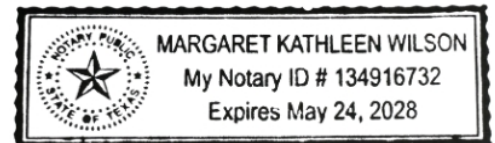

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Assad's fall creates power vacuum in Middle East

As Bashar Al-Assad fled to Moscow, the looters started raiding the presidential palace and people took to the streets of Damascus to celebrate his demise. The Syrian president had tried to hang on until the bitter end, still desperately sending an SOS to anyone who would listen, including Donald Trump. The despot had run out of road.

The world is still grasping the speed of events in recent days, and the collapse of a ruling dynasty that laid waste to the country during a catastrophic civil war. But the implications are also quickly sinking in - and not least the prospect of more upheaval and violence as groups tussle for control.

Assad had managed to endure the popular uprising against him for more than 13 years. But the message from his one-time allies and foes was clear: You're on your own. Russia, which had saved his skin back in 2015, only offered him sanctuary this time. Iran turned its back on him by saying in not so many words that he had brought it all on himself.

Multiple Arab and U.S. officials told Bloomberg that a power vacuum could now be dangerous. Memories of Muammar Qaddafi's Libya and Saddam Hussein in Iraq loom large in the region: In both countries, those entrenched rulers were swept aside in brief moments of euphoria, only for the countries to descend into deeper turmoil.

"Chaos is expected in transitions and so is factional - even bloody - competition," said Bader Al-Saif, an assistant professor at Kuwait University and an associate fellow at Chatham House. "Syria has not been its normal self for over a decade now, divided into enclaves and spheres of influence on top of socioeconomic and political decay."

The onset of Syria's conflict in 2011 displaced millions of people, sparking a migrant crisis that still reverberates in European politics today. Its Middle East neighbors, meanwhile, are already grappling with the fallout from Israel's war against Hamas in Gaza and fighting with Hezbollah in Lebanon.

Russia has military bases in Syria and will seek to protect its interests. But the Kremlin is occupied by its war in Ukraine. Iran, which has traded direct attacks with Israel in recent months, is also weakened. Arab officials, though, don't expect the Islamic Republic to give up its influence in Syria without a fight.

The pace of the events that unseated Assad after more than 50 years of his family in power was stunning. A little over a week ago, his survival seemed almost a foregone conclusion. Then insurgents led by the Islamist group Hayat Tahrir al-Sham captured the crucial cities of Aleppo and Hama, before closing in on Homs and Damascus, the capital.

On Sunday morning, rebels seized control of the television station and hailed the "fall of the criminal Assad regime." Assad decided to step down and left the country, Russia's foreign ministry later said.

The rebel advance unwound a stalemate in Syria, which had seen Assad's forces backed by Moscow and Tehran claw back control of most of the country, with the exception of a rebel stronghold in the northwest and a Kurdish stronghold in the northeast.

It unleashed a political situation in which much remains uncertain - not least the nature of the new government forming in Damascus. It's also unclear whether that leadership will be able to govern the war-torn country at all.

The mood reflected those concerns on Sunday night as a curfew was imposed and several buildings housing security agencies and the passport and immigration authority were consumed by flames, with locals speculating about Israeli strikes.

"The fear today is that all the factions are united against one enemy but they will eventually be consumed by infighting," said Bahjat Hajjar, co-founder of an NGO called Madaniya who fled Damascus shortly after 2011 due to his opposition to the Assads.

Speaking at a conference in Bahrain on Sunday Anwar Gargash, adviser to United Arab Emirates President Sheikh Mohammed Bin Zayed, warned of threats to Syria's territorial integrity, an ongoing "spiral of chaos and violence" in the Arab world, and the prospect of "extremism and terrorism." Saudi Arabia, which is involved in efforts to shape the transition period in Syria, issued a statement on Sunday warning against "chaos

and division."

