


# Staley adds former coach at South Carolina to staff

Dawn Staley made an addition to her support staff this month. It's a familiar face to die-hard South Carolina women's basketball fans. Susan Walvius has been hired as the program's senior director of women's basketball external affairs. She started in the role on Nov. 3. The former Gamecocks head coach, who is now co-founder and co-CEO of SHEEX Inc., "will play a lead role in revenue generation for the women's basketball program and its student-athletes," accord-

ing to her new USC bio. Walvius touts a nearly 20-year career as a head coach in college women's basketball. Her last stop was at South Carolina, where she led the Gamecocks to two NCAA Tournament appearances during her tenure from 1997 to 2008. Walvius' final year at South Carolina was the 2007-08 season. Staley started her tenure at South Carolina the following season. "This is a full circle moment for Susan and our program," Staley is quoted as saying in Walvius' bio. "She is going to be critical to our constantly evolving approach to NIL with her track record of innovative

thinking in the business world. Starting with her connections to our program, the Columbia community and businesses nationally, Susan is well-positioned to lead the expansion of NIL opportunities for our student-athletes." In her 11 seasons at South Carolina, Walvius posted a 165-60 record. She guided the Gamecocks to back-to-back NCAA Tournament appearances in 2002 and 2003. Walvius' best year at South Carolina came in the 2001-02 season where the Gamecocks won 25 games, reached No. 7 in the AP Poll and made it to the Elite Eight for the first time

in program history. Prior to South Carolina Walvius was the head coach at VCU (1990-1995) and West Virginia (1995-1997). Walvius earned All-Metro Conference and All-American honors during her playing days at Virginia Tech. South Carolina was Walvius' last stop in the coaching world. In 2008, she co-founded SHEEX — which is described as a "performance fabric bedding and sleepwear line" — alongside former USC assistant and current Arizona WBB General Manager Michelle M. Marciniak. Walvius wore many hats with the start-up, including working in operations,

marketing and growth initiatives, and is credited with helping build SHEEX into an "eight-figure revenue" company during her time. "Her CEO experience and proven marketing ability are assets as she develops a comprehensive strategy to maximize NIL opportunities, establishes an equitable revenue-

sharing model and analyzes NIL trends to identify new pathways," Walvius' bio says. "Her basketball background establishes easy connection to student-athletes as she works with them on building their personal brands and conducts workshops on topics such as financial literacy, contract negotiation and brand management."

# No. 2 Gamecocks set program scoring best under Staley

The South Carolina women's basketball team took care of business in another comfortable win at home Sunday. Dawn Staley and the No. 2 Gamecocks (6-0) shellacked Queens 121-49. It's the seventh time in the last 10 seasons the Gamecocks have started with six consecutive wins. South Carolina, once again, lit up the Colonial Life Arena scoreboard and set a single-game scoring record for Staley's tenure in Columbia. USC was led by a 25-point performance from Joyce Edwards.

games of the 2025-26 season. It's the fourth time in the last 10 seasons South Carolina has scored 100-plus points multiple times in the first six games of the year. All 10 players on the South Carolina roster scored Sunday, and each member of Staley's starting five scored double-digit points. "I like the fact that we can score, and we can score in a lot of different ways," Staley said. Edwards led with 25 points, and Ta'Niya Latson scored 24. Raven Johnson (12) and Tessa Johnson (13) joined in the double-digit scoring. Madina Okot recorded a double-double with 14 points and 12 rebounds. Adhel Tac recorded the first double-double of her career off the bench. She 11 points and 10 rebounds in 19 minutes of action. "I'm just happy that basketball finally has repaid her for the work that she's put in," Staley said of Tac. South Carolina shot 66% as a team in the game. It's the third time this season the Gamecocks have shot at least 60% from the floor.

