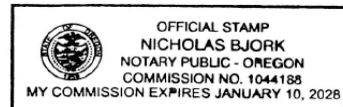

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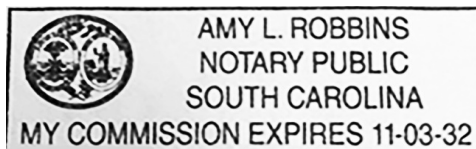
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Raiders hire Chip Kelly as new OC

The Las Vegas Raiders have made their final coordinator hire ahead of the 2025 NFL season.

Last week, the franchise hired Pete Carroll to take the role of head coach. Now, Carroll has a key position filled on staff: offensive coordinator.

Former Philadelphia Eagles and San Francisco 49ers head coach Chip Kelly will be the Raiders' next offensive coordinator, per multiple reports.

Kelly most recently held the offensive coordinator position with the Ohio State Buckeyes in the 2024 college football season. Ohio State won the college football playoff (CFP) this past season with him at the helm of the offense.

Kelly is the only new coordinator for the Raiders entering the 2025 NFL season. Defensive coordinator Patrick Graham and special teams coordinator Tom

McMahon were both retained for the coming season.

Prior to his season with Ohio State, Kelly served as the head coach of UCLA

from 2018 through 2023. The team went 35-34 in his six-season tenure and 1-1 in bowl games.

Kelly became an NFL coaching candidate following a successful stint with the Oregon Ducks football team, first as an offensive coordinator and then as a head coach. The Ducks went 46-7 from 2009 to 2012 with Kelly as head coach and made the national championship game in 2010.

Chip Kelly coaching record

Kelly spent four seasons as a head coach in the NFL, three with the Eagles and one with the 49ers.

Philadelphia Eagles (2013-15)

- Regular season record: 26-21.
 - Playoff record: 0-1.
- Kelly took over for Andy Reid in Philadelphia starting in the 2013 season. He

went 10-6 in back-to-back seasons with the Eagles and had a top-five scoring offense in 2013 and 2014.

The team dropped off in 2015 and Kelly was fired after Week 16 with the Eagles sitting at 6-9. The team hired Doug Pederson ahead of the 2016 season and won the Super Bowl a year later.

San Francisco 49ers (2016)

- Regular season record: 2-14.
- Playoff record: 0-0.

Kelly spent one year in San Francisco and started off with a shutout win in Week 1. The team then lost its next 12 games in a row and both Kelly and general manager Trent Baalke were fired after a 2-14 season.

Kelly took a year off from coaching before going to UCLA ahead of the 2018 college football season.

San Francisco hired Kyle Shanahan to replace Kelly.

Jared Goff, NFC defeat AFC to win Pro Bowl Games

Detroit Lions quarterback Jared Goff tossed three touchdowns and two defenders scored on interception returns Sunday as the NFC won the flag football game 56-50 and the overall competition 76-63 at the 2025 Pro Bowl Games in Orlando, Florida.

Goff completed 10 of 11 passes for 126 yards, while the Arizona Cardinals' Budda Baker and Minnesota Vikings' Byron Murphy each returned interceptions for touchdowns in the second half to end any AFC comeback chances.

The Tampa Bay Buccaneers' Baker Mayfield threw three touchdowns of his own, and New York Giants wide receiver Malik Nabers scored two TDs on five receptions.

The AFC was paced by the Pittsburgh Steelers' Russell Wilson, who tossed four touchdown passes in defeat.

Coming into the day, the NFC had a 14-7 lead on the overall scoreboard, winning Thursday's skills events competition.

The NFC increased its advantage and grabbed a 13-6 lead at the flag football game through one quarter of play. Goff threw touchdown passes to San Francisco 49ers fullback Kyle Juszczyk and Nabers.

Cincinnati quarterback Joe Burrow answered with a scoring toss to Bengals teammate Ja'Marr Chase, but Burrow was also picked off by the Lions' Brian Branch to close the first quarter.

Chase, the league's leader in catches, receiving yards and touchdowns, finished with five catches for 101 yards and three touchdowns.

The "punt perfect" event was held at

the quarter break, and Jacksonville's Logan Cooke won in a sudden death overtime, making his kick and watching the Lions' Jack Fox's effort bounce out. That gave the AFC a 3-0 win in that portion of the event, cutting the overall deficit to 27-16.

The NFC responded quickly, as Goff found Seattle Seahawks wide receiver Jaxon Smith-Njigba on a short route, and Smith-Njigba split the defense to score from 46 yards out.

