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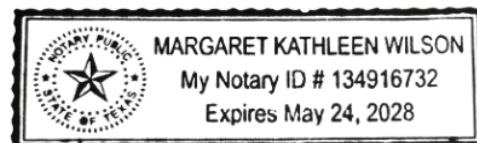
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Notre Dame’s special teams’ specials

SOUTH BEND, Ind. – Creativity on special teams has given Notre Dame football more than its share of jolts on its march to the Jan. 20 championship game of the first 12-team College Football Playoff.

While Pro Football Focus ranks the Irish ninth in overall special teams efficiency, three spots behind fellow CFP finalist Ohio State, that doesn’t take into account the sheer shock value coordinator Marty Biagi’s group has provided along the way.

Here’s a look at some of the more notable special teams surprises Notre Dame has pulled through 15 games this season:

Dec. 20: Swinging Gate versus Indiana

Leading 17-3 late in the third quarter, the Irish field goal unit shifted into the Swinging Gate formation, leaving only snapper Rino Monteforte at the line of scrimmage.

Facing fourth-and-8 from the Hoosiers’ 10-yard-line, Monteforte flung the ball out to tight end Mitchell Evans, who barreled toward the goal line. Indiana was granted a timeout just before the snap, which was fortunate for Evans, who came up short of the first-down marker.

“I was thinking it was live the whole time,” Evans said. “I didn’t hear a whistle, so we ran it, and I looked up and I was half a yard short. Thank God they called a timeout.”

Notre Dame settled for a field goal in an eventual 27-17 first-round playoff win.

“Those are always exciting, having a little trick up your sleeve,” Evans said. “Especially when you’re a part of it. You’re like, ‘OK, this is pretty sick.’ ”

Oct. 19: Double dose versus Georgia Tech in Atlanta

From the moment Tyler Buchner was assigned No. 26 after returning to the football roster last summer, the potential was there for a switcheroo at holder. Sure enough, that was Buchner out there in place of usual holder Chris Salerno, the other Irish No. 26, with Notre Dame leading 28-7 in the final four minutes.

On fourth-and-4 from the Tech 26, Buchner took the snap, emerged from his crouch and scooted down the right sideline for the necessary yardage.

Earlier in the fourth quarter, leading 21-7, Notre Dame ran a fake punt on fourth-and-8 from its 46. Jeremiyah Love gained 27 yards on a reverse after a pop-pass from upback Davis Sherwood

to Jayden Harrison.

The Yellow Jackets swapped out their special teams coach the following week.

Nov. 16: Illegal formation versus Virginia

Leading Virginia 14-0 late in the first half on Senior Day, Notre Dame saw Jordan Faison’s 73-yard touchdown scamper on a fake punt wiped out by a controversial penalty for an illegal formation.

Essentially, upback Jack Kiser was deemed to have taken Joseph Vinci’s snap too directly before handing off to Faison, which changed the jersey numbering requirements for the Irish front line.

Irish coach Marcus Freeman and Biagi were irate, having previewed the

oddball alignment for the ACC officiating crew in the offseason. Notre Dame converted some of that anger into 21 points over the next eight minutes of game action.

Nov. 30: Early spark at USC

Tied at 7 early in the second quarter, Buchner launched his first pass in a game in more than 14 months, dating to his only start for Alabama. This one came off a fourth-and-9 fake punt from the Irish 26.

Buchner circled back from his gunner position, took a pitch from Sherwood, the upback, then stopped and lofted a rainbow throwback to Evans for an 18-yard gain.

The drive ended with a 27-yard missed field goal, but the message had been sent to the eventual losers of a 49-35 shootout: The Irish weren’t about to play scared in the Coliseum.

Jan. 2: Speed swap versus Georgia

Up 23-10 midway through the fourth quarter of the Sugar Bowl quarterfinal, Notre Dame brought its punt team out on fourth-and-1 from the Irish 18. With the 40-second play clock ticking down, the offense rushed back out, hockey line-change style, forcing the Bulldogs to scramble with their personnel.

