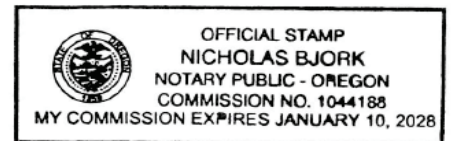

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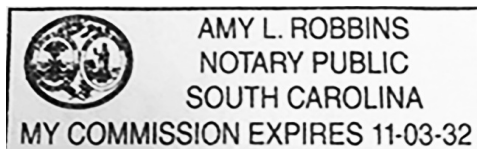

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Joe Highsmith a cut above as winner

Joe Highsmith went from the cut line to the winner’s circle.

The 24-year-old Highsmith shot a pair of 7-under 64s on the weekend at PGA National’s Champion Course to win the 2025 Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches by two strokes and become the first player in nine years to make the cut on the number and hoist a tournament trophy two days later.

“That was the last thing I was expecting at the start of the day was a win,” he said. “And then I had kind of a feeling coming down the stretch that I was playing really good and made no mistakes and I was like, ‘Maybe I’ve got a chance.’ I played probably the best round of my life, for sure.”

Highsmith rolled in a 20-foot birdie at the water-laden par-317th on Sunday to cap off a bogey-free 64 in Palm Beach Gardens, Florida, and a two-stroke victory over Jacob Bridgeman and J.J. Spaun. Highsmith finished with a 72-hole total of 19-under 265 to earn his first PGA Tour title.

Highsmith was in danger of missing the cut after a roller coaster second round that included a double bogey and two bogeys. “I was like, man, am I really going to miss the cut?” he recalled. But he snuck into the weekend by making a 5-foot par putt at 18 on Friday for rounds of 65-72 and trailed by eight strokes. Despite having what he described as “a really bad warm-up” before his third

round, Highsmith caught fire on Saturday with the short stick, ranking first in the field in strokes gained: putting.

“I putted as good as I ever have before and then some for sure,” he said after his third-round 64. “It was crazy to see all those putts drop.”

In the final round, he made four birdies in a five-hole stretch beginning at the ninth. Highsmith wasn’t the only one to earn his first victory on the PGA Tour. Joe LaCava Jr., whose father has carried for Fred Couples and Tiger Woods during wins at the Masters among other wins, was on the bag for Highsmith, a Pepperdine grad.

He was just happy not to have an early Sunday tee time. Last season he found his groove during the fall portion of the season, rallying from No. 160 in the FedExCup regular season to finish No. 110 in the FedExCup Fall standings and keep his playing privileges. He recorded two of his three top-10s in the fall and made 13 cuts in 26 starts. His claim to fame before his victory is becoming the first player on record (since 1983) to record three aces in a PGA Tour season, making a hole-in-one at The American Express, Rocket Mortgage Classic and Wyndham Championship.

Highsmith erased a four-stroke deficit heading into the final round. This tournament belonged to Jake Knapp, who had held the lead all week since shooting 59 on Thursday, until he hit into the hazard fronting the 11th green Sunday and needed two attempts to dislodge his ball from a half-submerged lie.

He made a triple-bogey 7 and failed to make another birdie. He shot 1-over 72 and finished T-6.

“Honestly, I think I played super solid. I mis-hit the one shot on 11 and that was kind of the only thing I’d really take back,” he said. “I think other than that, I’ll think about the 59, obviously, but it’s not that that shot is going to haunt me or anything like that.”

Bridgeman matched Highsmith with

64 for the low round of the day, recording his first career top-10 finish, and shared second with Spaun (66).

Highsmith became the first player to make the 36-hole cut on the number and win the tournament since Brandt Snedeker at the 2016 Farmers Insurance Open and just the sixth to do so since 2003.

Highsmith noted that his mother, who hit golf balls the day she was born, was scheduled to fly home at 3 p.m. “I was like, What if I’m 5 under after nine, mom?” Highsmith recounted. “I played great on the front (3 under) and I saw her on the 12th hole and thought, yeah, she canceled her flight. Really glad she stayed.”

NBC’s Kevin Kisner noted that Highsmith’s mom had told him she was dressed for traveling and would have to change her outfit if she stayed. “Looks like she did,” Kisner said.

