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
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Campbell gets 'the bounce of a career'

Brian Campbell's journey to his first victory on the PGA Tour took so many twists and turns that it was only fitting that he finally caught a good break.

Playing the par-5 18th hole at Vidanta Vallarta on Sunday for the third time in an hour, Campbell benefited from a fortuitous bounce off his tee shot, which peeled right and was headed out of

"That was the bounce of a career," NBC's Notah Begay III said.

Campbell's ball spit out of the trees and bounced off the cart path and he took advantage.

The 31-year-old journeyman sank a 4-foot birdie putt on the second playoff hole to beat Aldrich Potgieter and win the Mexico Open at VidantaWorld. Asked how he finally made it to the winner's circle, Campbell needed just one word: "Grit."

That and a little bit of luck.

Campbell had never recorded a top-10 finish in 27 starts on the PGA Tour and was winless in 186 combined starts on the Tour and Korn Ferry Tour. With his tee shot in the playoff in the right rough, he set up a wedge in his wheelhouse and planted it 4 feet from the hole. After Potgieter's birdie effort slid by on the left, Campbell converted for the win.

Campbell shot a final-round 1-under 70 in Puerto Vallarta to post 20-under par 264 on a day when no one seemed to want to take home the trophy and winner's check for \$1.26 million.

"I thought I was going to throw up at multiple times during the day," he said.

The playoff set up as a matchup of opposites. It was The Prodigy vs. The Journeyman, Power vs. Grit and ended as one of those weeks where the snail hit the tape before the hare.

Campbell, a 31-year-old Illini product, had been the Big Ten Player of the Year in Amateur but had flamed out in his one trip to the PGA Tour in 2017. It took him eight years to get back and he admitted he had nearly given up.

"I almost stopped golfing about two years ago," said Campbell, who was in danger of flunking out of the second stage of PGA Tour Qualifying School after making a quadruple-bogey at a par 3. "Then somehow managed to fight back the next day and shoot a really nice number, got myself back in it enough to get to final stage. That led to last year and I had a really strong last year. It's crazy how quickly things can change."

In 2024 he notched three runner-up finishes on the Korn Ferry Tour to finish seventh on the money list and graduate back to the PGA Tour for the first time since the 2017-18 season. Of the chance to do battle with Potgieter in the final threesome, Campbell said, "It's what dreams are made of; this is why I've worked so hard to get back there."

Potgieter is raw and full of promise, which he showed with a course-record 61 on Friday. At age 20 years, 5 months, the South African was attempting to become the sixth-youngest to win on the PGA Tour since the start of the 1983 season. He already holds the distinction of being the youngest winner in the history of the Korn Ferry Tour at 19 years, 4 months and 11 days for his victory at the 2024 Bahamas Great Abaco Classic at The Abaco Club. When he won the 2022 British Amateur at Royal Lytham and St Annes, he became the second-youngest winner in the event's 127-year history at the age of

2014 and low amateur at the 2015 U.S. 17. Potgieter is the longest driver on the PGA Tour this season while Campbell ranked No. 182. This week, Potgieter only averaged 40 yards longer off the tee.

"It's hard to look at a guy next to you hitting it 60 to 80 yards past you, but you've really just got to stay focused on what you're there to do and do the best you can," Campbell said.

Trusting his strengths, Campbell ranked first in strokes gained: tee to green, second in SG: around the green and fourth in SG: approach.

Both Campbell and Potgieter, who shot a final-round even-par 71, made short birdies at 18 in regulation to edge Isaiah Salinda, who had been the leader in the clubhouse at 19 under after a bogey-free 65.

"To at least give myself a chance was all I wanted to do today. I thought honestly being however many back I was, like seven, I knew it was a long shot," Sa-

Potgieter struggled with his short game, making three of his four bogeys on the front nine. He tugged his second shot on the first playoff hole left and was lucky that Campbell missed his first chance for the win.

"I guess I just wanted to keep the party going a little longer, but not by design," Campbell said.

