

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Cincy passing game seeks final gear

CINCINNATI – When the Bengals beat the Raiders on Saturday, quarterback Joe Burrow won with his quick decision making.


His anticipation set up the touchdown throw to tight end C.J. Uzomah in the first quarter as well as all of his throws to wide receiver Ja'Marr Chase that he released while Chase still had his back turned.

The Cincinnati offense worked because of Burrow's ability to read the field. Against the Titans (4:30 ET Saturday, CBS), Burrow has earned the opportunity to show those skills even more often.

"You want to be balanced, but Joe can win us games," offensive coordinator Brian Callahan said. "When we get a chance to do that, we're going to probably let him do that. That's how it works with great quarterbacks, and he's one of those guys. We can get him an opportunity to win us a game."

This week, facing a Titans team that's great against the run but below average in the secondary, Burrow will get another chance to be the best player on the field.

When given the chance on early downs, Burrow is getting rid of the ball before the opposing pass rush has a chance to win. Against the Raiders, Burrow had only three passing attempts on

early downs where he had a full drop back or tried to extend the play outside the pocket.

In the face of disguised coverages or different schemes, Burrow is often pointing to which player he expects to blitz before he snaps the ball. With that approach and Burrow's ability to get rid of the ball quickly, the Bengals have been able to keep the opposing team's best defensive players in check for most of the second half of the season.

Most NFL teams feel cautious about throwing the ball 45 or so times per game because of the wear-and-tear it puts on the offensive line. The Bengals have a proven quick-game approach, and Burrow's timing mitigates that concern.

"The hot hand thing is for real," Callahan said. "You can neutralize some (pressure packages) with quick game and play action passes, screens and things like that. Not everything has to be a drop back when you're throwing it."

Bengals head coach Zac Taylor's favorite moment from Burrow in the win over the Raiders was a two-play sequence. On one play, the Raiders ran their typical Cover-3 defense and left Chase in one-on-one coverage on the sideline. Burrow threw the ball on a comeback route for Chase before Chase even turned to make the catch, and it resulted in a first down.

Later in the game, the Bengals ran the exact same route concept. But this time, the Raiders ran one of their secondary coverages. With two defenders clouding Chase's side of the field, Uzomah had one-on-one coverage over the middle.

After taking a short drop back, Burrow quickly made the throw over the linebacker and hit Uzomah in stride for the first down. Instead of taking away an opportunity, the Raiders' disguised coverage opened up a door for Burrow. And he noticed it immediately, getting rid of the ball in about two seconds.

On that play, Burrow created an opportunity without putting much stress on the offensive line.

Even though the quick game worked nearly perfectly against the Raiders, the Bengals still can use it more.

In that game, the Bengals called runs on 21 of their 47 first and second downs. Early-down runs were the only group of plays that had net-negative efficiency for the Bengals last weekend, but Taylor called runs on key second downs in the red zone.

In those moments, the Bengals statistically decreased their chances to put more points on the board.

The Titans defense is the fourth best in the NFL against the run, but the defense is 21st against the pass. On Saturday, the Bengals' best path to a win would feature more throws on time from Burrow.

The Titans are going to show Burrow more Cover-1 looks with just a single high safety and fewer clouded zones taking away deep shots down the field.

That means more open windows for Burrow.

"We won't abandon the way our offense works to do that," Callahan said. "But with the way (Burrow) responds, he has won us games. It's all part of how the game flows, but at the end of the day, we have all the confidence in Joe to get the ball out of his hands and win us a game."

Prescott apologizes for comments on fans

ARLINGTON, Texas – Cowboys quarterback Dak Prescott issued an apology Tuesday evening for comments made in the wake of his team's wild-card playoff loss.

The Cowboys' 23-17 loss to the 49ers ended abruptly as Prescott and an official collided, the precious few seconds of the clock ticking down to zero before the Dallas players were lined up sufficiently to run their last play. Prescott later was told fans threw debris at officials. He voiced support for the rowdy gesture.