The victory changes the rest of Highsmith’s year. He jumped 113 spots to No. 10 in the FedExCup and is exempt for the next two seasons. He also earned a spot in next week’s Arnold Palmer Invitational as well as the rest of the remaining signature events. But best of all, he will make his debut at the Masters in April.

“It is just like the most incredible place on earth,” he said. “That tournament is going to be very special and something, obviously, you work towards your whole life but you never really know when you’re going to get that chance.”

NASCAR CUP SERIES COTA WINNERS AND LOSERS

Christopher Bell wins again with Texas victory

Christopher Bell outlasted William Byron and Tyler Reddick in an intense final 10 laps to win the EchoPark Automotive Grand Prix NASCAR Cup Series race at COTA on Sunday.

Bell passed Kyle Busch for the lead with six laps to go, then held off Byron and Reddick over the final laps with some superb defensive driving.

Bell has now won back-to-back races, and Sunday’s victory was his third career win at a road course.

Busch led 42 laps, but his tires were used up on the final run and he fell back to a fifth-place finish.

Here are the winners and losers from Sunday’s NASCAR Cup Series race at Circuit of the Americas just outside of Austin, Texas:

Winner: Chase Elliott and the No. 9 team

Sometime in the future, anyone who looks up Elliott’s 2025 season race log will look up his COTA fourth-place finish and not be surprised by the result for one of the best road racers in the series.

But it wasn’t nearly that easy, and Elliott’s day was the most eventful in the field.

Elliott started third and was turned around on the first turn, spun by Ross

Chastain who inexplicably dive-bombed into the corner on the opening lap. Despite a toe-link issue in the left rear and poor track position, Elliott’s team worked on the car throughout the afternoon. For most of the first and second stages, Elliott ran outside the top 25. (Elliott started Stage 2 well off the back of the field after not getting caught up following an extra pit stop.)

Elliott drove up into the top 20 early in the third stage but had shown OK pace. Crew chief Alan Gustafson opted to pit from inside the top 20 during the final caution, allowing Elliott to unleash with fresher tires.

Elliott moved from 23rd to fourth in the final 13 laps, making for a good finish on a trying day.

Winner: Front Row Motorsports

Noah Gragson is not known for his road course racing ability; his best finish in the Cup Series at road courses coming into Sunday was 11th at Watkins Glen last season.

But Gragson led a strong day for Front Row Motorsports with an eighth-place finish, one of two top-10 finishes for FRM.

Todd Gilliland finished 10th after an up-and-down day, his third career top-10 finish on a road course, securing

that top-10 on a last-lap nudge and pass of Chastain.

Front Row Motorsports needed a good day after some poor finishes on the drafting tracks to open the season, and they got it on Sunday.

Loser: Trackhouse Racing

“Loser” is maybe too strong a word, but it will certainly be a bittersweet look back at what could have been at COTA for the four-car Trackhouse Racing team.

Shane van Gisbergen controlled the majority of the first two stages, showing strength with long-run speed and opting to play strategy and pit before the end of the stages. Because of that, SVG and the No. 88 team opted against picking up points for the long-term vantage point of winning the race.

Instead, SVG got stacked up during a restart early in the third stage and slid outside the top five. He couldn’t fully recover after staying out on older tires on the next-to-last run in reaction to track position and finished sixth. While the finish was solid, SVG only has four more road course races to secure a playoff spot. Expectations are high for him with this type of racing, and the margin of error will tighten up with every road race he does not win in 2025.

Throwing back to that restart in which van Gisbergen slipped outside the top five: The restart occurred after

the first non-stage end caution of the day involving Trackhouse drivers Daniel Suarez and Connor Zilisch. Suarez spun around a corner, and Zilisch hit Suarez in the right rear as Zilisch tried to avoid his teammate.

Zilisch’s day started with a first lap cut tire and ended with the lap 50 crash. In between, he was one of the fastest cars on the track and moved up into the top 15 in Stage 2. Had he stayed out of trouble, Zilisch would have been in contention in his first Cup Series start.

Chastain, after the first-lap dive into turn 1 that spun Elliott, had an otherwise quiet 12th-place finish.

So it wasn’t all bad for Trackhouse. But it could have been much, much better.

Loser: Kyle Larson

Three former road course winners for Hendrick Motorsports all were involved in incidents that negatively impacted their days, but only Kyle Larson could not recover.