**SEASON-HIGH MARKS FOR THE DEFENSE**  
South Carolina's defense made life hard for the Royals. Queens scored just 49 points in the game, the third-lowest mark allowed by the Gamecocks this year. USC forced a season-high 21 turnovers and scored 22 points off those. The Gamecocks recorded a season-high 14 steals as a team. South Carolina's 12 blocks are also a season-high. Although these marks came against lower competition, the fundamentals were there for a South Carolina team that is heading to Las Vegas this week for two games against high-major opponents. "I think it has to be who we are, a mark of who we are, a product of who we are, a team that is fighting Gamecocks," Staley said of her defense's aggressiveness. "You got to get multiple efforts in that area. We're talented, but if you see somebody equally as talented, like we'll see in the next few games, something has to give. I do think that area can be a difference maker of us, winning or losing. And I'm glad we're finally

seeing it." **THE RETURN OF MADDY MCDANIEL**  
Sophomore guard Maddy McDaniel made her first appearance for the Gamecocks after a four-game absence. McDaniel left South Carolina's season opener with a leg injury and missed the following game because of that injury. Then South Carolina announced McDaniel was suspended right before the team's third game of the year against rival Clemson. No reason was given for McDaniel's suspension — she missed the three games. McDaniel was reinstated from her suspension on Thursday. "Maddy is a great young lady," Staley said. "She is of great character. But some of the choices that you make have consequences. It was more on Maddy and how she's communicating with me and our staff, and communicating with her teammates. Her teammates are the ones that was her voice. They had a more powerful voice when it comes to that. Obviously they like Maddy. They like all their teammates. They want our entire team together and they voiced that." The Gamecocks had to play with just nine players in McDaniel's absence, and her return gives USC

10 available players again. It also allows Staley to completely sub out her starters at any given moment in the game. McDaniel played 12 minutes against Queens. She totaled two points and three assists. She received a big applause from the crowd in Colonial Life Arena on Sunday when she got up to check in to the game at the scorer's table. McDaniel wore a brace on her right knee.

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**HISTORIC SCORING DAY**  
The Gamecocks had very little trouble scoring against Queens. South Carolina's 121 points set a record for most points in a game scored during Staley's tenure with the Gamecocks and was the third-most in program history. The program record in a single game is 137 points set in 1979. It's the third time USC has scored 100 or more points in the first six

half. USC finished 17-for-50, or 34%, on 3-pointers across two games at the Greenbrier.

**KEEPING UP INSIDE**  
While outside shooting struggles lingered from the loss against Butler, the Gamecocks were much improved on the interior against Northwestern. Paris critiqued his players' effort inside after Friday's game. USC outrebounded Northwestern 31-26 and scored 32 points in the paint. It also shot the ball at a 45.9% rate despite struggling early on 3-point attempts. The increased production inside was a big reason the Gamecocks stayed in the game through a long-range shooting slump. "Those are two pretty good teams that we played," Paris said. "I'm sure these guys will take that information and use it to their advantage."

# Gamecocks drop game against Northwestern in last-second loss

South Carolina men's basketball traveled to the Greenbrier Tip-Off to test itself in a weekend of games against top-100 NET opponents. Now, the Gamecocks return home with their first two losses of the season and more questions than answers. USC (4-2) fell to Northwestern (5-1) 79-77 Sunday. The Wildcats led by 12 with 4:52 to go, but the Gamecocks came back and tied the game heading into the final possession. Northwestern forward Arrinten Page scored with .8 seconds left for the win. "In the small picture, you want to win badly, but in the big picture, in the grand scheme of things I do think you do have to take away what you did," USC coach Lamont Paris said to 107.5 The Game's Derek Scott postgame. "How to make that be consistent regardless of the opponent that you're going against is really what the challenge is, and that's what we're continuing to work on." The Gamecocks leave White Sulphur Springs, West Virginia, with an 0-2 record in the midseason showcase. Here are three

After a competitive first half with nine lead changes, it seemed Northwestern and started to pull away. The Wildcats led by 12 points with 4:52 remaining in the second half. That's when Meechie Johnson took over. Johnson, who scored 15 points in the game rattled off seven-straight points to bring the game within one possession. He passed off to Elijah Strong, who finished with a team-high 17 points, which led to the game-trying free throws with less than two minutes remaining. The Gamecocks have

called upon Johnson frequently in big moments. He leads USC with 16.4 points per game. In an 83-79 overtime win against Southern Mississippi, Johnson scored 33 points and brought the Gamecocks back from an 11-point deficit. **3-POINT STRUGGLES CONTINUE**  
USC is built around the 3-pointer this season, but the Gamecocks struggled from beyond the arc in their weekend away. They shot 28% in Friday's 79-72 loss to Butler. In the first half against Northwestern, USC shot 21.4% on 3-pointers. The Gamecocks improved to 35% shooting on 3-pointers in the second

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# Mets, Rangers swap Nimmo and Semien

The New York Mets and Texas Rangers swapped a pair of veteran players on Sunday Nov. 23 as both teams begin their off-season reshuffling.