While Georgia didn’t panic, it did jump offsides during Riley Leonard’s hand-clap maneuvers. Given a fresh set of downs, Notre Dame proceeded to drain most of the remaining clock.

“If we’re doing something that controversial or big, we practice it so many times,” Irish running back Jadarian Price said. “J-Love was the one who went in most of the time when we practiced it, but he got chipped up, so it was my turn. I had a couple of reps practicing it as well; I had to know every detail.”

Ohio State wants to clean up penalty issue

COLUMBUS, Ohio – Ohio State’s College Football Playoff semifinal against Texas began as dominant as the Buckeyes’ first two CFP games had.

Then came the first of nine Buckeye penalties costing 75 yards. Ohio State led 7-0 and had moved the ball to the Longhorns’ 37-yard line late in the first quarter when TreVeyon Henderson was stopped for a 1-yard gain on first down. After the play, words were apparently exchanged, and Henderson threw a left hand to the helmet of defensive tackle Alex January.

Henderson was penalized for unsportsmanlike conduct, and the 15-yard penalty stymied the drive, ending OSU’s momentum.

It was the start of a trend that would force Ohio State to the brink before prevailing 28-14.

Holding penalties by wide receiver Emeka Egbuka and right tackle Josh Fryar doomed OSU’s next two possessions. In the third quarter, guard Austin Siereveld was called for unnecessary roughness when he blocked a Texas player at the end of a 15-yard pass to Carnell Tate.

On Texas’ fateful drive that ended with Jack Sawyer’s iconic play, Lathan Ransom and Jermaine Mathews were called for pass interference in the end zone on consecutive plays.

Fortunately for the Buckeyes, Sawyer saved the game with his strip, scoop and score to propel Ohio State to the CFP championship game next Monday against Notre Dame.

But coach Ryan Day knows the penalties caused the Buckeyes to flirt with

disaster.

“We’re disappointed that we really let four drives get away with penalties,” Day said Sunday. “It sent us way behind the sticks, and we cannot have that in this (championship) game. This is a team here that we’re about to play against that has been unbelievable creating turnovers and then creating scores after their turnovers. Efficiency is going to be something that we’ve got to do of a much better job of in this game if we’re going to win it.”

Penalties haven’t been a major issue this season for the Buckeyes. They entered the CFP semifinal ranked 10th nationally in penalty yardage. They’re now 15th (39.7 per game).

Henderson’s penalty was uncharacteristic. “There was back and forth and Tre made contact with his helmet,” Day said. “TreVeyon obviously feels terrible about it, but it’s a lesson to be learned there.

“Every game you learn, and TreVeyon is somebody that certainly has grown in

so many different areas of his life.”

The running back redeemed himself with a 75-yard score on a screen pass at the end of the first half to give Ohio State a 14-7 lead.

“To see him respond the way that he did after that (penalty) speaks to his maturity,” Day said. “But he knows that he’s got to play with emotion. He can’t let emotion play with him.”

Day was more tolerant of Siereveld’s penalty. “Austin’s hustling to the ball, and we talk about pushing the pile, and it’s a great effort play,” Day said.

Still, it came late and proved costly. Facing first-and-25, quarterback Will Howard was sacked on the next play, and the Buckeyes didn’t get a first down.

“To me, the story of this past game for us on offense was the self-inflicted wounds that set us back,” Day said.

Without those, he said, Sawyer’s iconic play wouldn’t have been needed. Ohio State has continually preached the need to not let games be close enough to be decided by one play. The Buckeyes made that play against Texas. They don’t want to face a similar situation against Notre Dame because of their own mistakes.

“We’ve got to play our best game against Notre Dame. It’s a very, very good team. They are a very resilient team. They play well together. I think (quarterback) Riley Leonard is a tremendous leader and a tremendous player and a winner,” Day added.

“Their coaching staff does a great job. I’ve got a lot of respect for their players and their coaches. This is going to be a complete battle, and we know that. We’ve got to play our best game this season in the last one.”