U.S. President-elect Trump, meanwhile, made one thing clear: America won't intervene to stop that from happening. In a post on social media platform X on Saturday, Trump wrote, "Syria is a mess, but is not our friend."

The U.S. designates the rebel group HTS, which formed an alliance with al-Qaeda more than a decade ago, a terrorist organization. HTS has since sought to project itself as a force for unity, but many U.S. and Middle Eastern officials are doubtful.

"The guys who are taking over are terrorists, but they're sending some interesting messaging," said Jason Greenblatt, a former Middle East envoy in Trump's first administration. "If they realize Trump means business and is not going to tolerate that and is hopefully going to galvanize the region to fight against terrorism, they ought to figure out a way to comply."

Still, the risks and opportunities presented by an unstable Syria have drawn in myriad foreign powers since 2011 and look likely to continue to do so.

More than a decade of conflict has left between 300,000 to 500,000 people dead, decimated cities and pushed much of

its population into poverty. The World Bank has estimated that Syria's economy shrank by more than a half by 2020 from its pre-war level of around \$60 billion.

Syria's human development index rolled back 35 years because of faltering education and health services. The economy tanked. There were reports of looting following the declaration that Assad's government had fallen.

Turkey is likely to seek to capitalize on opportunities created by Assad's fall after 24 years to repatriate the millions of Syrian refugees living in Turkey. To that end, Ankara has urged a peaceful transition of power.

"We've been working for the stability of Syria for a long time - we are familiar with the actors," Turkish foreign minister Hakan Fidan told media at a forum in Doha on Sunday. "We have to work together with Syrian people, not only Turkey but also regional actors, the international actors, to make sure that there is a good and smooth transition period."

In another development, Israel said its ground forces crossed slightly into Syrian territory. Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu said that was necessary, temporary move after Syrian troops abandoned positions on their side of a buffer zone between the two countries.

An Israeli minister said the aim is to make sure there are no strategic weapons in the area that can be used against Israel, which also said it had struck chemical weapons and missile storage sites in Syria.

That's as Iran finds itself on the defensive. The same goes for Russia, which is now needed to preserve some stability without Assad, according to Elena Suponina, a Moscow-based Middle East expert.

"Syrian euphoria could help engender the kind of unity we need to see," said Charles Lister, senior fellow and director of the Syria Program at the Middle East Institute. "But after 14 years of ferocious conflict and division, the hill ahead is steep."

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In ranking the contenders, Oregon continues to beat all

Most years within the four-team play-off era, if offered the chance to pick one team to win the national championship or accept the other three, I'd take my top pick and give you the field. The 12-team playoff, coupled with this season's lack of a juggernaut, alters that logic.

No. 1 Oregon, as the nation's only undefeated team, enjoys favorite status, but barely. The Ducks' challenging bracket placement might require them to tackle No. 8 Ohio State and No. 5 Texas just to reach the national championship game.

"It's not supposed to be easy," Oregon coach Dan Lanning said on ESPN after the Ducks learned their draw.

Not in this format, anyway.

How I'd rank the 12 teams in the bracket, in order of lowest chance to win the national championship to best chance.

Note: This is not a pure power ranking of teams. Rather, it takes into account how strong each team is, combined with its bracket placement and path toward a championship.

12. SMU (No. 11 seed)

The Mustangs join Indiana and Texas as the only teams in the playoff that own no victories against teams currently ranked in the playoff top 25. Rhett Lashlee's quarterback change in September to Kevin Jennings triggered an SMU rise resulting in a surprise playoff bid, but first-round opponent Penn State poses a stiffer test than any the Mustangs faced within a favorable ACC schedule.

11. Clemson (No. 12 seed)

Credit Dabo Swinney's squad for rallying into the playoff after suffering a blow-out defeat in a season opener against Georgia, but consider that game a harbinger of what awaits in the playoff. Clemson will encounter tough sledding at first-round opponent Texas. Even if the Tigers spring an early upset, they're on Oregon's side of the bracket.

