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

# Finding joy in process fuels Shiffrin

COPPER MOUNTAIN, CO – Mikaela Shiffrin's skiing greatness doesn't come from the wins or the records.

It comes from the quiet moments in training, when she's obsessing over the tiniest of details and repeating a drill over and over to perfect her technique. Without those moments, the ones only her team sees, you wouldn't get the big moments the whole world sees.

"The attention to detail, that's where she's got it," Karin Harjo, Shiffrin's head coach, said after Shiffrin won the slalom at Copper Mountain for her 104th World Cup victory.

"What's great is that she's getting into this place, especially in slalom, where she's really comfortable and she's bringing the training scheme to racing," Harjo continued. "And that speed is something that I think for the world to see is great because it's pushing the level of sport, showing what is possible, and I think that's one of the coolest things that you can ever do."

It may seem as if Shiffrin's entire career has occurred in rarefied air. A World Cup winner at 17. The youngest to win the Olympic slalom. A five-time overall champion. A two-time Olympic gold medalist. Winner of a record 17 World Cups in a single season. Most World Cup wins of any skier, male or female.

But Shiffrin is human, and her current dominance came out of that frailty.

It was a year ago this past weekend that Shiffrin suffered a puncture wound in her abdomen in a crash during the second run of the giant slalom (GS) at the World Cup in Killington, Vermont. She would miss the next two months of the season and, even after she returned, struggled with PTSD about the GS. Slalom was safer, but she was still fighting to regain her rhythm and momentum.

The offseason gave Shiffrin a chance to reset and immerse herself in the process, her favorite thing about skiing.

Some people ski for the medals or fame or money. Shiffrin skis for the joy she gets from making good turns and figuring out how to squeeze another tenth of a second or two out of herself.

"I am so obsessed with the feeling that I get in between the start and the finish when it's good," she said Sunday Nov. 30. "It's just such a beautiful feeling, and when I can improve that a little bit, that's motivating. The second run was the motivating thing for me. And then to do it and to anticipate it, to visualize it and then to execute it and to actually get to the bottom and see that it

was indeed well done, that's the best feeling."

That feeling feeds her confidence. And her confidence feeds her skiing.

She talked after the first run of being able to trust her slalom skiing. She hasn't had a lot of time training slalom of late, but what she did have was solid and that allows her to trust the work she's put in will carry over into the race.

"She's found a place in which she can start to push again," said Paula Moltzan, who has been skiing with Shiffrin since they were teenagers.

"I think after the crash in GS, she lacked confidence. She could clearly still win, but you just see that confidence coming back into her every turn, every race," Moltzan said. "That second run, the conditions are really tough, it's a

hometown crowd and she just handles everything with such grace. It's pretty inspiring."

The wins, the results – they just reinforce that it's pushing herself in training that matters. It's that constant challenge of making her turns just a tad quicker, just a bit tighter that's her superpower.

"Everybody talks about momentum, and really momentum is just an action or force that leads to the next step," Harjo said. "And so we're always looking forward and taking the next step and working hard. Results in the past, both successful and not successful, happen. But we keep moving forward."

Shiffrin is trying to replicate what she's doing in slalom in GS, which is no surprise given the trauma of last season. But she knows she is getting closer.

Though she finished 14th in the GS on Saturday, she was able to make adjustments from the first run to the second. After being 18th in the first run, she was 10th in the second and was briefly atop the leaderboard.

"It was another step," Harjo said. "I think sometimes people forget the mental side, how long it takes to come back from that. They have an expectation that she's just going to dominate everything."

Shiffrin isn't worried about meeting other peoples' expectations or even being back on the podium in GS or racing super-G. She is searching for that sweet spot in her training, because she knows once she finds it, it'll be there on race day, too.

"It's going to just continue to take time," Shiffrin said. "But that's a really motivating thing."

Because it's those little things that make her many, many great things possible.

# NASCAR antitrust trial heading to court

Michael Jordan appears to be headed to court.

An antitrust lawsuit filed by Jordan's 23XI Racing team against NASCAR, the major sanctioning body for pro stock car racing and owned by the France family, was set to go to trial on Monday Dec. 1.

There are potentially far-reaching repercussions, too, barring a last-minute settlement before proceedings begin in the U.S. District Court for the Western District of North Carolina.