Larson’s day had a major setback with two laps to go in Stage 2 when his right-front wheel came off the car right after a late-stage pit stop. Larson had to serve a two-lap penalty and never recovered, finishing 32nd.

Elliott (Lap 1 spin) and Alex Bowman (multiple track limit penalties and a spin) recovered from their issues for top-10 finishes. Larson could not.

PDVH is the sole shareholder and direct parent of CITGO Holding, Inc., which in turn is the sole shareholder and direct parent of CITGO Petroleum Corporation. In furtherance of the Court’s order, the Court appointed Robert B. Pincus as special master (the “Special Master”) on April 13, 2021 to assist the Court with the sale of the PDVH Shares. The Special Master is advised by Weil, Gotshal & Manges LLP as transaction counsel, and Evercore Group L.L.C. as investment banker.

On October 11, 2022, the Court entered an order (Docket No. 481) (the “**Sale Procedures Order**”) that (i) approved bidding procedures, substantially in the form attached to the Sale Procedures Order as **Exhibit 1** (the “**Bidding Procedures**”); (ii) authorized and approved the Notice Procedures for the Sale Hearing; and (iii) granted related relief.

On December 31, 2024, the Court entered an order (Docket No. 1517) (the “**Scheduling Order**”) that set a revised timeline and procedures for the sale of the PDVH Shares, including (i) setting forth the procedures for approval of (a) Bidder Protections that will be made available to any Stalking Horse approved by the Court, (b) material terms of a Stock Purchase Agreement and, subsequently, a long-form Stock Purchase Agreement, and (c) Evaluation Criteria for Stalking Horse Bids, Base Bids, and Successful Bids; (ii) setting forth procedures for amendments to the Sale Procedures Order and Bidding Procedures; (iii) setting deadlines for the submission of bids, the Special Master’s recommendations, and objections thereto; (iv) scheduling a Sale Hearing; and (v) granting related relief.

On January 27, 2025, the Court entered an order (Docket No. 1554) which adopted certain bidder protections and material terms to be included in the Stock Purchase Agreement.

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Big Ten champ UCLA women reclaim mojo

INDIANAPOLIS – The scene in UCLA’s locker room at halftime was a familiar one.

The Bruins had been out-toughed by their biggest rivals once again. Out-hustled. Out-scored. Six days after that heartfelt meeting they thought had answered their problems, they were seemingly right back where they started.

“I really wondered what their eyes were going to look like,” UCLA coach Cori Close said. “They were poised and determined. They knew they had not played their best, and they didn’t do the things we needed to do, but they still believed they could turn it around.

“I just said ... ‘How bad do you want it? What does this mean to you?’ They’re like, ‘We got you, Coach. We’re going to get this thing done.’ I guess I can believe them.”

The Bruins didn’t just get the Big Ten tournament title and the automatic bid that goes with it with their 72-67 win over Southern Cal on Sunday. They got their mojo back, just in time for the NCAA Tournament.

UCLA erased a 13-point, third-quarter deficit and held USC to 22 points in the second half. After a Kiki Iriafen jumper with 2:17 left in the third, the Bruins didn’t allow another field goal until JuJu Watkins’ jumper with 1:13 to play, a span of more than 11 minutes.

And while Watkins made things interesting with a 3-pointer and a layup in the last 11 seconds, UCLA mostly stifled the national Player of the Year favorite. Watkins finished with 29 points, but it was on 9 of 28 shooting. She only got to the foul line once in the second half.

Lauren Betts, meanwhile, was fearsome. She had 13 of her team-high 17 points in the second half, when she out-bodied the Trojans on seemingly every possession. She also had three of her four blocks over the final 20 minutes, including one on what looked to be a gimme layup by Watkins.

“Hustle and fight. I think that’s what we lacked the first two times we played them and that’s what we brought in the second half today when we came back and won,” said Kiki Rice, who had five of her 13 points in the second half despite picking up her third foul less than two minutes into the third quarter.

UCLA was the unquestioned best team in the country for much of the season. The Bruins won their first 23 games, all but one of them by double digits. They routed then-No. 1 South Carolina in nonconference play and needed no adjustment period when

they started their first season in the Big Ten.