The AFC looked in danger of falling even further behind before Marlon Humphrey of the Baltimore Ravens intercepted a pass by Minnesota's Sam

Oklahoma legend named to coach US Olympic softball team

Oklahoma women's softball coach Patty Gasso has been chosen to lead the U.S. national team as it prepares for the 2028 Summer Olympics in Los Angeles.

USA Softball, the sport's national governing body, announced Monday that Gasso – who has led the Sooners to eight national championships, including a fourth consecutive title in 2024 – has been selected as the U.S. Olympic team's head coach for the 2025-28 quadrennial cycle.

"It is truly a remarkable moment in my career and a dream come true to be asked to coach Team USA," Gasso said in a statement. "This is the highest honor I could ever receive, and I'm humbled

by and thankful for the confidence USA Softball has in me. I have an intense passion to make Team USA the best it can be to help win the gold medal in 2028."

Gasso has extensive experience with the U.S. women's national softball team through her participation in coaching various teams, as well as working with training camps and selection trials for the teams.

A National Fastpitch Coaches Association Hall of Fame inductee, Gasso begins her 31st season as the head coach of the Oklahoma softball program this week.

Gasso, 62, has a 1,515-352-2 career record at Oklahoma and is the Big 12 Conference's all-time winningest coach in any sport.

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Graham opens up on play retirement

NEW ORLEANS – Brandon Graham felt like Jerome Bettis. But unlike “The Bus,” the Philadelphia Eagles defensive lineman did not immediately retire after winning the Lombardi Trophy.

“I feel like Jerome Bettis the year he went out in Detroit,” Graham said outside of the Eagles locker room following his team’s 40-22 win over the Kansas City Chiefs in Super Bowl 59, referencing the ex-Pittsburgh Steelers running back’s retirement announcement in the aftermath of the team’s win in Super Bowl 40 after the 2005 season.

“I feel like getting a two-piece for Philly – it should be three, but it’s all good. I’ll take my two. I’m thankful. “I can’t wait to celebrate in Philly. This parade (is) about to be crazy.”

That sounded like someone on the verge of announcing his retirement, and the 2024 season had functioned as a farewell tour for the 15-year veteran Graham.

But a torn triceps suffered in Week 12

made a comeback for one last ride a possibility.

During his media appearances in New Orleans, Graham maintained he was focused on regaining his health to come back for the final game of this season before making any decision.

“I ain’t there yet. Just going to enjoy this,” Graham said. “Who knows? Howie (Roseman) might call me. But you know what? If it is my last one, it was hell of a way to go out. Too thankful. And I ain’t going nowhere. I’m going to be a part of the organization somehow.”

If Graham is done playing, he’s not technically leaving the Eagles. He’s an institution in Philadelphia at this point, the hero of Super Bowl 52 who strip-sacked Tom Brady in the final minutes to defeat the New England Patriots.

One potential landing spot is in the front office. Graham said he wants to learn from Roseman “as much as I can.”

“We got some special stuff going on. We got the special sauce,” Graham said. “I want to be a part of that. Even if I am done (playing), that’s why I ain’t done with this organization. I’m going to be here somehow some way.”

Eagles’ visit to White House if invited could be thorny

For the better part of two decades, winning the Super Bowl came with a certain celebratory cadence. Winning players smoked cigars and sprayed beer in the locker room. They popped bottles of champagne while parading through their cities. And then, eventually, they put on suits and visited the president at the White House.

The 2016 election of President Donald Trump, however, complicated that last ceremonial step. And now that he is back in office, the recently crowned Philadelphia Eagles will be the first NFL team to face the increasingly thorny prospect of a visit to the White House.

“I’d be honored to go, regardless of who the president is, but we’ll see,” Eagles offensive lineman Lane Johnson said Sunday night, according to Sportico. “It’s ultimately a team decision. I’ll do what’s best for the team.”

The tradition of visiting the White House was once seen as almost automatic for championship teams in major professional sports leagues, particularly the NFL. Between 2001 and 2016, all but one Super Bowl-winning team made the trip, shaking hands and taking photos with presidents of both parties.

During Trump’s first term, however, only one of the four Super Bowl-winning teams made a White House visit – at least in part because of the president’s verbal attacks on the league and players who kneeled during the national anthem to protest racial inequality. In 2018, he stunningly disinvited the Eagles on the eve of their scheduled trip, with then-White House press secretary Sarah Huckabee Sanders publicly ripping the organization as trying to pull “a political stunt.” (NFL Network reported that the Eagles had planned to send a contingent of fewer than 10 players to the ceremony. The White House instead hosted a brief, awkward event that it described as a celebration of America.)

