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
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

Larson wins second Cup Series crown

Kyle Larson, long described as one of the best wheelmen in motorsports, is now a two-time NASCAR champion.

Larson, 33, outdueled title contenders Denny Hamlin, Chase Briscoe and William Byron to win the NASCAR Cup Series championship Sunday Nov. 2 at Phoenix Raceway, the same track where he captured his first title in 2021.

The Hendrick Motorsports driver, who started third, also finished third in the No. 5 Chevrolet behind race winner Ryan Blaney, who notched his fourth win of the 2025 season with the overtime victory following a late-race caution for Byron's flat tire. Brad Keselowski finished second.

But Larson's result was enough to deliver a championship in a format in which four drivers go head-to-head in

the final race and the best finish wins.

Larson also joined elite company, becoming the third Hendrick driver to win multiple championships. The others are Hall of Famers and two of the best in auto racing history: seven-time champion Jimmie Johnson and four-time champion Jeff Gordon.

After climbing out of his car, Larson immediately embraced his wife and team owner Rick Hendrick and celebrated with his children.

"Honestly, I really can't believe it. Like we didn't lead a lap today and somehow still won the championship," a stunned and exhausted Larson said in an interview with NBC. "Really I'm just speechless; I can't believe it. We had an average car at best ... We got lucky there with that final caution. I was really hop-

ing we were going to take two (tires) again because I felt like I learned a lot on the previous restart."

Hamlin finished sixth but was just three laps from winning his first championship after 20 full-time seasons in the Cup Series. The 44-year-old had the dominant car all day, leading 208 laps, and was cruising to the race win and the title when the caution flag came out as Byron crashed into the wall with a flat right front tire in Turn 4.

Larson was among a handful of drivers who took just two tires on the caution ahead of the overtime restart, while Hamlin took four. That allowed Larson to restart five spots ahead of Hamlin for the two-lap overtime sprint.

Hamlin was circumspect but clearly dejected in an interview with NBC after the one item missing from his Hall of Fame résumé slipped away.

"Nothing I could do different. I mean I

prepared as good as I could coming into the weekend. My team gave me a fantastic car. It just didn't work out," Hamlin said. "I was just praying for no caution, and we had one there. What can you do. It's just not meant to be.

"The team did a fantastic job. They prepared a championship car; it just didn't happen."

Briscoe finished 18th and Byron 33rd in what could be the final season of the one-race championship or even 10-race elimination playoff format.

While Larson celebrated his championship, Blaney also got to celebrate winning the final race of the season.

"It's just cool to end it on a good note. It's just cool and obviously we had a fast car all day," Blaney said. "I'm just really proud of the whole group and cool to end it in victory lane. It's a shame we weren't in the Championship 4. Congrats to Kyle and that whole team."

NHL POWER RANKINGS

2024-25 non-playoff teams surprise early

USA TODAY Sports' NHL points projections saw pretty much the status quo from the 2024-25 playoff field.

The Utah Mammoth would replace the St. Louis Blues in the Western Conference and the Columbus Blue Jackets would replace the Montreal Canadiens in the Eastern Conference.

But in the early going – emphasis on early – the changeover is potentially more drastic. The Mammoth are looking great. The Pittsburgh Penguins, Detroit Red Wings and Anaheim Ducks are better than expected. The Blues and Minnesota Wild aren't.

The latest USA TODAY Sports NHL power rankings (change from preseason rankings are in parentheses; statistics and streaks through Nov. 2):

1. Colorado Avalanche (+7)

Martin Necas is off to a strong start and received an eight-year, \$92 million contract extension. The Avalanche ended the Devils' eight-game winning streak and downed the Golden Knights before falling to the Sharks.

2. Winnipeg Jets (+4)

Mark Scheifele has passed Blake Wheeler as the franchise all-time points leader and is the NHL's top scorer this season. The reigning Presidents' Trophy winners are starting strong again.

3. Montreal Canadiens (+17)

Cole Caufield, who wasn't part of the 4 Nations Face-Off, is putting himself in the mix for the U.S. Olympic team with 10 goals in his first 12 games.

4. Vegas Golden Knights (-2)

Jack Eichel is putting up MVP-worthy numbers, helping the Golden Knights through some injuries, including to Mark Stone. The often-injured Stone is week-to-week.

5. New Jersey Devils (+6)

Jack Hughes is healthy and has 10 goals. He helped the Devils win eight in a row, though the team is in a 1-3 slide.