10. Indiana (No. 10 seed)

Curt Cignetti deserves coach of the year honors for his first-year achievements at Indiana, taking the Hoosiers from 3-9 to 11-1. Indiana specialized in crushing bad and average teams. A neat parlor trick, and one that requires talent, but in its lone game against a playoff qualifier, Indiana flopped at Ohio State. Playing at Notre Dame in the first round is no easy way to start.

9. Arizona State (No. 4 seed)

The Sun Devils are hot. Their six con-

secutive victories include a Big 12 championship rout of Iowa State. Running back Cam Skattebo emerged as one of the nation's most enthralling players, but he could run into a wall of Texas run defense in the quarterfinals that may be too difficult for Arizona State to overcome.

8. Boise State (No. 3 seed)

The Broncos didn't require any charity to qualify. They'd be in, even if this format didn't reserve a spot for the Group of Five. Their resume exceeds that of at-large qualifiers like Indiana and SMU. Ashton Jeanty emerged as appointment viewing, but can Boise State's pass attack provide enough balance to beat teams like Penn State or Georgia in successive fashion? That's a fair question.

7. Tennessee (No. 9 seed)

Tennessee's defense compares to elite units at Texas, Ohio State and Notre Dame. The group carried the Volunteers to this point, but they face a tough avenue that begins at Ohio State – Tennessee struggles on the road – and would continue against Oregon. Also, quarterback Nico Iamaleava reached 200 passing yards against just two SEC opponents.

6. Penn State (No. 6 seed)

Penn State presents as the light-beer version of 2023 Michigan. That's not really a dig – 2023 Wolverines Light sounds pretty good, actually – but is that enough to win four playoff games? The Nittany Lions received a coveted bracket draw. They would not encounter Oregon until the national championship game or Georgia until the semifinals. But, Penn State under coach James Franklin has a history of losing big games, including losses to Ohio State and Oregon this season. That's tough to ignore.

5. Ohio State (No. 8 seed)

The Buckeyes ooze talent, and they join Oregon and Georgia as the only teams in this field to beat multiple playoff qualifiers, but their offensive line is down

two starters, and the loss to Michigan contributed to the Buckeyes receiving an arduous path to the national championship. Their route would include Tennessee, Oregon, possibly Texas in the semifinals and someone like Georgia, Notre Dame or Penn State in the national championship game. That's awfully rugged.

4. Notre Dame (No. 7 seed)

The Irish finished the regular season at peak stride, and they drew the more favorable side of the bracket. Few opponents found much success slowing their ground game or attacking Notre Dame's defense. The question centers on whether Notre Dame's light schedule adequately prepared it for the rigors of needing to win four playoff games against a caliber of opponent it hasn't faced. Maybe, the Irish lurk as the best team this side of Oregon. Or, maybe, they're a byproduct of a forgiving schedule. They're the ultimate wild card.

3. Georgia (No. 2 seed)

Georgia earned a first-round bye at the expense of losing its starting quarterback. The more pressing question surrounds Georgia's supporting cast, which doesn't measure up to Kirby Smart's past three teams. Count Georgia out at your own risk, though. No team owns more wins against playoff qualifiers.

2. Texas (No. 5 seed)

The Longhorns lack a win against a playoff qualifier, but so do seven other teams in this bracket, and the only team to beat Texas (Georgia, twice) resides on the far side of the bracket. The Longhorns defense fuels this engine. Their offensive line handled every opponent except Georgia. They'll be a decisive favorite in their first two games, Clemson and Arizona State. The question: Is Quinn Ewers a quarterback with whom Texas can win a national championship? He's been fine, though rarely spectacular. Texas will need him to perform at a higher gear if it runs into an opponent like Oregon, but the rest of the pieces are in place.

