



Trump airs doubts on NATO's value as Greenland tensions rise

President Donald Trump leveled fresh criticism toward NATO, days after Danish Prime Minister Mette Frederiksen said his desired takeover of her nation's territory of Greenland would mean the end of the military alliance.

"RUSSIA AND CHINA HAVE TO FEAR OF NATO WITHOUT THE UNITED STATES, AND I DOUBT NATO WOULD BE THERE FOR US IF WE REALLY NEEDED THEM," Trump posted Wednesday on social media, also criticizing allies for their defense-spending levels.

"The first and only time the alliance invoked its mutual-defense mechanism, known as Article 5,

was after the Sept. 11, 2001, terrorist attacks against the U.S.

Trump has displayed increasing belligerence over the past week, most notably with his brazen military incursion into Venezuela, sparking fresh concerns in Europe about his ambition of taking Greenland. His aggressive stance toward the Arctic territory has also prompted pushback from fellow Republicans, who warned against the geopolitical consequences of a hostile takeover of Greenland.

Senator Mitch McConnell, the former Republican leader who has frequently sparred with Trump over foreign policy, called U.S. officials "foolish." "We will always be there for NATO, even if they won't be there for us," Trump said.

"We need to not treat a peaceful nation that's an ally where we have a

military base already," Republican James Lankford, a member of the Senate Intelligence Committee and a supporter of the NATO alliance, told reporters Wednesday.

Alaska Republican Senator Lisa Murkowski said she found new discussions of acquiring Greenland by purchase or by force "very, very unsettling and certainly concerning."

Trump also targeted Norway, a NATO member, because he was not awarded the Nobel Peace Prize — a decision he described as "foolish." The prize is administered by a Norwegian committee. Despite his concerns, Trump said he remained committed to the alliance.

"We will always be there for NATO, even if they won't be there for us," Trump said.

Trump did not directly mention Greenland in his post, but his remarks

come a day after the White House refused to rule out the use of military force to acquire the island. The U.S. military raid to capture Venezuelan leader Nicolas Maduro fueled worries that Trump is becoming increasingly strained in his willingness to use military force to achieve his goals.

"If the United States chooses to attack another NATO country militarily,

then everything stops," Frederiksen told Danish broadcaster TV2 on Monday. "That is, including our NATO and thus the security that has been provided since the end of the Second World War."

Trump is considering many ways to take control of the Arctic island, White House Press Secretary Karoline Leavitt said in a statement.

"President Trump has

made it well known that acquiring Greenland is a national security priority of the United States, and it's vital to deter our adversaries in the Arctic region," Leavitt said. "The president and his team are discussing a range of options to pursue this important foreign policy goal, and of course, utilizing the U.S. military is always an option at the commander in chief's disposal."

U.S. Secretary of State Marco Rubio downplayed the notion of military action in a briefing with lawmakers on Monday, instead signaling that an invasion was not imminent and that the goal was to buy the island from Denmark, the Wall Street Journal reported.

Rubio, after another briefing with lawmakers on Wednesday, stressed that Trump's desire to buy Greenland dates back to his first term. He said he plans to meet with Danish officials next week.

"We'll have those conversations with them then," he told reporters.

About 4,000 players have entered the transfer portal since it opened on Jan. 2, with a growing slice of that number finding a spot with a new program.

Here's one way to frame this year's portal bonanza. There are approximately 14,300 players in the Football Bowl Subdivision, with 136 teams and about 105 players per team. Even when subtracting lower division transfers, the number of names in the portal represents about a quarter of all players in the FBS.

Already, some of the biggest names and biggest teams in the country have made a transfer splash. That starts with two high-profile quarterback transfers in Texas Tech's Brendan Sorsby and Indiana's Josh Hoover.

Starting with that pair, let's dig into the early portal happenings by evaluating the best finds and fits among the first round of commitments:

QB Brendan Sorsby, Texas Tech (former school: Cincinnati)

Sorsby didn't take long to table hop from the Bearcats to Texas Tech, where he'll replace Behren Morton and potentially represent a missing piece that carries the Red Raiders deeper into the College Football Playoff. He has previous Big 12 experience and will bring a different dimension to Tech's offense as one of the top dual-threat quarterbacks (2,800 passing yards and 580 rushing yards this season) in the Power Four.

