

NCAA zeroing in on really helping athletes



In the most significant step yet toward allowing all college athletes the freedom to transfer once during their college career without penalty, the NCAA announced a set of recommendations that could be in place by the 2020-21 academic year.

recommendations, which came from a working group that has been studying the issue, would essentially standardize what has become an unwieldy waiver process and give athletes a free pass to transfer and play immediately as long as they're academically eligible, maintain academic progress at their new school and aren't leaving while under a disciplinary suspension.

Though most sports under the NCAA umbrella have already been operating under that system, transfers in football, men's and women's basketball, baseball and hockey the five that bring in significant revenue to their schools - have had to sit out for a year unless they received a waiver for hardships or extenuating circum-

Trying to get a waiver, which had become increasingly popular the last few years, was a time-consuming, inconsistent process that required processing massive amounts of paperwork between compliance offices and the NCAA staff, and it increasingly fattened the bank accounts of lawyers who were being hired by players and their parents. Ultimately the system broke, to the point where college administrators finally realized that whatever might come of so-called "free agency" was far more palatable than the hodgepodge bureaucracy that was being held together by duct tape and billable hours.

While it's not official NCAA policy until the Division I Council meets in April, Tuesday's announcement means it's almost certainly going to happen. Despite the squealing from many coaches to come over the next several days and weeks about how this is going to ruin their sport and maybe America in general, the train is too far down the tracks to pull back now.

That's a good thing. Because the fundamental principle for any big policy change should be rooted only in what's best for the athletes.

If it makes the coaches' job harder, so be it.

There are a ton of complicated issues that have grown out of the thicket of NCAA rules in recent years, but frankly, this isn't one of them. This is a slam-dunk for common sense, and it's happened pretty quickly by NCAA standards because more and more people realize that it was both impractical and fundamentally unfair to have the NCAA be an arbiter of every single circumstance that might allow someone to play immediately at a new school.

Literally, there were people in Indianapolis reading medirecords to determine whether a parent or some other family member was sick enough to warrant playing eligibility at a new school closer to home. You had NCAA staffers trying to determine the psychological impact of an alleged racist incident on campus or whether recruits had been lied to about the possibility of **NCAA** sanctions. shouldn't be their job.

Instead, the NCAA seems ready to acknowledge there are all kinds of reasons a young person might want to transfer that trying to parse through reasons and determine some legitimate and others illegitimate is a waste of time.

Does it really make a difference whether someone wants to leave because the coach who recruited them got fired or they need to be closer to home or they realized that they got starry-eyed during the recruiting process and made a bad

Though it's not true in every case, coaches generally are going to hate this because they say there's no deterrent now for kids to cut-and-run when things get tough. They'll complain that it incentivizes a player who got yelled at in practice picking up and leaving because they got their feelings hurt, and they'll argue it puts too much pressure on coaches to play freshmen before they're ready to contribute to winning because they might leave if they don't get playing time. And there's going to be a ton of talk in the next few weeks about big schools poaching off the roster of smaller schools if they see a player they like.

There might be some truth in those criticisms. But like any other rule change, coaches will either adapt to their new reality or they'll get fired. The good ones will figure out a way, and they certainly get paid enough money to deal with whatever inconvenience it produces.

It would also be completely hypocritical for coaches to talk about the poaching issue. Are there going to be players who were under-recruited out of high school, go to smaller schools initially and then transfer to blueblood programs later in their careers? Of course.

But it's hard to be a credible voice against that concept when it's what the entire coaching industry is built upon. Before Jay Wright is the Villanova coach with two national championships, he's the Hofstra coach who did a good

enough job to earn a promotion. Before Urban Meyer becomes a dominant force at Florida, he does two years at Bowling Green and two at Utah and becomes the hottest coaching prospect in the country.

Why would that aspirational climbing of the ladder be OK for coaches but not for players if they had that opportunity? And guess what - they're already doing it in increasing numbers, particularly in college basketball with the graduate transfer rule.

It's also just as liable to work for mid-majors and smaller programs with players going in the opposite direction. Every single year, recruits are going to sign with bluebloods and im-

mediately realize their path to playing time isn't what they expected. When they start looking around for places where they might be able to start, the mid-majors will have an opportunity to swoop in and upgrade their roster immediately.

In the end, status quo lost the argument and all of the complaining about change ceases to matter. The NCAA is on the verge of doing something truly beneficial for college athletes and eliminating one of the biggest sources of frustration within the NCAA ecosys-

There are plenty of challenges for college athletics coming down the pike in the coming months, but getting this one resolved is a big step forward.

("RentPath") and scheduling a hearing on a final order with respect to such Procedures.

In certain circumstances, the Procedures restrict (i) transactions involving, and require notices of the holdings of and proposed transactions by, any person, group of persons, or entity that is or, as a result of such a transaction, would become a Substantial Stockholder of the common stock issued by RentPath (the "Common Stock") and (ii) claims by any Majority Stockholder of a worthless stock deduction under section 165(g) of the Internal Revenue Code with respect to the beneficial ownership of Common Stock, for purposes of the Procedures, "Substantial Stockholder" is any person or entity (including certain possible making a coordinated acquisition) that has beneficial ownership of, directly or indirectly (and/or owns options to acquire beneficial ownership of) at least 19,555,137 shares of Common Stock (representing the control of the approximately 4.75% of all issued and outstanding shares of Common Stock) and a "Majority Stockholder" is (i) any person or entity that has beneficial ownership of at least 19,5/51,379 shares of Common Stock (representing approximately 47.5% of all issued and outstanding shares of Common Stock) or (ii) any person or entity that would be a "50-percent shareholder" (within the meaning of section 382(g)(4)(0) of the Internal Revenue Code) of Common Stock deduction with respect to such stock. Any prohibited acquisition or other transfer of, or claim of a worthless stock deduction with respect to, beneficial ownership of Common Stock (as defined in the Procedures) will be null and void ab initio aim of a worthless stock deduction with respect to, beneficial ownership of Common Stock (as defined in the Procedures) will be null and void ab initio aim of a worthless stock described in the Procedures) will be null and void ab initio aim of a worthless stock and contempt, compensatory damages, punitive