"I deeply regret the comments I made regarding the officials after the game on Sunday," Prescott wrote in a series of tweets Tuesday. "I was caught up in the emotion of a disappointing loss and my words were uncalled for and unfair.

Prescott made a 17-yard run with 14 seconds to play in the game. He thought 4 seconds remained on the clock when he raced back to reset the line of scrimmage and still 2 seconds after his teammates had lined up. But the official needed to spot the ball. The mechanics did not allow for that before time expired.

"The game is over," an official declared, to Prescott's disbelief.

Fans began throwing debris including beer and water bottles. Officials raced toward a tunnel exit. you're talking about a team, you're talking about men who come out each and every day of their lives and give everything to this sport, give everything to this game of football. Nobody wants to succeed more than we want to succeed.

"I understand fans and the word 'fan' for fanatic. I get that to. But to know everything we put into this day in and day out, try our hardest, nobody comes into the game wanting or expecting to lose. For people to react that way when you're supposed to be a supporter and be with us through thick and thin, that's tough."

Then a reporter told Prescott that fans were actually aiming at the officiat-ing crew.

"Credit to them then," Prescott said. "Yeah, credit to them."

Laughter ensued as reporters assumed that Prescott, the Cowboys' nominee for Walter Payton Man of the Year, was making a lighthearted jab reflective of the disappointment. Questions continued, Prescott discussing his play calls and offensive coordinator and the disappointing of feeling "like you let your teammates down. It's a terrible feeling." postgame sentiment?

"Yeah," Prescott said, doubling down. "If they weren't at us, and if the fans felt the same way as us and that's what they were doing it for, yeah I guess that's why the refs took off and got out of there so fast. I think everybody is upset with the way that this thing played out. As I said, I'm sure a fan would be the same. Feel the same way we do."

Monday passed with silence. Then, on Tuesday, NBA referees condemned Prescott's comments.

"The NBRA condemns the comments by Dak Prescott condoning violence against game officials," the association tweeted. "As an NFL leader, he should know better. We encourage the NFL to take action to discourage this deplorable behavior in the future."

Three hours later, Prescott apologized.

Prescott signed a mega-extension with the Cowboys in March, a \$160 million deal that will keep him in Dallas through at least 2024. He returned from a gruesome 2020 season-ending ankle injury to lead the Cowboys to a 12-5 record and an NFC East title, but Dallas was the lone team to lose at home in the during wild-card weekend.

Aikman on Dallas offense: 'Game not that difficult'

Troy Aikman did not call Sunday's NFC wild-card round game between the 49ers and Cowboys, with San Francisco hanging on for a 23-17 road victory.

The Fox broadcaster and three-time Super Bowl champion with the Cowboys had thoughts about his former team and two star players, nonetheless.

During an appearance on Dallas sports radio station 96.7 The Ticket on

Wednesday, Aikman criticized quarterback Dak Prescott and wide receiver CeeDee Lamb for not taking advantage of single coverage defense.

"I hate going back to (when I was playing) because nobody cares, but what I see around the league – it's not just Dallas, I've seen it with a lot of teams – a lot of these offenses want to scheme things," Aikman said, via The Athletic. "The coordinators, it's all about scheme, rather than, 'This corner is playing soft. He's scared to death.' Just run the route tree. Run a comeback. Run a dig route. Run a curl. Run anything.

"You're going to complete the pass whenever you want," the NFL Hall of Famer added. "(Michael Irvin) would've had 10 catches at halftime if they played us the way they played CeeDee Lamb in that game. ... The game is not that difficult. If I've got a great player at wide receiver and a corner is playing him in single coverage, throw him the ball. He's going to win most of the time." Prescott finished 23 of 43 for 254 passing yards with two touchdowns (one throwing, one rushing). Lamb caught one pass on five targets from Prescott for 21 yards.

The Cowboys went 12-5 and won the NFC East, but Dallas has not advanced to the conference championship game since the 1995 season, the last time it won a Super Bowl.

CBS said Wednesday that the Niners-Cowboys viewership peaked at 50 million.

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