Eagles spokespeople did not immediately reply to a message from USA TODAY Sports on Monday morning about whether the team has been invited to visit the White House after its most recent Super Bowl win or whether it would attend if invited. And owner Jeffrey Lurie demurred when asked about a hypothetical visit last week by Front Office Sports.

Such decisions are commonly made weeks, and sometimes months, after a Super Bowl victory. But since Trump was on hand at the Superdome to see the Eagles demolish the Kansas City Chiefs, the question is not going away. And regardless of where the organization lands, experts said it’s clear that the stakes of a White House visit have changed.

“I just think the politics of today are so polarized that whatever you do, you’re going to be perceived to be supporting a political platform or a position,” historian Frank Guridy said.

Guridy, the author of “The Stadium: An American History of Politics, Protest, and Play,” recalled a 1985 championship visit in which a notably progressive athlete, Kareem Abdul-Jabbar, met with a conservative president, Ronald Reagan. (“I’m not a Republican, but I am one of his constituents,” the Los Angeles Lakers legend said when presenting Reagan with a ceremonial jersey.)

Using sports as a cultural wedge

For so long, a championship team visiting the White House was seen as the default stance. And the only politicization of the ceremony came when a handful of athletes decided *not* to go, such as NFL player Matt Birk, who cited President Barack Obama’s support for Planned Parenthood as his reason for boycotting a 2013 trip.

“People were invested in a sense of

civility and respect in political culture, so even if you don’t agree with Ronald Reagan, you’ll show up with your team,” Guridy said. “That’s not the climate we’re in now.”

During Trump’s first term in office, championship teams’ visits to the White House were more sporadic and divided along lines of sport and gender. In a reversal of recent precedent, several championship teams in women’s sports did not receive invitations. And NBA teams, whose players are predominantly Black, either were not invited or declined to attend.

The NHL’s Florida Panthers are the only team to have visited the White House in the weeks since Trump’s return. At a ceremony last week, the president received a framed “Trump 45-47” jersey and repeatedly praised Panthers owner Vinnie Viola, who was Trump’s pick to be secretary of the Army for a brief period in 2016.

While sports and politics have always been intertwined, Guridy explained, a star athlete’s visit to the White House might now be seen as a tacit endorsement of the president’s policies in a way that it previously wasn’t.

Tom Knecht, a political science professor at Westmont College, thinks this

could be at least partly a reflection of the way Trump has approached sports while in office.

“Most presidents use sports as kind of a way to unify the nation – a way to talk about things that are certainly less divisive than, say, border policy or tariffs,” Knecht said. “And Trump is one of the few presidents that actually uses sports to kind of press a political advantage.”

In research published on his blog, Knecht analyzed and categorized the different ways that U.S. presidents since Teddy Roosevelt have talked about sports while in office. He found that while presidents most commonly use sports to ingratiate themselves with the American people or make sweeping points about American ideals, Trump has been more willing to use them as a cultural wedge or an avenue to a policy objective.

Last week, for example, Trump signed an executive order that attempts to ban the participation of transgender athletes in women’s sports as part of a broader attack on LGBTQ rights and initiatives supporting diversity, equity and inclusion.

Knecht believes that Trump’s politicization of sports means that teams and athletes will continue to face scrutiny around how they interact with him, White House visits included.

“It’s a double-edged sword,” Knecht said.

“How many times do you get to go visit the White House and represent your team? But also you have your own political values to think of.”

Political climate may permanently alter team visits

When asked about the long-term future of the traditional White House visit for championship teams, however, Knecht said he views the next four years as a time of temporary uncertainty.

Guridy, meanwhile, is not so sure. He sees Trump’s second term as the by-product of an increasingly win-at-all-costs political climate that will persist for decades to come – and perhaps alter or upend the ceremonial visits altogether.

“Maybe the White House visit continues, but it either peters out because it becomes too politically problematic for the president. Or it’ll be a situation where certain leagues align themselves with the administration and others won’t,” Guridy said.

“I don’t think it’s a blip. I really don’t. I hope it is. But I don’t think it is.”

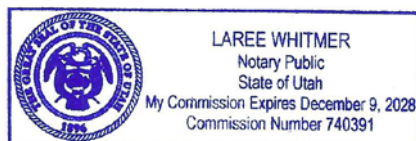