Semien

In a one-for-one deal, the Mets picked up three-time All-Star second baseman Marcus Semien in exchange for left-handed hitting outfielder Brandon Nimmo. While this trade lacks the intrigue and has fewer long-term implications than last week's Orioles-Angels deal, it might provide an ever-so-slight indication of the direction both teams are headed during the offseason.

Let's take a look at how the deal impacts the teams and hand out grades on how well they improved their overall rosters.

## New York Mets trade grade: C+

The addition of Semien, who won his second career Gold Glove in 2025, should help stabilize the revolving door the Mets had last season at second base, where Jeff McNeil, Brett Baty and Luisangel Acuña all saw action. It also allows McNeil to move to the outfield on a regular basis, essentially filling the void created by Nimmo's departure. (Or the team could cut ties completely with McNeil, whom they've been trying to trade.)

However, Semien is 35. After being perhaps baseball's most durable player from 2018 to 2024, he finally succumbed to the injury bug – missing the final six weeks with a foot injury.

Semien is also a two-time Silver Slugger (2021, 2023), but he posted a career-worst .230/.305/.364 slash line in 2025 with 15 homers, 62 RBIs and 11 stolen bases in 127 games. The Mets are hoping his offense bounces back – the move to Citi Field should help – and that his glove helps shore up a significant weakness in the infield.

The Mets still have a major decision to make this offseason regarding free agent slugger Pete Alonso. If Alonso doesn't return, the addition of Semien does give them another right-handed bat in the lineup.

Semien is due \$26 million next season and is signed through 2028 (which could impact the team's plans for top infield prospect Jett Williams).

## Texas Rangers trade grade: C

Nimmo was the Mets' first-round draft pick in 2011 (13th overall) and has spent 10 seasons patrolling the outfield in Queens. He'll fill a hole in the outfield created when the Rangers declined to offer a contract to veteran Adolis Garcia at the non-tender deadline.

He figures to take over Semien's leadoff spot, with his .364 career on-base percentage giving the Rangers an upgrade in that role. Like Semien, Nimmo has been quite durable – appearing in at least 150 games in each of the past four seasons. He also has a similar power/speed profile, posting career highs of 25 homers and 92 RBIs last season, while also stealing 13 bases.

Josh Smith, who filled in admirably when shortstop Corey Seager was injured last season, will likely fill Semien's starting spot at second base.

Nimmo, who will turn 33 in March, will make \$20.5 million this coming season and still has five years remaining on his contract that runs through 2030. Compared to Semien's deal, the Rangers will pay a little less up front but be on the hook for two additional years.

# Northwestern goes OT for NCAA title

Northwestern won its third national field hockey title in five seasons, 2-1 in double overtime over Princeton on Sunday Nov. 23 at Williams Field at Jack Katz Stadium in Durham, North Carolina.

Junior Ilse Tromp secured the trophy for Northwestern, scoring on a penalty corner in the second overtime. Northwestern had 16 shots, including 10 on goal, compared to eight shots and five on goal from Princeton.

"Isle Tromp is my personal personal superhero," Northwestern captain Maddie Zimmer said. "It was a total team effort. Once we get to overtime and had more space. We have the fastest players; I knew we would get it done."

The Wildcats avenged their only loss of the season. Northwestern (22-1) fell 3-2 to Princeton in Evanston, Illinois, on Oct. 13. Princeton is 18-4 and had its 14-game winning streak snapped.

Northwestern coach Tracey Fuchs, who dodged a Gatorade bath as she was about to be interviewed after the match, has led the Wildcats to five consecutive national title matches and three victories.

# Lakers move up as LeBron returns

NBA action is intensifying, as the league is turning quickly to December.

That also means the NBA Cup picture is clarifying, with group stage play concluding Friday Nov. 28. The league, however, is contending with several injuries to star players, forcing players like Bucks forward-center Giannis Antetokounmpo, Magic forward Paolo Banchero, Spurs forward-center Victor Wembanyama and plenty others to miss time.

To that point, it's the teams managing those absences well that are the ones remaining competitive. And no team has weathered the loss of an All-Star better than the Oklahoma City Thunder, the reigning NBA champions.