QB Josh Hoover, Indiana (TCU)

Once a verbal commitment to the Hoosiers under previous coach Tom Allen, Hoover finally arrives in Bloomington after two-plus years as the starter for Sonny Dykes at TCU. In that time, he's developed into one of the most productive passers in the Power Four, though turnovers have been a concern. Like Fernando Mendoza before him, Hoover should keep the Hoosiers offense humming and contend for the Heisman Trophy.

DB Jontez Williams, Southern Cal (Iowa State)

This has been the biggest defensive addition to date. While he'll need to show he's recovered from the knee injury that cost him the second half of the 2025 season, Williams was one of the Power Four's top cornerbacks when healthy and was on the way to earning All-American accolades. He could be the stopper the Trojans need to take the next step in the Big Ten.

QB Drew Mestemaker, RB Caleb Hawkins and WR Wyatt Young, Oklahoma State (North Texas)

These underclassmen are set to follow Eric Morris to Oklahoma State, giving the Cowboys three major pieces as building blocks on offense who starred with the Mean Green. Mestemaker was terrific as a walk-on freshman, going for 4,379 yards and 34 touchdowns to help North Texas reach the American Conference title game. Hawkins had only lower-level scholarship offers but ran for 1,434 yards as a true freshman. Young is a rising junior who pulled down a team-leading 70 grabs for 1,264 yards in 2025.

DT Ian Geffrard, Texas (Arkansas)

Geffrard is a 387-pound rising junior who matches new defensive coordinator Will Muschamp's need for a block-eating, space-filling interior lineman. He started every game in 2025 for the Razorbacks, making 25 tackles (four for loss), and should step right into the lineup with the Longhorns set to lose Travis Shaw and Cole Brevard.

WR Nick Marsh, Indiana (Michigan State)

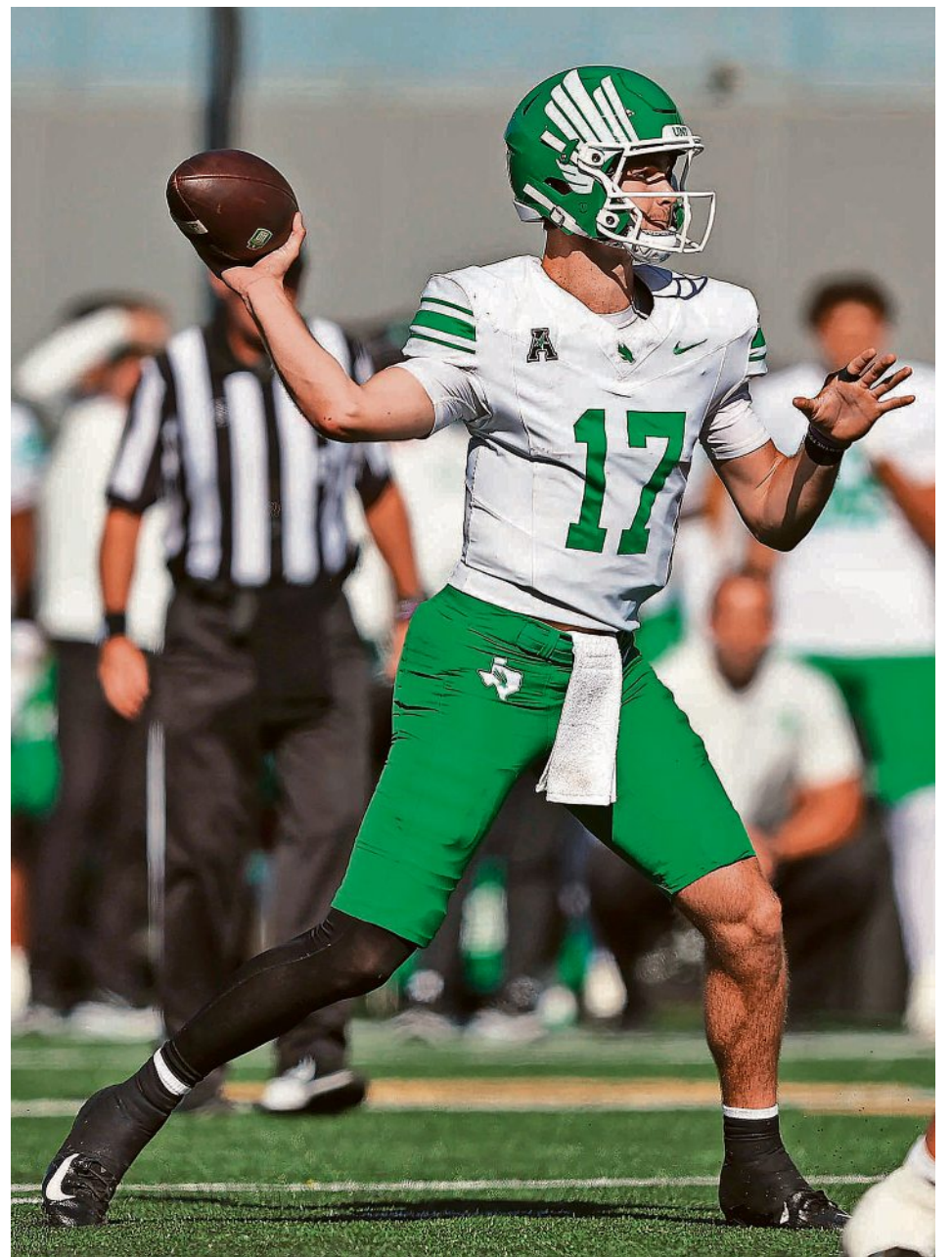
This is a huge in-conference addition that will help Indiana replace seniors Elijah Sarratt and E.J. Williams Jr. while preparing for the possibility that junior Omar Cooper Jr. opts into the NFL draft. Marsh was the Spartans' offensive bright spot the past two years, posting a combined 100 receptions for 1,311 yards.