The presiding judge, Kenneth D. Bell, said in June, "I am once again amazed at the effort going on to burn this house down over everyone's head but I'm a fire marshal and I'll be here in December if need be."

And so December has arrived.

### What is the NASCAR antitrust lawsuit heading to trial?

The lawsuit accuses NASCAR of restraining fair competition and violating the Sherman Antitrust Act, preventing teams from competing "without accepting the anticompetitive terms" it dictates. Filed in 2024, the lawsuit also asserts the "France family and NASCAR are monopolistic bullies."

Jordan has not entered this battle alone. Denny Hamlin, a driver for Joe Gibbs Racing, and longtime Jordan business adviser Curtis Polk are co-owners of 23XI Racing, which just completed its fifth season in NASCAR's Cup Series. Front Row Motorsports, another NASCAR team, is a plaintiff.

The case centers on multimillion-dollar charter agreements, which guarantee teams spots in every race of the

Cup Series – the major league of NASCAR – and entitles them to a share of NASCAR's revenue from sponsorship and media deals.

In a text message that surfaced during court proceedings leading to trial, according to a CBS Sports report, Jordan wrote, "I look forward to going down firing. If I have to fight this to the end for the betterment of the sport, I will do that."

### A snapshot of NASCAR finances

Sponsorship deals, race prize money and revenue sharing from TV rights generate money for the teams. Discovery during a trial could produce more details about the cash flow in NASCAR, owned by the France family.

But financial information already is circulating.

In 2023, NASCAR President Steve Phelps said most Cup Series teams were not profitable. Court documents re-

leased from the antitrust lawsuit show that NASCAR's net income dipped to about \$100 million in 2024, according to a Fox Sports report.

According to the same Fox Sports report, the teams can earn between \$7 million to \$18 million a season before sponsorship, but race teams report losing \$2.2 million a year per car.

The crux of the case is the charter agreements.

In 2024, NASCAR offered teams a seven-year charter agreement that would increase media revenue and also increase the annual cost of charters to \$8.5 million from \$5 million.

While there were reported rumblings among NASCAR racing teams that had existing charters, only Jordan's 23XI Racing and Front Row Motorsports refused to sign the new contracts.

Take it or leave it is how the antitrust lawsuit characterized NASCAR's deal.

The court ruled 23XI Racing and Front Row Motorsports could ride without charters this past season. But losing them at trial could force the teams to compete as "open teams" and create greater difficulty in remaining profitable.

If NASCAR loses the case, it's unclear how severe the damages could be and how it would impact its ability to run the sport.

### 'Just getting started'

Jordan, Hamlin and Polk founded 23XI Racing in 2020. The team began racing that next season in the Cup Series with a single car and a single driver, Bubba Wallace.

Five years later, the team has three Cup Series cars and has contended with the most successful teams in NASCAR.

The team's top drivers, Tyler Reddick and Wallace, have won 10 races for 23XI. Reddick has won seven and made the final four of the 2024 playoffs. Both Reddick and Wallace made the playoffs this season but were eliminated in the round of 12.

"As far as I'm concerned, we're just getting started," Jordan said in October in a statement to USA TODAY Sports.

But with the case looming, 23XI Racing guaranteed its employees pay through 2026 to assuage any concerns.

### 'Three-dimensional chess'

There's no Michael Jordan of antitrust attorneys working this case, but they're both All-Stars.

Jordan and company are represented by Jeffrey Kessler, who was the lead attorney for Division I football and basketball players in a successful antitrust challenge against the NCAA. A partner at Winston & Strawn, Kessler also played key roles in a pay discrimination claim by the U.S. women's national soccer team.

NASCAR is represented by Christopher Yates, who led a team representing the U.S. Soccer Federation in a restraint of trade verdict that saved the group \$1 billion in damages, according to Yates' bio at Latham & Watkins LLP. He's also representing the UFC in a class-action case brought by fighters.

In multiple cases, the attorneys have represented opposing sides.

"I know some of the tactics and strategies he likes to employ; I'm sure he knows some of the tactics and strategies I've employed," Kessler said of Yates in an interview with Bloomberg. "It makes it more of a game of three-dimensional chess for both of us."