6. Pittsburgh Penguins (+22)

They're the biggest surprise of the early season. Sidney Crosby remains ageless, and Evgeni Malkin is joining him in that category with 18 points in 13 games at age 39. They'll have to cope without injured Rickard Rakell.

7. Utah Mammoth (+8)

Utah put together a seven-game winning streak this season after introducing their new mascot. They're a deeper team that's coming together. Logan Cooley received an eight-year extension.

8. Detroit Red Wings (+17)

The YzerPlan seems to be working. General manager Steve Yzerman has brought in many pieces over the years, but the key is that captain Dylan Larkin is on pace for his best season.

9. Carolina Hurricanes (-4)

The Hurricanes won their first five games without a point from free agent signee Nikolaj Ehlers. Injuries on the blue line have dropped them a little and Ehlers is still seeking his first goal with Carolina.

10. Anaheim Ducks (+12)

GM Pat Verbeek hired coach Joel Quenneville to make a push toward a playoff spot. They were leading the Pacific Division on Nov. 2.

11. Dallas Stars (-10)

They opened 3-0 before the injuries started piling up. Jamie Benn (collapsed lung) hasn't played all season, and Roope Hintz and Matt Duchene have missed time. Still, they have points in their past six games.

12. Edmonton Oilers (-9)

Connor McDavid went the first six games without a goal and Evan Bouchard went the same number of games without a point. But they have picked it up, including Bouchard's overtime goal on Nov. 1.

13. Tampa Bay Lightning (-7)

The 1-4-2 start was one of the season's big puzzles. But the team has turned it around with five wins in a row.

14. Seattle Kraken (+15)

The Kraken, who have made the playoffs once in their history, were sitting in a wild-card spot on Nov. 2.

15. Columbus Blue Jackets (+2)

The Blue Jackets were sitting in a wild-card spot on Nov. 2. They'll need to improve on their special teams to stay there.

16. New York Rangers (+3)

Maybe the Rangers need to spend the rest of the season on the road. They're 6-1-1 away from Madison Square Garden and 0-4-1 at home, scoring one goal in their first four games there.

17. Florida Panthers (-13)

The Panthers are above .500, not bad considering the major injuries they're going through.

18. Washington Capitals (-9)

Alex Ovechkin needed three goals entering the season to reach 900. He still hasn't reached it after 12 games and has a 7.4 shooting percentage.

19. New York Islanders (+4)

Defenseman Matthew Schaefer, 18, picked up a point in his first six NHL games and was named rookie of the month for October. He's off to a good start for the November award with a two-goal game on Nov. 2.

20. Toronto Maple Leafs (-10)

Mitch Marner left in free agency and William Nylander has missed time with injury. That's a lot of offense to make up.

21. Buffalo Sabres (+3)

Sabres fans were chanting for general manager Kevyn Adams' firing after a 0-3 start. Those chants have vanished now that they're over .500.

22. Philadelphia Flyers (+5)

GM Daniel Briere's offseason moves are paying off. Trevor Zegras is leading the team in scoring and Dan Vladar has been the better of the two netminders.

23. Chicago Blackhawks (+9)

The Blackhawks are more competitive this season. Connor Bedard and Frank Nazar make them fun to watch and goalie Spencer Knight is doing his part while being kept very busy.

24. Los Angeles Kings (-11)

Captain Anze Kopitar's final NHL season isn't off to a good start. He missed four games with a foot injury and is still seeking his first goal.

25. Ottawa Senators (-11)

Brady Tkachuk is out at least until Thanksgiving after thumb surgery.



Center Evgeni Malkin is leading the Penguins in scoring at age 39.

Shane Pinto and Drake Batherson are helping pick up the slack.

26. Boston Bruins (-2)

Which team are they? The one that opened 3-0? The one that lost six in a row? Or the one that has won its past three?

27. Vancouver Canucks (-9)

Kiefer Sherwood is among the leaders in hits again this season. The big difference: The pending free agent also has scored nine goals.

28. Nashville Predators (+2)

Defenseman Roman Josi, who suffered an upper-body injury on Oct. 23, has been placed on injured reserve.

29. Minnesota Wild (-17)

The Kirill Kaprizov-led power play has been in the top five. But the Wild are at or near the bottom in penalty killing and 5-on-5 play.

