to catch a flight.

Scheffler opened with 67 and followed with a bogey-free 64 to assume the lead. But he shot a rather pedestrian third-round 69 and trailed Justin Thomas by one stroke heading into the final round. Thomas wedged from 112 yards to 3 feet at the first to protect his one-shot lead. But he made bogeys at Nos. 2 and 5

When it was all said and done, some of the best players were left with nothing else to do but praise his brilliance.

“Sometimes he makes the competition look like he’s just playing around with us, you know what I mean, which isn’t easy to do,” Jason Day said.

To Kim, who often played money games at home in Dallas with Scheffler before the birth of Bennett and noted he lost 95% of those matches, marveled at how Scheffler never goes out and shoots a bad score.

Thomas and others echoed a similar sentiment that Scheffler excels at handling all the outside noise – whether it be the birth of his baby or being arrested before his tee time at the PGA Championship or just dealing with expectations he’s supposed to win every time he tees it up. No one has proved better at being able to compartmentalize and stay in his own little bubble.

“I don’t think people understand how difficult it is to win when you’re expected to win or when every single person that’s there expects you to play well and you expect you to play well and then to still play well,” Thomas said. “It truly is just as much of a talent as being able to, you know, control your distance with your wedges or flight a driver or hit it far, whatever it is, is being able to stay present, stay in the moment.

“It’s very hard to explain, but it’s so hard to do sometimes,” Thomas added. “To me that’s been the most impressive thing from Scottie.”

The year 2024 was for Scottie Scheffler, and if his latest putting adjustment is any indication, he’s in for only more success in 2025.

Scheffler passes another golf ranking milestone

Scottie Scheffler capped his incredible 2024 season on Sunday with his ninth victory of the calendar year at the Hero World Challenge.

And come Monday, he passed another benchmark previously accomplished by two golfers.

When the Official World Golf Ranking updates Monday, Scheffler was in the No. 1 spot for the 82nd consecutive week, breaking a tie with Nick Faldo for the fourth longest span of all time. The only two golfers to spend more consecutive weeks atop the OWGR are Tiger Woods, who did it twice for 281 and 264 weeks, respectively, and Greg Norman, who was No. 1 for 96 straight weeks.

Scheffler is the 25th golfer all time to reach No. 1, and he has held the position since May 21, 2023. With his massive lead in points, he’s not going anywhere for some time, either.

Next week will mark Scheffler’s 117th as No. 1 in the world, only five weeks behind Rory McIlroy’s 122, a mark he’ll

pass in the middle of January.

Dustin Johnson is next on the list, being in the top spot for 135 weeks, another mark that Scheffler is likely to top.

Another feat Scheffler is bound to pass is Norman’s longest stretch on top of the world at 96 straight weeks. Because of how many average points Scheffler has between him and world No. 2 Xander Schauffele, the chances of him losing the top spot in the world in the early part of 2025 are slim to none, meaning he’s likely to become the second golfer to spend at least 100 consecutive weeks at No. 1.

As far as catching No. 1 on that list? We’ll check back in a couple of years.

Scheffler earned the fourth-most OWGR points in a single year in 2024, trailing only Woods’ 2000, 2005 and 2006 seasons.

Woods is by far the most successful golfer in OWGR history, with Norman a distant second. The 28-year-old Scheffler is closing in on third with arguably the prime of his career just starting.

Tennessee grabs No. 1 spot

When three top-five teams lose on the same night in college men’s basketball, the next poll is bound to look considerably different. Such is the case this week in the new USA TODAY Sports Coaches Poll, which features a new No. 1 team.

Tennessee takes over the top spot, largely by getting through the week unscathed. The Volunteers received 26 of 31 first-place votes cast and hold the top spot for the first time since Feb. 11, 2019. Tennessee replaces Kansas, which held the top spot since the preseason poll before tumbling to No. 10 this week after defeats to Creighton and Missouri.

Auburn remains No. 2, bouncing back from a midweek loss at Duke with a decisive win against Richmond. The Tigers, who still have that tournament title in Maui on their resume, retained five No. 1 votes.

Iowa State vaults two places to No. 3 after taking down Marquette, which stays put at No. 4. Kentucky moves up to fifth after rebounding from a loss at

Clemson with Saturday night’s comeback win against Gonzaga in Seattle.

Duke climbs three spots to No. 6, following the Auburn victory with a win at Louisville in its ACC opener. Unbeaten Florida leaps six places to No. 7, its first top-10 appearance since the preseason poll in 2019. Alabama and Gonzaga check in at No. 8 and 9, respectively.

Michigan makes the biggest jump of the week, a nine-spot move to No. 14. Clemson heads a group of four newcomers to the poll, entering at No. 16 thanks to the Kentucky win.