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# CFP, bowl season no longer need Irish

No bowl game for Notre Dame, everyone. They'll show that CFP selection committee who's boss.

They'll walk right out of the bowl system, and into the loving, waiting arms of self-pity. Which, of course, tracks.

You've got to be kidding me.

Notre Dame lost to Miami, and lost the CFP argument. Not only that, the Irish have beaten no team with a pulse, and had no argument that could stick.

No amount of whining and complaining is going to change it. Certainly not a statement released four hours after the CFP did the right thing by choosing the Canes over the Irish, one that humbly thanked friends, family and fans and declared the team was "hoping to bring the 12th national title to South Bend in 2026."

How about finishing 2025 first?

How about toughen up, hop on a plane to beautiful Orlando, Florida, and play a grinder of a bowl game against a tough, physical BYU team that – I know this is going to shock you – is also upset

about not reaching the CFP.

To say nothing of the life-sized Pop-Tart that awaits the winner of the best non-CFP game of the postseason.

This Notre Dame move just smacks of elitism, of we're better than you and your Playoff and we're going to prove it. Only there's one teeny-weeny problem: The CFP does't need Notre Dame.

The games will go on, a national champion will be crowned and another year will be added to the last time Notre Dame won it all. Which is 1988, in case you're wondering.

Just how long ago was that? It was also the same year Indiana last beat Ohio State before the monumental moment Saturday night Dec. 6 in the Big Ten Championship game.

That game, that specific night in Indianapolis – merely 130 miles from South Bend – should be a defining statement for Notre Dame and any other blue-blood college football program of the past. The game has changed, drastically.

What was once elite, can easily no longer be. What was once the worst program in college football – with the right hire and whole lot of name, image and likeness (NIL) cash – can be its best.

College football doesn't need Notre Dame like it used to, doesn't need the charm and glory and pageantry of the Four Horsemen and Touchdown Jesus and those magnificent gold helmets. Get over yourself, Irish – it's a new world.

The quicker Notre Dame figures it out, the quicker it realizes every game, every moment on the field, is another chance to convince high school and transfer portal players to come play in the freezing Midwest to try to win a na-

tional title for the first time in nearly 40 years.

Young men aren't interested in taking a stand against anything. They're invested in making money by playing football, and if you're really fortunate, maybe somewhat interested in graduating from the same school.

Decades ago, there was an unwritten rule at Notre Dame that prevented the school from playing any bowl game outside the major bowls. But there was a dirty secret behind it.

It wasn't that Notre Dame was standing on principle, and only wanted to extend a season for players if it meant a major bowl game. It's because by playing in a bowl game, television-friendly Notre Dame was elevating the status of other schools.

Especially if the Irish lost.

But now there's another not-so-secret reality for Notre Dame: BYU doesn't need the Irish. Nor does any other program in college football.

Nor does the CFP or the bowl system or any blue-chip player. The ACC still does, but that's why Notre Dame is in this mess in the first place.

The best part of the temper tantrum is Notre Dame has been revealed to be just another team, just another program trying to find its way in the ever-changing college football world.

One that isn't waiting around for the Irish anymore.

# Kentucky boos 'well-deserved'; who is No. 1?

When playing a neutral-site game, it's tough dealing with the opposing team fans taking over the arena, booing you endlessly. But it's much worse when that booing is coming from your own fan base.

That was the case in Nashville on Friday Dec. 5 when Big Blue Nation was disgusted with what it witnessed. It took Kentucky nine minutes to make a shot. By the time that happened, Gonzaga was already up 19-5. The boos rained down for the majority of the night as the Bulldogs routed the Wildcats by 35 points, the fourth-largest loss in program history.

Now Kentucky is in serious trouble.

The loss to Gonzaga came on the heels of the home collapse against short-handed North Carolina, when Kentucky went more than 10 minutes without a made shot to keep the Tar Heels alive. UNC took advantage and escaped Rupp Arena with a win.

The Wildcats are 5-4, and it's an ugly record. The five wins all against mid-major competition. The four losses against ranked opponents, and three of them were hardly competitive.

It's already disaster time in Lexington and we're not even 10 games into the season. Coach Mark Pope has to be feeling his seat getting warmer.