But rivals are rivals for a reason, and USC was always going to be UCLA’s truest test. It was one the Bruins failed miserably. Twice.

Watkins had a monster game in the first meeting, tagging the Bruins for 38 points, 11 rebounds and eight – eight! – blocks. She “only” had 30 points in the rematch March 1, but the result was even more dispiriting because of how lackluster UCLA was down the stretch.

Close called out her team after the game, questioning its toughness. Last Monday morning, Rice and Gabriela Jaquez called a players-only film session where the Bruins were brutally honest about their shortcomings and promised each other they wouldn’t allow them to happen again.

That they found themselves in a familiar position Sunday night, but this time found a way to claw their way out of it, can pay dividends long after the confetti has been cleaned up and their Big Ten championship hats have been put away.

“We still have a lot of work to do,” said Londynn Jones, who stayed on the floor even after picking up her fourth foul with 6:22 left in the third quarter. “But this does build confidence. We know what we can do.

“We always believed what we can do,” she added, “but it was a matter of showing it. We did that tonight.”

That means as much as any win, any title.

Given the opponent Sunday and what comes next, maybe even more.

RIISING Texas Tech

Current projected seed: No. 2

The Red Raiders have climbed up to the No. 2 line after closing out the regular season in dominant fashion. They went into Allen Fieldhouse and were able to hold off a desperate Kansas team for the second ever road win against the Jayhawks. Then Texas Tech handled business against Colorado and Arizona State to finish second in the Big 12. It’s hard to deny the resume with an impressive No. 7 ranking in the NET and eight Quad 1 wins, the second most in the Big 12. The conference tournament will be a great chance to reassure the program’s first No. 2 seed.

Brigham Young

Current projected seed: No. 5

Not many teams have had a better month than the Cougars. On Feb. 11 they were projected to miss the tournament, and they haven’t lost since. BYU closed the regular season with eight consecutive wins, but what’s more important is that five were Quad 1 victories. The No. 4 team in the Big 12 tournament, a possible semifinal matchup against Houston could be another big boost.

Illinois

Current projected seed: No. 6

Once looking like a possible double-digit seed, Illinois has found its rhythm again to not only assure its spot in the field, but get a much favorable matchup

in the first round. The beatdown from Duke seemed to light a spark as Illinois won three straight, including dominating Michigan on the road and ending the game against Purdue on a 16-3 run for a come-from-behind win. The Fighting Illini do have a good NET ranking (No. 15) and the eight Quad 1 wins are excellent. They look to be playing some of their best basketball and are a threat in the Big Ten tournament.

Arkansas

Current projected seed: No. 10

Credit Arkansas for regrouping after it lost to South Carolina. The Razorbacks responded strong with a road win at a hot Vanderbilt team and then held on in a thriller against Mississippi State. One Quad 1 and Quad 2 win each now moves Arkansas away from the bubble and it should be feeling good about its

tournament chances. The Razorbacks will face South Carolina in the opening round. A revenge win should secure a spot in the field and allow them to push higher with more wins in Nashville.

Oklahoma

Current projected seed: No. 11

It’s been a roller coaster, but Oklahoma finds itself riding high into the conference tournament with two big-time victories to close out the regular season. After suffering six losses in their last seven games heading into the week, the Sooners beat Missouri and then went on the road Saturday and beat rival Texas. Oklahoma is back in the projected field. It’s not entirely secure yet, but Oklahoma will ride momentum into the SEC tournament as the No. 14 seed. The first-round matchup against Georgia is critical to ensuring it stays in the bracket.

FALLING Arizona

Current projected seed: No. 5

It was a really strong start to the first season in the Big 12, but the Wildcats ran into the gauntlet of the schedule and inconsistent play has pushed Arizona out of the top 16. It didn’t suffer a devastating loss, yet it closed the regular season 3-5 and showed it isn’t at the elite tier of championship contenders. It’s hard to argue an 11-loss team getting a No. 4 seed. There is a chance for the Wildcats to pad their resume as the No. 3 team in the Big 12 tournament.