Potgieter still said he was proud of his

Christopher Bell wins wild Cup Series race


Christopher Bell rallied for an overtime win Sunday at Atlanta Motor Speedway, capturing the Ambetter Health 400 for his 10th career NASCAR Cup Series victory.

The Joe Gibbs Racing driver had started the race in 32nd place but found himself up front when the race restarted for a green-white-checkered finish. After dueling with Kyle Larson and then Carson Hocevar, who tried to make it three-wide up front, Bell won under caution after a multiple-car crash on the

'That right there is what you dream of," said Bell after he climbed out of his car on the track and received a kiss from his wife. "Throughout the beginning of the day, we were just stuck way in the back. But that last half of the race we were at our best."

After a review by NASCAR officials, Hocevar finished second, Larson third, pole winner Ryan Blaney fourth and Ricky Stenhouse Jr. fifth. Blaney had roared back up to the front after spinning with 27 laps remaining. The 2023 Cup Series champion avoided damage and remained on the lead lap after taking four fresh tires while most of the rest of the field remained on the track.

The race featured 50 lead changes,



of that until overtime. "This place is just

bonkers," Bell said. "Every time we come here, it gets wilder and wilder, and I never in my wildest dreams would

have thought I would have won a superspeedway race."

Sunday marked Hocevar's best finish in the NASCAR Cup Series, though the 22-year-old Spire Motorsports driver left some competitors incensed at his aggressive driving.

"There is some stuff I have to learn and clean up a little bit, but I feel like we put ourselves in the perfect opportunity to win the race," Hocevar said. "I have never had that opportunity really before, especially on a big superspeed-

The race went to overtime after two of the day's dominant cars crashed while racing in the top 3.

On lap 258, Austin Cindric got forced into the outside wall by Larson, who was trying to squeeze in front as the two battled for the lead. Cindric bounced off the wall and into Daytona 500 winner William Byron, who was following in third place. Both cars spun down the track and into the inside wall, bringing out a caution.

Carson Hocevar was The Show on Sunday, for better and for worse.

His daring moves and aggressiveness didn't make him a lot of friends, including Ryan Blaney, whose chance to win the Ambetter Health 400 NAS-CAR Cup Series race ended with a spin off of Hocevar's bumper with less than 20 laps to go. Hocevar also drew the ire of Kyle Busch at the end of stage 1 for a move that cost Busch spots.

But Hocevar, who drives for Spire Motorsports, did have a chance to win, shoving Christopher Bell to the lead into turn 3 on the final lap and wedging himself in between Bell and Kyle Larson before a caution ended the race.

Enemies made? Probably. Runnerup finish, the best of his Cup Series career? Also yes. Pack racing rewards the aggressive. (Until they crash.)

Winner: Michael McDowell

Michael McDowell's issues were under the radar near the end of the first stage. McDowell ended up six laps down after his Spire Motorsports team had to repair a power steering issue

during the stage caution after falling to last by lap 60. From there, he received the free pass six times, a mark NASCAR says is tied for the most. The best part of McDowell's day? He finished 13th after surging on the OT restart.

Loser: Brad Keselowski

Keselowski has started the season with a 26th-place finish at Daytona and Sunday's last-place finish. The driverowner of the No. 6 RFK Racing Ford was an innocent bystander caught up in an accident involving Chase Elliott and Ricky Stenhouse Jr. Stenhouse shot up the race track off of turn 4 after contact with Chase Briscoe, shoving Elliott into the wall. Elliott's suspension broke, and he spun down the tri-oval before collecting a slowing Keselowski.

Loser: Daniel Suarez

Last year's three-wide Atlanta race winner had a sterling track record on the Atlanta drafting configuration, but Sunday's race result stands out as a negative outlier. Suarez was involved in the lap 184 crash, getting the worst of a three-wide sandwich between Todd Gilliland, Ty Gibbs and himself. After three straight Atlanta finishes in the top two, Suarez finished 33rd on Sunday.

Joe Highsmith a cut above as winner

Joe Highsmith went from the cut line to the winner's circle.