Here are USA TODAY Sports' NBA power rankings after Week 5 of the 2025-26 regular season (*Note: Records and stats through Nov. 23. Parentheses show movement from last week's rankings*):

The Oklahoma City Thunder have the NBA's fourth-best offensive rating (119.6) and the league's best defensive rating (102.8) and net rating (16.9), and they have done this all without Jalen Williams (wrist). The Pistons just got Jaden Ivey back and have the NBA's top active winning streak, at 12 games. It has become clear the Lakers will need some time to integrate LeBron James, and the Nuggets, who will be without forward Aaron Gordon (hamstring) for at least a month, showed in a loss against the Kings that life may be tough without him.

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# Finding joy in process fuels Shiffrin

COPPER MOUNTAIN, CO – Mikaela Shiffrin's skiing greatness doesn't come from the wins or the records.

It comes from the quiet moments in training, when she's obsessing over the tiniest of details and repeating a drill over and over to perfect her technique. Without those moments, the ones only her team sees, you wouldn't get the big moments the whole world sees.

"The attention to detail, that's where she's got it," Karin Harjo, Shiffrin's head coach, said after Shiffrin won the slalom at Copper Mountain for her 104th World Cup victory.

"What's great is that she's getting into this place, especially in slalom, where she's really comfortable and she's bringing the training scheme to racing," Harjo continued. "And that speed is something that I think for the world to see is great because it's pushing the level of sport, showing what is possible, and I think that's one of the coolest things that you can ever do."

It may seem as if Shiffrin's entire career has occurred in rarefied air. A World Cup winner at 17. The youngest to win the Olympic slalom. A five-time overall champion. A two-time Olympic gold medalist. Winner of a record 17 World Cups in a single season. Most World Cup wins of any skier, male or female.

But Shiffrin is human, and her current dominance came out of that frailty.

It was a year ago this past weekend that Shiffrin suffered a puncture wound in her abdomen in a crash during the second run of the giant slalom (GS) at the World Cup in Killington, Vermont. She would miss the next two months of the season and, even after she returned, struggled with PTSD about the GS. Slalom was safer, but she was still fighting to regain her rhythm and momentum.

The offseason gave Shiffrin a chance to reset and immerse herself in the process, her favorite thing about skiing.

Some people ski for the medals or fame or money. Shiffrin skis for the joy she gets from making good turns and figuring out how to squeeze another tenth of a second or two out of herself.

"I am so obsessed with the feeling that I get in between the start and the finish when it's good," she said Sunday Nov. 30. "It's just such a beautiful feeling, and when I can improve that a little bit, that's motivating. The second run was the motivating thing for me. And then to do it and to anticipate it, to visualize it and then to execute it and to actually get to the bottom and see that it

was indeed well done, that's the best feeling."

That feeling feeds her confidence. And her confidence feeds her skiing.

She talked after the first run of being able to trust her slalom skiing. She hasn't had a lot of time training slalom of late, but what she did have was solid and that allows her to trust the work she's put in will carry over into the race.

"She's found a place in which she can start to push again," said Paula Moltzan, who has been skiing with Shiffrin since they were teenagers.

"I think after the crash in GS, she lacked confidence. She could clearly still win, but you just see that confidence coming back into her every turn, every race," Moltzan said. "That second run, the conditions are really tough, it's a

hometown crowd and she just handles everything with such grace. It's pretty inspiring."

The wins, the results – they just reinforce that it's pushing herself in training that matters. It's that constant challenge of making her turns just a tad quicker, just a bit tighter that's her superpower.

"Everybody talks about momentum, and really momentum is just an action or force that leads to the next step," Harjo said. "And so we're always looking forward and taking the next step and working hard. Results in the past, both successful and not successful, happen. But we keep moving forward."

Shiffrin is trying to replicate what she's doing in slalom in GS, which is no surprise given the trauma of last season. But she knows she is getting closer.

Though she finished 14th in the GS on Saturday, she was able to make adjustments from the first run to the second. After being 18th in the first run, she was 10th in the second and was briefly atop the leaderboard.

"It was another step," Harjo said. "I think sometimes people forget the mental side, how long it takes to come back from that. They have an expectation that she's just going to dominate everything."

Shiffrin isn't worried about meeting other peoples' expectations or even being back on the podium in GS or racing super-G. She is searching for that sweet spot in her training, because she knows once she finds it, it'll be there on race day, too.

"It's going to just continue to take time," Shiffrin said. "But that's a really motivating thing."

Because it's those little things that make her many, many great things possible.

# NASCAR antitrust trial heading to court

An antitrust lawsuit filed by Jordan's 23XI Racing team against NASCAR, the major sanctioning body for pro stock car racing and owned by the France family, was set to go to trial on Monday Dec. 1.