Michigan

Current projected seed: No. 6

The honeymoon period of the Dusty May hiring is over. Michigan was beaten soundly in its last three games, losing badly to Illinois and Maryland at home and getting walked all over by Michigan State in the regular-season finale. The 9-7 Quad 1 record is significant, but the Wolverines were hoping to add a 10th

win to it. They have fallen from the No. 3 seed projection three weeks ago, and Michigan can’t afford a one-and-done appearance in the conference tournament to have any hope of climbing back.

Missouri

Current projected seed: No. 6

After beating Alabama a few weeks ago, Missouri had a case to be a top 16 team with a 6-6 Quad 1 mark. Instead the Tigers stumbled with four losses in the past five games and failing to add another signature win. Kentucky controlled much of Saturday’s contest in Columbia as defense has become a major concern in recent weeks for Dennis Gates’ team, allowing at least 90 points in its past four losses.

Marquette

Current projected seed: No. 7

The opportunities were right there for Marquette, it just wasn’t able to show it can beat quality teams. The record is good, but the Golden Eagles went 2-6 against the top four Big East teams, capped off by the gut-wrenching finish against St. John’s on Saturday. Marquette lost its last five Quad 1 chances, ended the season 4-6 and needs to finish well in the Big East tournament. It was projected a No. 2 seed at the end of January.

Virginia Commonwealth

Current projected seed: No. 11

It’s now likely win the Atlantic 10 tournament title or bust for Virginia Commonwealth as an at-large bid seems to be out of the cards despite the 25 wins. The Rams almost pulled off a stunning last-second comeback against Dayton in the regular-season finale, but the loss took away their margin of error. With only three Quad 1 games on the resume, VCU doesn’t have the schedule strength to absorb another loss, despite a NET ranking of 31.

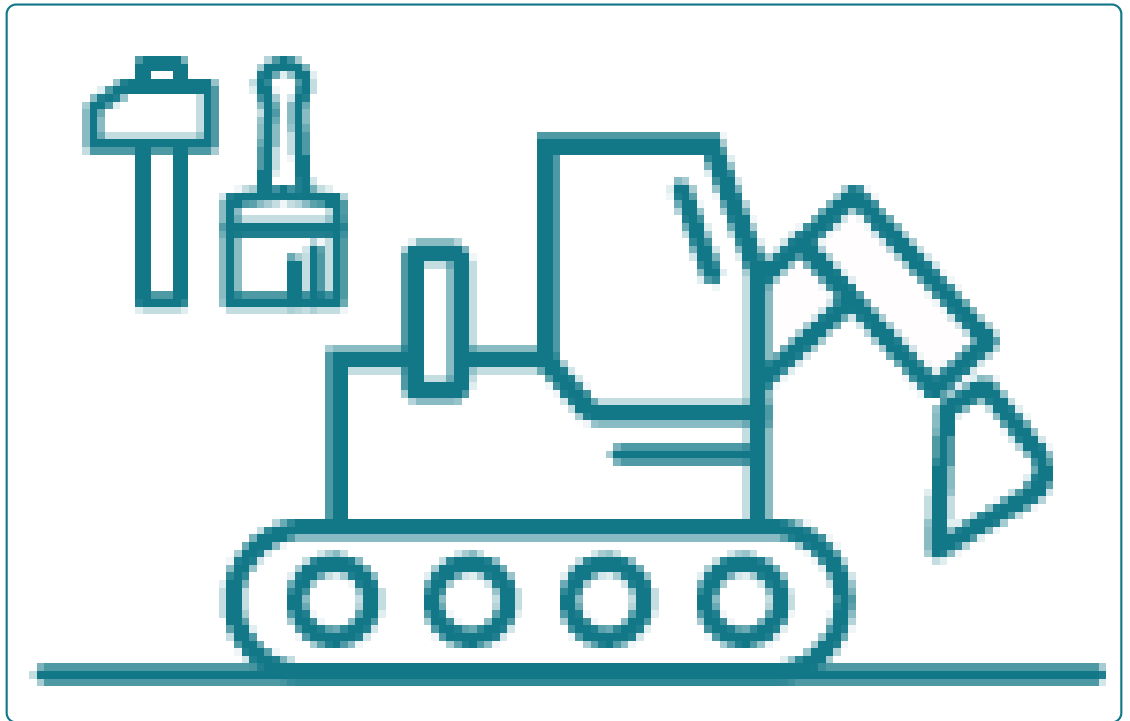