The 24-year-old Highsmith shot a pair of 7-under 64s on the weekend at PGA National's Champion Course to win the 2025 Cognizant $\bar{\text{Classic}}$ in The Palm Beaches by two strokes and become the first player in nine years to make the cut on the number and hoist a tournament trophy two days later.

'That was the last thing I was expecting at the start of the day was a win," he said. "And then I had kind of a feeling coming down the stretch that I was playing really good and made no mistakes and I was like, 'Maybe I've got a chance.' I played probably the best round of my life, for sure."

Highsmith rolled in a 20-foot birdie at the water-laden par-317th on Sunday to cap off a bogey-free 64 in Palm Beach Gardens, Florida, and a two-stroke victory over Jacob Bridgeman and J.J. Spaun. Highsmith finished with a 72hole total of 19-under 265 to earn his first PGA Tour title.

Highsmith was in danger of missing the cut after a roller coaster second round that included a double bogey and two bogeys. "I was like, man, am I really going to miss the cut?" he recalled. But he snuck into the weekend by making a 5-foot par putt at 18 on Friday for rounds of 65-72 and trailed by eight strokes. Despite having what he described as "a really bad warm-up" before his third round, Highsmith caught fire on Saturday with the short stick, ranking first in the field in strokes gained: putting.

"I putted as good as I ever have before and then some for sure," he said after his third-round 64. "It was crazy to see all those putts drop."

In the final round, he made four birdies in a five-hole stretch beginning at the ninth. Highsmith wasn't the only one to earn his first victory on the PGA Tour. Joe LaCava Jr., whose father has carried for Fred Couples and Tiger Woods during wins at the Masters among other wins, was on the bag for Highsmith, a Pepperdine grad.

He was just happy not to have an early Sunday tee time. Last season he found his groove during the fall portion of the season, rallying from No. 160 in the FedExCup regular season to finish No. 110 in the FedExCup Fall standings and keep his playing privileges. He recorded two of his three top-10s in the fall and made 13 cuts in 26 starts. His claim to fame before his victory is becoming the first player on record (since 1983) to record three aces in a PGA Tour season. making a hole-in-one at The American Express, Rocket Mortgage Classic and Wyndham Championship.

Highsmith erased a four-stroke deficit heading into the final round. This tournament belonged to Jake Knapp, who had held the lead all week since shooting 59 on Thursday, until he hit into the hazard fronting the 11th green Sunday and needed two attempts to dislodge his ball from a half-submerged lie.

He made a triple-bogey 7 and failed to make another birdie. He shot 1-over 72 and finished T-6.

"Honestly, I think I played super solid. I mis-hit the one shot on 11 and that was kind of the only thing I'd really take back," he said. "I think other than that, I'll think about the 59, obviously, but it's not that that shot is going to haunt me or anything like that."

Bridgeman matched Highsmith with

64 for the low round of the day, recording his first career top-10 finish, and shared second with Spaun (66).

Highsmith became the first player to make the 36-hole cut on the number and win the tournament since Brandt Snedeker at the 2016 Farmers Insurance Open and just the sixth to do so since

Highsmith noted that his mother, who hit golf balls the day she was born, was scheduled to fly home at 3 p.m. "I was like, What if I'm 5 under after nine, mom?" Highsmith recounted. "I played great on the front (3 under) and I saw her on the 12th hole and thought, yeah, she canceled her flight. Really glad she

NBC's Kevin Kisner noted that Highsmith's mom had told him she was dressed for traveling and would have to change her outfit if she stayed. "Looks like she did," Kisner said.

The victory changes the rest of Highsmith's year. He jumped 113 spots to No. 10 in the FedExCup and is exempt for the next two seasons. He also earned a spot in next week's Arnold Palmer Invitational as well as the rest of the remaining signature events. But best of all, he will make his debut at the Masters in April.

"It is just like the most incredible place on earth," he said. "That tournament is going to be very special and something, obviously, you work towards your whole life but you never really know when you're going to get that chance."

NASCAR CUP SERIES COTA WINNERS AND LOSERS

Christopher Bell wins again with Texas victory

Christopher Bell outlasted William Byron and Tyler Reddick in an intense final 10 laps to win the EchoPark Automotive Grand Prix NASCAR Cup Series race at COTA on Sunday.