30. San Jose Sharks (+1)

No sophomore slump for Macklin Celebrini, who is among the NHL's top scorers. After a rough start, the Sharks have won three of their past five games.

31. St. Louis Blues (-15)

The Blues have been plagued by poor goaltending numbers and injuries to Robert Thomas and Jake Neighbours.

32. Calgary Flames (-11)

The Flames are the NHL's most disappointing team. After missing the playoffs on a tiebreaker, they didn't do too much to address their scoring woes. They're last in goal per game and are in the hunt for better draft lottery odds in the Gavin McKenna sweepstakes.

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PAUL TAGLIABUE 1940-2025

Legacy included a passionate embrace of diversity

When the call came in, Art Shell was as shocked as anyone.

After Paul Tagliabue was finally elected to the Pro Football Hall of Fame in early 2020 as part of its centennial class, the former NFL commissioner asked Shell for a favor.

Tagliabue wanted Shell to present him for his induction in Canton.

"Of course, when he asked me, it was easy to say yes. My goodness," Shell told USA TODAY Sports on Nov. 9, after Tagliabue's family announced that he died at his home in Chevy Chase, Maryland, from congestive heart failure related to complications from Parkinson's disease.

Survived by his wife, Chan, and children Drew and Emily, Tagliabue was 84.


"I hung up that phone and, like for days, a million things go through your mind," Shell continued. "What am I going to say? Just be yourself. Just be who Paul knows you to be, and things will work out. As I sat down and thought about it, it was, what a great honor to do this."

The choice of a presenter is one of the most symbolic and delicate decisions by a newly elected Hall of Famer. Typically, coaches, team owners, teammates, family members or close friends get the nod. Walter Payton chose his son, Jarrett. Jim Kelly chose his Bills coach, Marv Levy. Deion Sanders went with his classy agent, Eugene Parker. The late Al Davis presented nine Hall of Famers – more than anyone.

In opting for Shell, a Hall of Fame player and former coach who had worked as a senior executive at NFL headquarters, Tagliabue was so intentional in making a statement.

Tagliabue, who served as a lawyer for the NFL before becoming commissioner in 1989, told me during an extended interview in 2021 that he chose Shell as his presenter because he wanted to pay homage to Black coaches and to the impact that HBCU institutions had on the evolution of the NFL. Shell, who starred at Maryland Eastern Shore before embarking on his career as a Hall of Fame tackle with the Raiders, became the NFL's first modern-era African American coach in 1989.

While Shell doesn't question Tagliabue's authenticity when it came to progressiveness on matters of race and equality – the NFL established the Rooney Rule during Tagliabue's 17-year tenure as commissioner and he led the NFL's decision to move a Super Bowl

from Arizona until the state recognized the holiday honoring Martin Luther King Jr. – he suspects that in some respects he was the second choice to be the presenter.

"I guarantee you one thing: If the big guy was alive, that's who he would have selected," Shell maintained. "He loved Gene."

The big guy, Gene Upshaw, teamed with Shell to anchor an offensive line that won three Super Bowls during the 1970s and early '80s. Then, as executive director of the NFL Players Association (NFLPA), Upshaw ultimately teamed with Tagliabue to ensure a then-unprecedented, extended era of labor peace (after the NFLPA won free agency in federal court in 1993). Upshaw died in 2008.

"His friendship with Gene was big time," Shell said. "He deferred to Gene most of the time because of the respect he had for him as a man. He enjoyed him as a player, but also as a man that he could sit down and talk to. And Gene thought he was great."

In 2021, I asked Tagliabue how he might have handled the controversy with Colin Kaepernick, who was essentially banished from the NFL after igniting national anthem protests in 2016 to protest the killings of unarmed African

Americans by police.

"It's easy to say I would have done it differently, but I don't know," Tagliabue told USA TODAY Sports. "I guess the way I think about it is that if Gene were alone and we were dealing with it together, we would have figured out some way to solve the problem."

That visit with Tagliabue, weeks before the induction ceremony (pushed into 2021 because the pandemic canceled ceremonies in 2020), was striking on several levels. While in the early stages of Parkinson's, he was well enough to drive himself to the waterfront restaurant, Fiola Mare, that he selected for us to meet near Georgetown.

And he was so candid, even as he defended some of his actions in dealing with the issue – the NFL's burgeoning concussion crisis – that undoubtedly delayed his induction into the Hall of Fame for more than 15 years after he left the commissioner's post in 2006.