OT Kolt Dieterich, Washington (Sam Houston State)

The leap from Group of Five to Power Four can be difficult for offensive linemen, and Dieterich may struggle in the transition despite ranking among the top tackles in Conference USA in 2025. But the junior is a very solid addition because of his ability to play both tackle spots, making him at minimum a valuable depth piece for the Huskies and potentially the starter on the left side.

QB Byrum Brown, Auburn (South Florida)

Bringing Brown along from USF will help speed up new coach Alex Golesh's rebuilding project. Brown was a revelation as a first-year starter in 2025 as one of just two FBS quarterbacks to throw for at least 2,000 yards and run for another 1,000. While those numbers won't carry over to the SEC, Brown's grasp of the system will help the offense hit the ground running after a dismal three

years under former coach Hugh Freeze.

DB Marcus Neal Jr., Penn State (Iowa State)

Neal is one of many ISU players who have since followed Matt Campbell to Happy Valley, along with quarterback Rocco Becht, standout tight end Ben Brahmer and young offensive lineman Will Tompkins, among others. While Becht is the big name in this transfer haul, Neal should have a major impact on the defensive side after earning all-conference honors with 77 tackles (11 for loss) as a first-year starter in 2025.

DB Jay Crawford, Ole Miss (Auburn)

Ole Miss has stayed busy while preparing for the College Football Playoff

semifinals against Miami. In addition to retaining star running back Kewan Lacey, Pete Golding and the Rebels will add an SEC-tested cornerback in Crawford, who had an outstanding freshman year in 2024 and made 10 starts for Auburn this season.

RB Makhi Hughes, Houston (Oregon)

After a lost season in Eugene, Hughes looks to reignite his promising career by reuniting with former Tulane coach Willie Fritz. Hughes ran for 1,378 yards in Fritz's scheme in 2023 and then another 1,401 yards and 17 total touchdowns the following year before failing to crack the rotation for the Ducks in 2025. He'll provide a big spark for a running game that went for at least 200 yards in each of the final four games of this season.

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New Bills stadium will raise bar for debate

Grass in. Turf out.
Of all the high-tech bells and whistles that will come with the Buffalo Bills' new home when they move into a new Highmark Stadium later this year, a distinctive old-school feature will provide a signature centerpiece for the \$2.2 billion facility: The franchise has opted for a playing surface of natural grass.

Never mind the cold and snow that come with challenging Buffalo winters. The Bills, leaning on modern technology, are gearing up to make a statement that will raise the bar in the NFL's grass vs. turf debate.