Bell passed Kyle Busch for the lead with six laps to go, then held off Byron and Reddick over the final laps with some superb defensive driving.

Bell has now won back-to-back races, and Sunday's victory was his third career win at a road course.

Busch led 42 laps, but his tires were used up on the final run and he fell back to a fifth-place finish.

Here are the winners and losers from Sunday's NASCAR Cup Series race at Circuit of the Americas just outside of Austin, Texas:

Winner: Chase Elliott and the No. 9 team

Sometime in the future, anyone who looks up Elliott's 2025 season race log will look up his COTA fourth-place finish and not be surprised by the result for one of the best road racers in the series.

But it wasn't nearly that easy, and Elliott's day was the most eventful in the

Elliott started third and was turned around on the first turn, spun by Ross

Chastain who inexplicably dive-bombed into the corner on the opening lap. Despite a toe-link issue in the left rear and poor track position, Elliott's team worked on the car throughout the af-

ternoon. For most of the first and second stages, Elliott ran outside the top 25. (Elliott started Stage 2 well off the back of the field after not getting caught up following an extra pit stop.)

Elliott drove up into the top 20 early in the third stage but had shown OK pace. Crew chief Alan Gustafson opted to pit from inside the top 20 during the final caution, allowing Elliott to unleash with fresher tires.

Elliott moved from 23rd to fourth in the final 13 laps, making for a good finish on a trying day.

Winner: Front Row Motorsports

Noah Gragson is not known for his road course racing ability; his best finish in the Cup Series at road courses coming into Sunday was 11th at Watkins Glen last season.

But Gragson led a strong day for Front Row Motorsports with an eighthplace finish, one of two top-10 finishes for FRM.

Todd Gilliland finished 10th after an up-and-down day, his third career top-10 finish on a road course, securing

that top-10 on a last-lap nudge and pass of Chastain.

Front Row Motorsports needed a good day after some poor finishes on the drafting tracks to open the season, and they got it on Sunday.

Loser: Trackhouse Racing

"Loser" is maybe too strong a word, but it will certainly be a bittersweet look back at what could have been at COTA for the four-car Trackhouse Racing

Shane van Gisbergen controlled the majority of the first two stages, showing strength with long-run speed and opting to play strategy and pit before the end of the stages. Because of that, SVG and the No. 88 team opted against picking up points for the long-term vantage point of winning the race.

Instead, SVG got stacked up during a restart early in the third stage and slid outside the top five. He couldn't fully recover after staying out on older tires on the next-to-last run in reaction to track position and finished sixth. While the finish was solid, SVG only has four more road course races to secure a playoff spot. Expectations are high for him with this type of racing, and the margin of error will tighten up with every road race he does not win in 2025.

Throwing back to that restart in which van Gisbergen slipped outside the top five: The restart occurred after the first non-stage end caution of the day involving Trackhouse drivers Daniel Suarez and Connor Zilisch. Suarez spun around a corner, and Zilisch hit Suarez in the right rear as Zilisch tried to avoid his teammate.

Zilisch's day started with a first lap cut tire and ended with the lap 50 crash. In between, he was one of the fastest cars on the track and moved up into the top 15 in Stage 2. Had he stayed out of trouble, Zilisch would have been in contention in his first Cup Series start.

Chastain, after the first-lap dive into turn 1 that spun Elliott, had an otherwise quiet 12th-place finish.

So it wasn't all bad for Trackhouse. But it could have been much, much bet-

Three former road course winners for Hendrick Motorsports all were involved in incidents that negatively impacted their days, but only Kyle Larson could not recover.

Larson's day had a major setback with two laps to go in Stage 2 when his right-front wheel came off the car right after a late-stage pit stop. Larson had to serve a two-lap penalty and never recovered, finishing 32nd.

Elliott (Lap 1 spin) and Alex Bowman (multiple track limit penalties and a spin) recovered from their issues for top-10 finishes. Larson could not.