1. Oregon (No. 1 seed)

Oregon possesses the playoff's best quarterback, and it is unencumbered by glaring weakness. That's an enviable combination. Don't overlook the Ducks' offensive line, either. That unit suits the Big Ten. The Ducks endured multiple tough tests and kept coming out on top. The playoff draw did Oregon few favors. If the choice is Oregon or the field, take the field. If the choice is between Oregon or my pick of another team, give me Oregon.

Duke QB enters transfer portal after big '24 year

Lane Kiffin and Ole Miss have some extra film work to do, as the Rebels prepare for their Gator Bowl matchup against Duke.

ESPN's Pete Thamel reported Monday night that Duke quarterback Maalik Murphy will not play against the Rebels on Jan. 2 in Jacksonville as he has entered the NCAA transfer portal.

Murphy is coming off his first season at Duke, after joining the Blue Devils last offseason from Texas.

The 6-foot-5 quarterback led the Blue Devils to a 9-3 overall record this season, the most regular-season wins for Duke since 2014 per ESPN. He won the starting quarterback job for Manny Diaz's squad out of training camp over sophomore Grayson Loftis and red-shirt sophomore Henry Belin IV.

He also had a record-breaking season statistically himself, throwing for a program-record 26 touchdowns and a career-high 2,933 yards.

Murphy was ranked the No. 6 quarterback in the transfer portal last season according to his 247Sports Composite rankings profile.

As for who may start under center against Ole Miss at the Gator Bowl, Lotis and Belin are expected to compete for the starting job according to The Fayetteville Observer's Rodd Baxley.

As previously reported by the Clarion Ledger, Ole Miss quarterback Jaxson Dart will play in the Gator Bowl versus Duke. ESPN's Mel Kiper Jr. has Dart, who is expected to declare for the NFL draft, ranked the No. 9 quarterback in this year's draft.

Ole Miss (9-3 overall, 5-3 Southeastern Conference) kicks off against Duke in the Gator Bowl at 7:30 p.m. ET on Jan. 2 inside Everbank Stadium in Jacksonville, Florida.

Mason Graham reportedly declares for NFL draft

Michigan defensive tackle Mason Graham is off to the NFL.

According to ESPN's NFL insider Adam Schefter on Tuesday, the Wolverines star defensive player has declared for April's NFL draft and hired Drew Rosenhaus and Ryan Matha as his agents.

There is no mention by Schefter or in ESPN's article on whether Graham will play in Michigan's ReliaQuest Bowl against Alabama.

The 6-foot-3, 320-pound defensive tackle is having his best season at Michigan this year, finishing the regular season with 45 tackles and 3.5 sacks for a loss of 26 yards.

Graham earned All-Big Ten first team by both the coaches and media this season. He was named a second-team All-American last season after finishing with 35 total tackles (7½ for a loss), three sacks, one forced fumble, one fumble recovery and a pass deflection.

In Michigan's historic upset over Ohio State in Week 14, Graham recorded

a career-high seven tackles. The Wolverines defensive tackle is ranked as the No. 5 prospect in this year's NFL draft class according to ESPN's Mel Kiper Jr., and the No. 1 defensive tackle.

"I love Graham's technique. His leverage gives him an advantage at the point of attack, and interior offensive linemen struggle with his power and quickness," Kiper wrote. "Graham has strong and active hands, and he has proved effective against the run and pass from inside."

Graham is projected to go No. 9 over-

all to the Cincinnati Bengals in USA TODAY's latest NFL mock draft.

Graham's stats at Michigan:

- 2022: 27 total tackles, 2.5 tackles for a loss of 20 yards, 2.5 sacks for a loss of 20 yards and a pass deflection.

- 2023: 35 total tackles, 7.5 tackles for a loss of 44 yards, three sacks for a loss of 19 yards, one pass deflection, one forced fumble and a fumble recovery.

- 2024: 45 total tackles, seven tackles for a loss of 34 yards, 3.5 sacks for a loss of 26 yards, one pass deflection and a block.