That includes not stopping themselves with penalties.

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Not been paying attention to men’s basketball? Here are the top storylines you have missed

Now that the college football season is over, it’s time to turn attention to the court and the march to the madness of the NCAA men’s tournament.

On Monday night, confetti fell from the rafters of Mercedes-Benz Stadium in Atlanta as Ohio State hoisted the College Football Playoff trophy as the champions of the 2024 season.

While the moment was meant to celebrate the Buckeyes, it inadvertently served another purpose. After the longest season in modern college football history, much of the college sports world will now shift its attention to college basketball.

There’s been plenty of storylines in the first half with expanded conferences, domination by the Southeast and freshman sensations. If you haven’t been paying attention to what’s been going on in college men’s basketball, here are some of the key points this season with Selection Sunday only eight weeks away.

Who is the college basketball best team so far?

Auburn has separated itself as the top team in the country – the No. 1 team in the country has the best record in Division I at 17-1. While the record is fantastic, it doesn’t tell the full story of how good the Tigers are. They emerged from the crowded Maui Invitational as champions and have played their best against quality opponents. Auburn has a 10-1 record against Quad 1 opponents while no other team has more than seven victories in the category. The only defeat Auburn suffered was a tough road contest at Duke. The Tigers were led by center Johni Broome, and though he suffered an injury that has sidelined him for a few weeks, Auburn hasn’t skipped a beat during its 10-game winning streak. It looks like a team headed toward being the top overall seed in the tournament.

SEC dominance

Auburn leads a pack from a confer-

ence that has dominated the first few months of the sport, proving that it does just mean more in hoops.

Before conference play began, SEC teams were a combined 185-23, with no team having more than three losses. It was an astounding start to the season that has led many to believe the SEC could send a record amount of teams to the tournament (the current best is 11 bids by the Big East in 2011).

Since conference play started, the SEC has started to cannibalize itself with some of those teams already struggling as a result of the difficulty. But it won’t be that harmful considering teams with losing SEC records will make the tournament. At the moment, 13 SEC teams are in the top 50 of the NET rankings and nine are in the Top 25 of the USA TODAY Sports men’s basketball coaches poll, with five in the top 10.

The Cooper Flagg show rolls on

The 6-foot-9 Maine native is perhaps the most ballyhooed freshman since Zion Williamson was also turning heads for Duke six years ago. Already the No. 1 recruit in the 2024 class, Flagg boosted his profile last summer, when he competed on the United States select team and held his own in a scrimmage against the NBA’s best players on the men’s na-

tional team preparing for the 2024 Paris Olympics.

At Duke, he has largely lived up to his lofty billing and shown major improvement. He is averaging 23.4 points, 6.9 rebounds and 4.6 assists in his team’s past eight games, a run highlighted by an ACC freshman record 42 points in a win over Notre Dame. Flagg even got a viral moment, too, when he threw down a transition dunk over Pitt 7-footer Guillermo Diaz Graham on Jan. 7.

If that progress continues, it’s possible that when he leaves Durham for the NBA after this season, he’ll do so after a run to the national title.

Connecticut looks vulnerable in quest for three-peat

Dan Hurley’s Huskies faced little resistance on their way to back-to-back national titles, winning each of its 12 tournament games by at least 13 points.

Nearly 20 games into this season, they haven’t looked nearly as invincible, with a 13-5 record that includes losses in two of their past three outings. UConn lost four of its top five scorers from last season’s championship team, including a pair of top-10 NBA draft picks – Stephon Castle and Donovan Clingan.

Still, there’s plenty of talent in Storrs, with Alex Karaban and five-star freshman Liam McNeeley, and it’s worth remembering that Hurley’s first title team, dominant as it was by the end of the season, was 15-5 this time two years ago.

The Big 12 is reliably entertaining

After it helped cannibalize the Pac-12, the Big 12 helped fill the void as the go-to league for chaotic late-night football. There hasn’t been a lack of drama in basketball, either.