Regardless, his legacy is complete. Tagliabue, a consensus-builder who ultimately lost patience with that role in dealing with NFL owners, presided over enormous growth in the NFL (which is still growing), bolstered by the labor peace. He had a strong influence in the commitment to keep the Saints in New Orleans following Hurricane Katrina

(and a year of displacement), brokered an agreement to keep the Browns name and trademarks in Cleveland after Art Modell moved his franchise to Baltimore. He also collaborated with Upshaw in navigating the crisis of 9/11 and the aftermath.

Another significant moment came after he left the commissioner's post, when his successor, Roger Goodell, selected him as the arbitrator in the appeal of player discipline from the Saints "Bountygate" scandal in 2012 – much to the chagrin of the NFLPA and attorneys for the players.

Then came the verdict. There was no rubber-stamp of Goodell's ruling. Tagliabue vacated the suspensions.

It was another example of how principles and independent thinking often drove the big decisions for Tagliabue. That's probably one reason the NFL didn't have a franchise in Las Vegas – until long after it had a different commissioner, and maybe more substantially, after a Supreme Court ruling led to legalized sports betting in more than half of the states.

Tagliabue worried that, even with technology that aids in surveillance, the NFL would be vulnerable amid a more robust gambling environment. The NFL and its teams have embraced the gambling industry yet avoided a major scandal. At least so far.

"I still worry about some young guy ... and somebody says to him, 'Take the money,'" Tagliabue said in 2021.

His position against sports gambling was hardened decades ago. In 1961, Tagliabue, a center at Georgetown, played in a game that was fixed.

"We beat the hell out of NYU," Tagliabue reflected. "It was the biggest victory in my three years of basketball at Georgetown. Turns out that guys at NYU were taking money to shave points."


Shell doesn't hesitate to vouch for Tagliabue's heart. When he began working for the NFL in 2002, first as an appeals officer for player discipline, then as senior vice president of football operations, Upshaw described Tagliabue to Shell as "tough ... but fair."

Shell found that out for himself – and more.

"Paul would reach out to the group (of staff) and he'd come to me on some things," Shell said. "And he'd listen. In the long run, he'd come up with what he thought was the right answer for everybody involved. But he'd try to make sure that he got the main people to understand this is the reason we need to go with a particular problem, and it'll be good for us."

One journey: Vietnam to Olympic gold

In honor of Veterans Day, "American Valor: A Salute to Our Heroes" highlights some of the nation's top veterans.

The Veterans Day television special will air on Saturday Nov. 15. One of the feature stories, narrated by longtime baseball announcer Joe Buck, is about the fascinating journey of U.S. Army Capt. Melvin Pender Jr.

Pender's unique path went from a Vietnam battlefield to Olympic gold medalist.

Pender was an officer with the Army's 82nd Airborne Division. While Pender played halfback for the unit's football team, it was discovered he possessed world-class speed.

Pender's untapped potential afforded him the opportunity to be sent back

stateside to train as a sprinter with the goal of making the U.S. Olympic Team in 1964.

Pender made the team, but he was hampered by a hamstring injury. He eventually finished fourth in the 100 meters at the Tokyo Games.

At the age of 27, Pender thought his Olympic dreams were over. He was deployed to the Mekong Delta of South Vietnam, seeing combat with the 9th Infantry Division.

However, in 1968 Pender was summoned from South Vietnam back to track and field to compete in the 1968 Mexico City Olympics. Pender returned to the Olympic Village at 30 years old.

Pender qualified for the 100 final and finished sixth as American teammate Jim Hines ran a world-record time of 9.9 seconds to become the first man in history to run sub-10 seconds.

A few days later, Tommie Smith and John Carlos famously raised their black-gloved fist on the Olympic podium to bring attention to human rights issues and racial injustice in the U.S. after Smith and Carlos finished first and third, respectively, in the 200.

On the final day of competition, Pender was on the track again as the second leg of Team USA's 4x100-relay team. With Pender at second leg and Hines as the anchor, the U.S. team cruised and crossed the finish line in what was a world-record time of 38.24.

"A career defined by excellence with each step he took," Buck said of Pender in the narrated segment.

Pender, the Olympic gold medalist and veteran, is now 88 years old. His remarkable journey of perseverance and patriotism can be watched at www.usatoday.com/sports.