Vermont men run to NCAA soccer title

CARY, N.C. – Vermont men's soccer had never been here before.

The Catamounts defied the odds, anyways.

The America East, the Catamounts' conference, had never been this close before.

The Catamounts just shrugged at those odds, too.

Unseeded teams had only won the NCAA Tournament soccer championship twice over the past two decades.

And the Catamounts wagered on themselves.

But the narrative of the 2024 NCAA champion Vermont men's soccer team isn't about Cinderella runs or underdog status. We've already heard from players and coaches on what they thought of those labels in their historic run to the College Cup.

"I think everyone is looking at Vermont right now and saying, 'These underdogs, watch out for Vermont.' But let's shorten that up and let's just call us dogs," head coach Rob Dow said after the penalty shootout win over Denver in Friday's semifinals.

Their story is about a team, a program, that set out to do something that, frankly, seemed ambitious – speculative even – when Dow recruited players like Zach Barrett with a promise: Chase and win a national championship.

"That was something that was unique to hear, for me, and I was definitely all in on that," the fifth-year senior Barrett said earlier this month.

Over five years, Vermont built itself into a national power on the strength of a culture of belief starting with leaders like Barrett and Max Murray, chemistry, will and selflessness.

Look no further than Monday's regulation hero Marcell Papp, who registered the equalizer in the 81st minute. The graduate student from Budapest, Hungary, had started only nine games this fall and was a second-half sub Mon-

day in the 69th minute with Vermont trailing Marshall 1-0.

Papp then connected with David Ismail with a fine, give-and-go and goal scorer's finish to polish off another season-saving moment for the tying tally.

"Depth was a huge focus for this team, but it also takes humility. A guy like Marcell ... that's an ultra-team first player," Dow said.

When Maximilian Kissel scored the overtime winner to send Vermont to new heights and a title coronation, it was also the Catamounts' 22nd goal in the 76th minute or later this season. Vermont scored 48 times total in 2024.

Again, Vermont's determination shined through.

Barrett gained possession in his own end and flipped a deep outlet pass to Kissel, who shrugged off one Marshall defender and then danced around the goalie for an open-net finish.

"When other people start getting heavy legs, we just get stronger," Barrett said. "That's a testament to all the hard work we've put in and that's why we've been able to score so many late goals."

In their final year in Burlington, Barrett, Murray and others purchased meal cards at the start of the school year. Maybe they were bad cooks, Dow joked, but the seniors wanted to bond with the freshmen and sophomores after practice at dinner.

"This group ... is one of the closest teams, probably the closest team I've ever been a part of in my life, in any sport," Barrett said. "I think it really all shows on the field with our chemistry and verbal and some nonverbal stuff that you can't really teach or coach."

Vermont soccer was a multifaceted, high-caliber outfit that could win in many ways. We watched them score the most goals of any team in the NCAA

Tournament. We watched them beat a Marshall team that hadn't trailed at any point in this tournament until the golden call. We watched highlight after highlight over the last three weeks.

But when Kissel's shot rolled into the back of the net, one title fit the best.

"They are a national champion at the University of Vermont and no one is going to take that away from them," Dow said.

School's NCAA championship history

Vermont is the second Catamount team to claim an NCAA title, joining the ski program (six crowns).

And the Catamounts are the first unseeded men's soccer squad to win the crown in a non-COVID, full-field NCAA Tournament since 2006. Marshall, in 2020, won it all in a reduced field.

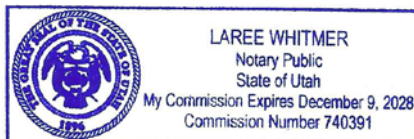

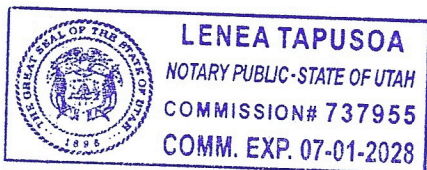