This is a team that was top-10 in recruiting and in the transfer portal, yet it can't shoot against good teams. This season, the Wildcats are shooting 47.4% from the field and 31.9% from deep. But against power conference teams, they're just 38.2% from the field and 24.3% from 3-point land.

It all falls on Pope, and he's aware.

"All the boos that we heard tonight were incredibly well-deserved, mostly for me," Pope said after the Gonzaga loss.

Things have to change quickly because it won't get easier. Indiana and St. John's are still on the schedule before the SEC gauntlet starts.

The demise of the Wildcats headlines the past weekend of college hoops. Here's more that caught my eye:

### Iowa State's emphatic statement

Not only did Iowa State beat No. 1 Purdue, the Cyclones completely manhandled the Boilermakers. Iowa State continued its stellar offensive start to the season by going into Mackey Arena and beating Purdue by 23 points.

Coming into the game, the Cyclones shot a nation-leading 55% from the field and a 43.3% 3-point percentage. Against a stout defense, Iowa State wasn't slowed down at all with a 54.1% field-goal percentage and 47.8% from deep. After starting the second half on a 13-2 run, Iowa State never let Purdue get within single digits and silenced one of the most hostile crowds in the country.

Given the circumstances, it's by far the best result of the season. Iowa State has been tough under TJ Otzelberger, but it felt like it wasn't being taken seriously. This team wins by an average of 30 points per game, the best in Division I. This should put the entire country, and especially the Big 12, on notice.

The Cyclones got star guard Tamin Lipsey back from injury, and this veteran-led squad is playing like one of the top teams in the country.

### Who should be No. 1?

With Purdue's loss, a new No. 1 should emerge. The only problem is you can justify three teams getting the nod: Arizona, Michigan and Duke.

Let's start with the Wolverines, which followed up its dazzling Players Era Festival performance with a 41-point romp over Rutgers. In the past four games, the Wolverines have two ranked wins and have won by an average margin of 37.7 points. They average 93.7 points per game but did look shaky to start the season.

Then there's Arizona and its team full of playmakers. The Wildcats just stomped Auburn by 29 points for their

fourth ranked win of the season, which includes a road win at UConn. Arizona hasn't been as dominant as Michigan, but the Wildcats have been consistent against all opponents.

Last but certainly not least is Duke. The Blue Devils went into Michigan State and left with a gritty win over the undefeated Spartans. That's the third straight ranked win and fourth overall on the season, and Cameron Boozer is playing like the best player in the country, averaging 23.6 points per game, second-most in the country.

So who should be No. 1? At this moment, it has to go to Arizona. The Wildcats have been more steady than Michigan, and the wins are more impressive than Duke. Arizona and Duke do share a common opponent in Florida, and the Gators nearly took down the Blue Devils. There isn't a wrong answer to this, especially when it's still early December, but at this point, Arizona looks like the top team in the country.

### What's going on with Tennessee?

After beating Houston in the Players Era Festival, Tennessee has lost three consecutive games, the latest coming against Illinois thanks to a poor second-half performance.

It's strange because Rick Barnes' team looked so good in the first seven games, but Houston has been a mess since then.

It starts with the heavy load carried by guards Ja'Kobi Gillespie and Nate Ament. In the past three games, Tennessee has taken 186 shots, and the duo accounted for 48.4% of them. What's worse is the duo is shooting 30% during this stretch. The Volunteers need more production from the rest of the team. Tennessee has another test in Louisville coming up.

### Star of the week: Hannes Steinbach

Much has been made of the stellar freshman class, but there's another newcomer making a name for himself.

Meet Washington forward Hannes Steinbach, who put on a show in his return from an ankle injury. Against UCLA, Steinbach scored a career-high 29 points and notched 10 rebounds, playing a big part in the near comeback against the Bruins. On Saturday Dec. 6, the Huskies played Southern Cal and were down by as much as 18 points before Steinbach led a strong second half, propelling the Huskies for the come-from-behind win. He scored 14 points in the final 20 minutes and finished with 24 points and 16 rebounds, his fifth straight game with a double-double.

Steinbach is becoming a dominant force, and what's even scarier is he is deadly from 3-point land when he chooses to shoot. He averages 18.5 points and 12.5 rebounds per game, which is second-most in the country.

Don't be surprised to see more of Steinbach as conference play approaches, and the Huskies are a team to watch in the Big Ten.