They've come a long way since "The Rockpile" — the derisive nickname for dilapidated War Memorial Stadium — where the Bills played before moving to suburban Orchard Park in 1973. The team has played home games on artificial turf since then.

"Buffalo, it's not 1973 anymore," Bills general manager Brandon Beane told USA TODAY Sports, alluding to features at the new stadium that include a heating system as part of the underground infrastructure and grow lights to be used to help maintain grass at the outdoor venue.

"We're in 2025. You've seen places like Green Bay, Pittsburgh, Kansas City and Chicago using technology; that helped us put together a plan to be able to handle the weather here. We feel we have the right grass people and field turf people to help us manage this. And our players are going to benefit from playing on grass."

It's a bold move, particularly striking as NFL players overwhelmingly express desires to play on natural grass while the league points to data that it says suggests there's no significant increase to injury risk from playing on artificial turf rather than grass.

"The turfs have improved," Beane said. "No doubt, the stats have improved on artificial turf. But you're never going to convince me that something's better than the real grass."

'Player-centric' approach led to choice of grass at new stadium

Fifteen of the NFL's venues have

grass or grass-hybrid playing surfaces, including several with colder winters, such as Denver and Philadelphia, in addition to the four that Beane mentioned.

Despite higher costs over the long run for going grass rather than turf, Beane said the franchise led by co-owners Terry and Kim Pegula is driven by a "player-centric" motivation.

According to Sportico, the cost of a new grass field ranges from \$300,000 to \$500,000, with annual infrastructure costs that can add \$1 million. Artificial turf, according to Sportico, costs between \$1 million and \$2 million to install but requires less maintenance and has longer shelf life.

Beane pointed to Kim Pegula as a key force in the team's decision, dating to 2018, shortly after the GM and coach Sean McDermott arrived the previous year.

"She was really behind, 'How can we

help our players thrive here and extend their careers?'" Beane recalled.

After forming a committee charged to update the team's headquarters, Beane said the idea of replacing the turf at the existing Highmark Stadium was considered but put on hold as the owners sought what turned out to be the taxpayer-supported new stadium.

"I think that's going to be a light on some guys, for sure," Bills edge rusher A.J. Epenesa told USA TODAY Sports.

Epenesa, a sixth-year veteran, figures older players will feel more benefit due to wear-and-tear endured over a longer period. Yet he admits he enjoys practicing on the grass fields the team often uses. The artificial turf, he described, "It's literally just a slab of concrete with some green grass and those black pellets on top of it."

Dion Dawkins, the Bills' All-Pro left tackle, said his body easily tells him

whether he just played a game on turf, rather than grass.

"Super, super achy, bro," Dawkins told USA TODAY Sports. "You can drastically tell the difference."

Count Dawkins in the number hoping that Buffalo's decision on a grass field will inspire other NFL power brokers to follow suit. Sure, that's a long shot. But, well ...

"We'll just add to the positivity of the NFL," Dawkins said. "Let's check this one off and shoot for the other teams to make sure they have grass as well. I know there are several already, but we want those numbers to outweigh the turf number."

'They love cold and they love snow.' Bills' grounds crew embraces new challenge

John Sorochan, the NFL Players Association's field consultant, is bullish on the prospects for the Bills. He said the Bills will use Kentucky bluegrass, the type that the Packers, Broncos and Steelers use, currently being grown at a sod farm in New Jersey.

"The two groundsman that they have are true Buffalo people," Sorochan told USA TODAY Sports, referring to Aaron Ramella, the Bills director of grounds, and Chad Laurie, assistant director of grounds.

"They love cold and they love snow. They are good turf managers who know to ask questions. And they're excited for the new challenge, for sure."

Sorochan said the design of the new stadium, with a roof that will cover the stands, will lessen the burden on the grounds crew in one regard: snow removal. The roof is heated, which will melt snow.

"They can do different things when blizzards hit," Sorochan said. "Snow removal won't be like now, where they push snow from the stands to the field, then remove it. It will be a new deal. Snow won't be in the stands, so the grounds crew can just focus on getting the field ready."

The grass field. Which will be some sort of new deal — in Buffalo, of all places.

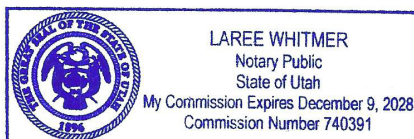