In nine of the past 11 seasons, the Big 12 was rated by KenPom as the best conference in the sport. And while it’s not quite to the level of the SEC so far this season, it remains the home to some of the best programs in the sport. Iowa State looks like the class of the conference so far, especially after a 17-point thumping of Kansas last Wednesday.

The Jayhawks aren’t too bad themselves, lurking just outside of the top 10 of the coaches poll. Houston is yet again one of the country’s toughest teams. West Virginia has emerged from Bob Huggins’ messy exit with a superb first season under coach Darian DeVries. And after a rough start, newcomer Arizona has been one of the top teams in the nation over the past month.

How are new teams doing in new conferences?

For the most part, it’s been a tough start for the Power Four teams in new homes. Of the new additions, only four – Oregon, Arizona, SMU and Stanford – have winning records in conference play, with the Ducks the only team ranked in the coaches poll.

As for the others, UCLA cooled off from a solid start with a four-game losing skid as nearby Southern California has also struggled in the Big Ten. Utah is middling, and California, Washington, Arizona State and Colorado are at the bottom of their new leagues. Meanwhile, Oklahoma and Texas are learning just how tough the SEC is with each at 1-4 in league play.

Oregon and Arizona are the best chances for the respective Big Ten and Big 12 newcomers to win their conference, but it’s been a rocky start in some new places for the majority of newcomers.

Veteran coaches off to fast starts

What’s old is new again with veteran coaches – Tom Izzo, Rick Pitino and Dana Altman – having successful seasons well into their careers.

After years of mixed tournament results, Izzo has Michigan State relevant again with a 16-2 start that has the Spartans at the top of the Big Ten and No. 8, their highest ranking this late in the season since 2020. Pitino has St. John’s at 16-3, and the Red Storm have an early lead in the Big East with a 7-1 mark, the best conference start since 1998-99. Then there’s also Altman and Oregon, which went perfect in nonconference play, and its seven Quad 1 wins is second most in the country.

Jets hire Lions’ Aaron Glenn as head coach

The New York Jets have taken the first major step in getting their rebuild off the ground.

The team is hiring Detroit Lions defensive coordinator Aaron Glenn as its new head coach, per multiple reports.

Glenn, 52, held a second interview in person with the Jets on Tuesday, just three days after the Lions were eliminated in a divisional round playoff game, thereby freeing up the team’s assistants to be hired. He had been scheduled to have a second interview with the New Orleans Saints later this week, according to multiple reports.

Now, the former NFL cornerback will serve as the leader of the franchise for

which he played from 1994 to 2001, earning two of his three career Pro Bowl nods.

Glenn becomes the second Lions co-

ordinator to leave for a top job with another team this week after Ben Johnson agreed to terms on a deal with the Chicago Bears on Monday.

In Detroit, Glenn deployed an aggressive defense that managed to rank seventh in points allowed in 2024 despite a rash of personnel losses, with 12 players from the unit finishing the season on injured reserve.

His scheme that runs heavy on man coverage and blitzes should carry over to New York, which features top talent in cornerback Sauce Gardner and defensive tackle Quinnen Williams, among others. But despite ranking third in yards allowed for the second consecutive year, the defense finished 20th in points allowed, with the unit wavering after defensive coordinator Jeff Ulbrich

took over as interim coach after Robert Saleh was fired.

New York finished 5-12 in 2024, extending the league’s longest active postseason drought to 14 seasons.

The Jets are still without a general manager after firing Joe Douglas in November.

Perhaps the biggest question facing Glenn will be whether Aaron Rodgers is part of the team’s plans for 2025. The quarterback remains under contract but has acknowledged his future with the organization is uncertain.

“I think everybody understands that it’s going to come down to a GM and a coach and myself and whether we all want to do a dance together or if it’s not in the cards,” said Rodgers on “The Pat McAfee Show” last week.

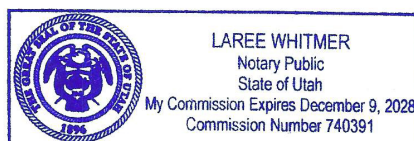