There are potentially far-reaching repercussions, too, barring a last-minute settlement before proceedings begin in the U.S. District Court for the Western District of North Carolina.

The presiding judge, Kenneth D. Bell, said in June, "I am once again amazed at the effort going on to burn this house down over everyone's head but I'm a fire marshal and I'll be here in December if need be."

And so December has arrived.

### What is the NASCAR antitrust lawsuit heading to trial?

The lawsuit accuses NASCAR of restraining fair competition and violating the Sherman Antitrust Act, preventing teams from competing "without accepting the anticompetitive terms" it dictates. Filed in 2024, the lawsuit also asserts the "France family and NASCAR are monopolistic bullies."

Jordan has not entered this battle alone. Denny Hamlin, a driver for Joe Gibbs Racing, and longtime Jordan business adviser Curtis Polk are co-owners of 23XI Racing, which just completed its fifth season in NASCAR's Cup Series. Front Row Motorsports, another NASCAR team, is a plaintiff.

The case centers on multimillion-dollar charter agreements, which guarantee teams spots in every race of the

Cup Series – the major league of NASCAR – and entitles them to a share of NASCAR's revenue from sponsorship and media deals.

In a text message that surfaced during court proceedings leading to trial, according to a CBS Sports report, Jordan wrote, "I look forward to going down firing. If I have to fight this to the end for the betterment of the sport, I will do that."

### A snapshot of NASCAR finances

Sponsorship deals, race prize money and revenue sharing from TV rights generate money for the teams. Discovery during a trial could produce more details about the cash flow in NASCAR, owned by the France family.

But financial information already is circulating.

In 2023, NASCAR President Steve Phelps said most Cup Series teams were not profitable. Court documents re-

leased from the antitrust lawsuit show that NASCAR's net income dipped to about \$100 million in 2024, according to a Fox Sports report.

According to the same Fox Sports report, the teams can earn between \$7 million to \$18 million a season before sponsorship, but race teams report losing \$2.2 million a year per car.

The crux of the case is the charter agreements.

In 2024, NASCAR offered teams a seven-year charter agreement that would increase media revenue and also increase the annual cost of charters to \$8.5 million from \$5 million.

While there were reported rumblings among NASCAR racing teams that had existing charters, only Jordan's 23XI Racing and Front Row Motorsports refused to sign the new contracts.

Take it or leave it is how the antitrust lawsuit characterized NASCAR's deal.

The court ruled 23XI Racing and Front Row Motorsports could ride without charters this past season. But losing them at trial could force the teams to compete as "open teams" and create greater difficulty in remaining profitable.

If NASCAR loses the case, it's unclear how severe the damages could be and how it would impact its ability to run the sport.

### 'Just getting started'

Jordan, Hamlin and Polk founded 23XI Racing in 2020. The team began racing that next season in the Cup Series with a single car and a single driver, Bubba Wallace.

Five years later, the team has three Cup Series cars and has contended with the most successful teams in NASCAR.

The team's top drivers, Tyler Reddick and Wallace, have won 10 races for 23XI. Reddick has won seven and made the final four of the 2024 playoffs. Both Reddick and Wallace made the playoffs this season but were eliminated in the round of 12.

"As far as I'm concerned, we're just getting started," Jordan said in October in a statement to USA TODAY Sports.

But with the case looming, 23XI Racing guaranteed its employees pay through 2026 to assuage any concerns.

### 'Three-dimensional chess'

There's no Michael Jordan of anti-trust attorneys working this case, but they're both All-Stars.

Jordan and company are represented by Jeffrey Kessler, who was the lead attorney for Division I football and basketball players in a successful antitrust challenge against the NCAA. A partner at Winston & Strawn, Kessler also played key roles in a pay discrimination claim by the U.S. women's national soccer team.

NASCAR is represented by Christopher Yates, who led a team representing the U.S. Soccer Federation in a restraint of trade verdict that saved the group \$1 billion in damages, according to Yates' bio at Latham & Watkins LLP. He's also representing the UFC in a class-action case brought by fighters.

In multiple cases, the attorneys have represented opposing sides.

"I know some of the tactics and strategies he likes to employ; I'm sure he knows some of the tactics and strategies I've employed," Kessler said of Yates in an interview with Bloomberg. "It makes it more of a game of three-dimensional chess for both of us."
